






### Federal Food and Drug Administration Impo Regulations on Marketing of Wheat

For the past few years the Food and Drug Administration has been carry a sanitation program in the flour mills that does not permit the use of weevilin wheat to be used in the production of flour.

The Food and Drug Administration is now applying regulations which w sure that only sanitary wheat is sold for human consumption.

Altho no definite tolerance for filth in wheat have been given, approximate erances have been released and any wheat showing evidence of filth in extended these quotations will be subject to condemnation for human consumption

The appropriate tolerances are as follows:

- 1. WHEAT CAN NOT HAVE MORE THAN 3 WEEVIL EXIT HOLE KERNE 100 GRAMS OF WHEAT. (1/4 pint wheat or approximately 4200 kernels.)
- 2. WHEAT CAN NOT HAVE MORE THAN AN OCCASIONAL RAT OR M EXCREMENT PELLET.
  - 3. WHEAT CAN NOT HAVE BUT AN OCCASIONAL BIED EXCREMENT P
- 4. WHEAT CAN NOT HAVE ANY EXCESSIVE AMOUNT OF ANY KIN FILTH.







Q: Is distemper always fatal? A: No, but the death rate may run as high as 80 percent.

careful supportive treatment. Q: What can be done to prevent distemper?

A: Vaccination affords the best protection. The veterinarian administers two small doses of vaccine about 10 days apart. Cats usually are protected for life after they have developed immunity.

Q: Is vaccination expensive? A: No, it is inexpensive. On
