



### TWO RIGHT?

When we look about in the religious world today and see all of the different and conflicting doctrines that exist, it ought to make us wonder who is right! We know that Christ said, "Ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free." The truth stands between us and freedom. The truth is the only thing that can make us free from sin. Except we come to the truth that has been revealed in the word of God then there is no hope of the forgiveness

We know that truth always AGREES with truth. If there is not agreement we know that all is not the truth. So it applies also to the doctrines that are in the religious world today. When we find one teaching one thing and another teaching another thing we must come to the conclusion that one or both are wrong. It is not possible for both to be right, and to be teaching different things. For instance: someone is teaching that we are saved by the blood of Christ - someone else comes along and says we are saved by the blood of bulls and goats. Can both be

There is one body, and one Spirit, even as ye are called in one hope of your calling: one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all . . ." Eph. 4:4-6. Here is a plain statement made by Paul. The religious world will fly in the face of such a plain statement and refute almost all that Paul said in this reading. The Spirit through Paul said, "one body." The "body" is the church. Eph. 1:22-23. Col. 1:18. Now someone comes along and says there are two churches. Can he be right in the light of the truth? Certainly not. His statement does not agree with truth. Paul says one "hope." Yet we kind that some have a hope that does not agree with truth. Some have a hope of Christ coming back to earth to rule and reign for a thousand years. Does he have a hope that is according to truth? (It is surprising to find how many in the religious world today have such a hope!)

Paul said one "faith." Yet we hear people say today. one baptism. Some practice three (3) at the same time. one faith? That is the faith that is revealed in the written word. If you are of some other faith than that which is revealed in the word of God then you, dear friend, are of the

Paul says "one baptism." Yet some teach more than on baptism. Some practice three (3) at the same time. Just take your choice. You may be "baptized" by sprinkling, pouring, or immersing. Does this sound like "one baptism?" Some baptize into the church. (It takes more to become a member of their church than it does to be saved, according to them.) The apostles baptized for the remission of sins. If you were baptized in order to get into the "church" were you baptized with the "one baptism?" Dear friends, there must be agreement when all is the truth and if two teach two different doctrines then ONE MUST BE WRONG.




