





Airs. Algae, according to Castro ounty Agent Charlie Hudson, ay be partially controlled in tehes by the use of copper sul-nate, commonly known as blue one. Blue stone, the county gent adds, should be put in a ag or flour sack and allowed to assolve in the ditch. When applied the rate of ten pounds per half ile of ditch, a kill of 75 to 80 er cent of the moss can be ex-ceted.

pected. Irrigation engineers are experi-menting with other materials which may give better control. Announcements on these materials should be forthcoming shortly, ac-cording to Hudson. The county agent recommends treatment of ditches in order to conserve water and reduce the labor of irrigation.





# WE CHOOSE SHIVERS FOR GOVERNOR BECAUSE

Under him we have improved schools, higher teachers' salaries and a sound educational program for the future.

He agrees with the people of the High Plains Underground Water District that they are enitled to a locally controlled program, for which we have been fighting for ten years.


