

A Lockney man is among the candidates for four directors' positions open in the Texas Grain Sorghum Producers Board currently underway in 29 High Plains counties.

Albert Scheele, of Lockney, was placed in nomination along with Dennis Anthony, from Friona, Olan Crowl, from Morse, John Gilbreath, of Hart, and Steve Lee, of Hale Center. Gilbreath is the only incumbent candidate. A.W. Anthony, of Friona, E.C. Witten, of Edmonson and Don Nelson, of Tulia, opted against seeking reelection to the board.

Ballots were mailed to producers throughout the area. Every two years, four seats on the board come up for election.

All grain sorghum producers in the TGSP area are eligible to vote in the election. Any producer who does not receive a ballot by mail may obtain one from his county agents office.

Deadline for the election is Sept. 15. Any ballot postmarked later than that date will not be considered. A space is provided on the ballot for write-in candidates, provided the candidate agrees to serve if elected.





Otero Scheele Is Herdsman

On the Albert Scheele farm southwest of Providence Mrs. Scheele (Otero) has done everything in the farm operation except run the cotton stripper or

And she says she's not going to learn how! Still, she can be counted on to haul the maize, corn or cotton to the elevator or gin. And she's always on call if help is needed in plowing, cultivating etc.

Until the Scheeles bought their present six-row equipment and a larger tractor she did more of the farming than she presently does. "It was fun planting. I learned how to set the correct depth. It wouldn't be hard to plant with six-row equipment, I just haven't been

Although not as active as a "farmer" as she once was, she still has all the Ralph helps quite a lot with the animal chores since he has gotten older, but it's still Otero's main farm job.

She raises show lambs, cattle, geese, chickens, rabbits, pheasants, guineas, ducks, goats, dogs and cats, and still keeps a cow that she milks every day. In the Providence community Otero is called often for advice on medical treatment for cows, sheep and dogs. She

does most of the veterinary care for her animals, and helps shear her sheep. At one time she groomed dogs (two of her daughters learned from her and have run their own grooming services.) and has raised many kinds of dogs to sell. Right now her Shih Tsu is expecting pups, but in past years there have been Pekingese, Chihuahua, collie, poodle, dachshund puppies at the

For the past five years Otero has been a licensed vocational nurse working on the surgical floor at Central Plains Hospital in Plainview. Most weeks she works three or four days and takes leaves of absences occasionally. Once her leaves of absence were because of lambing or harvest, but new grand-

babies or illnesses among her children are most often the reason nowdays.

Albert and Otero Scheele have raised six children. Linda has three children and is the wife of a county extension agent in Brenham, David is attending Texas A&M studying to be a veterinarian, Diane lives in Galveston with, her husband and son, Becky is in the Dallas area with her husband and two children and is expecting a baby in November, Lisa is married to a farmer in the Perryton area, and Ralph, 15, is the only child still at home.

When Otero isn't farming, taking care of animals or nursing, she cans, freezes vegetables, makes lots of jelly, and makes butter and loaves of bread every week.

At one time she sewed a lot, making Becky's wedding dress and her attendants' dresses. When the girls were in high school she made more than one western suit. The only sewing she has done for Ralph was an Easter suit when he was a little child

Her hens produce more than enough eggs for the family, and she sells extras to neighbors and fellow hospital em-

Otero's dad, Ralph Brown who formerly lived at Providence but now resides at Edmonson, heard Otero and friend Esther Brasher talking about buying a grinding mill. He remembered at old stone-grinding mill of his still stored on the Scheele farm, so he hooked it up to a motor. Now Otero makes her own whole wheat flour and

Proceeds from the telethon go to the Muscular Dystrophy Association, which sponsors research into the biochemistry and biophysics of normal muscle, as well as clinical studies of muscular dystrophy and its related disorders.

A disease that can begin at any age, but most often appears among women their 20's and men over 40, myasthenia gravis is characterized by intermittent muscular weakness of variable degree and duration. While any muscles may be involved, those most commonly involved are muscles of eye movement, facial expression, and eyelid elevation, says the Association.

In mild cases muscle function is regained after rest. Severe cases may involve respiratory muscles and chewing and swallowing. Strength may not return even with prolonged rest. There is no known cure for myasthenia gravis, the Association says, but the disease can often be controlled with drug



Tips On Controlling White Grubs In Lawns

'The selling price of the fiber was only 46 cents in 1974 and 54 cents in 1978. At these selling price levels, polyester producers were able to cover the costs of raw materials, energy and other costs, but they were not getting a satisfactory return on their invest-

Looking ahead, Troxler says the average cost of a barrel of oil in the United States is estimated to be \$16 in 1980 and may be \$23.50 in 1985.

'At these crude oil levels,' he adds, 'Arthur D. Little, Inc., one of the nation's must respected technical consulting firms, estimates that the cost of raw materials alone will jump up to 52 cents per pound of polyester in 1980, almost double the cost in 1978. By 1985, polyester rises extremely rapidly as raw materials are expected to rise

The Cotton Incorporated economist also observes that production of synthetic fibers is currently running close to capacity. "If polyester staple producers are to maintain their relative share of the fiber market," he says, "new (plant) capacity will be required by the early 1980s, and market prices will have to rise dramatically.

Looking at rayon, Troxler notes that since that fiber is made from wood pulp, it is not as greatly affected by price hikes for oil. However, he says, "rayon producers must cope with other problems that impose severe restrictions on the ability of rayon to displace other synthetics or cotton at mills."

He points out that rayon plants are old - the newest built about 25 years ago. In addition, strict and costly pollution control standards have been placed on rayon plants.

'Combined, these factors have pushed the out-of-pocket costs of producing rayon from 28 cents per pound in 1974 to an estimated 58 cents in 1980. Adding in the return on investment necessary to encourage new capacity, the total cost of producing rayon in 1980 soars to an estimated \$1.13 per pound,'

'Since capacity use is nearing the practical limit, and since no expansion planned, displacement by rayon of other synthetics or cotton at mills appears remote.'

Troxler says higher oil costs and an inflationary economy also will have an impact on cotton production costs. He points out that farmers consume

large amounts of diesel fuel in operating ever-larger pieces of farm machinery. "Equipment prices have gone up 75 percent since 1974, and the cost of labor to operate them has gone up more than 50 percent. Cotton is a major user of agricultural chemicals, many of which







Conference Studies Effects Of Times On Rural Churches

Rural churches ramain a stronghold, "something to cling to," for many rural Texans. But forces of change are at work that are affecting both rural communities and their churches.

Discussions on the nature and extent of these changes will highlight the 34th annual Town and Country Church Conference at Rudder Center, Texas A&M University, Oct. 4-5.

Conference theme will be Towns in Old Communities: The Conversion of Rural Texas."

"Church and community leaders are groping for new meaning and direction, and this conference will focus on the latest issues affectin church and co-mmunity life," points out Dr. Dave Ruesink, sociologist with the Texas Agricultual Extension Service and conference chairman. 
