Southwestern Public Service Company, pursuant to law and the rules of the Public Utility Commission of Texas, hereby gives notice of its intent to apply for a general rate increase affecting all classes of its retail consumers in the county of Floyd whose rates are subject to the original jurisdiction of either the municipality of Lockney or the Public Utility Commission of Texas. A copy of the Company's statement of intent and proposed tariffs has been filed with said municipality and said Commission.

The revised tariffs are proposed to become effective April 4, 1980. Applied to all affected consumers in the 31 counties comprising the Company's Texas service area. they will increase the Company's retail operating revenues by approximately 14.8

Antique stoves may have strong appeal, but the watchword is "buyer, beware." After years of use, antique cast-iron stoves are likely brittle. They may have cracks in the stove body, wobbly legs, sagging or rusted hinges, warped doors, missing grates, and louvers or dampers that don't work properly. A welder can repair many of these problems, but in many cases, older units aren't worth the risk they bring to a home

Today's "hottest" models are those that look like the old-fashioned wood stoves, or you can find those with a modern touch that look like electric or gas heaters. Currently air-tight stoves are in big demand. These units have an air intake that restricts the amount of air entering the stove so wood burns more slowly.

One caution on air-tight units, though: there's some question of their safety, since the slow-burning wood gives off gases which form creosote deposits in the chimney. Creosote can start a chimney fire if allowed to accumulate, especially if the stove is overloaded with a roaring fire. However, frequent checks for creosote accumu-

The Executive Committee of U.S. WHEAT ASSOCIATES met in Washington, D.C. this week, the first such meeting of the producer market development organization since it was formed a month ago with the merger of Great Plains Wheat, Inc. and Western Wheat Associates. Leo Witkowski of Hereford, participated in the Executive Committee meeting as chairman of the Texas Wheat Producers Board, a sup-porting member of U.S. WHEAT. According to Witkowski, the primary purpose of the Executive Committee meeting was to review the progress in consolidating the two former organizations and to provide initial policy direction to the combined staffs.

"The Executive Committee approved a tentative staffing pattern for U.S. WHEAT ASSOCIATES, subject to the approval of the President/Chief Executive Officer, a position expected to be filled in late March," Witkowski stated. The Committee also gave preliminary approval to the proposed budget for the new organization for the 1980-81 fiscal year beginning in July reflecting an increased level of market development efforts by producers. The budget will be reviewed and adopted by the full Board of Directors at the next scheduled meeting to be held March 24-26 in Washington, D.C.

In a meeting with Secretary of Agriculture Bergland, the farmer-board members reaffirmed U.S. WHEAT'S strong commitment to the development of expanded export markets for wheat and other agricultural commodities. They also expressed concern that, despite verbal commitments by administration officials toward greater emphasis on exports, especially in light of

the embargo of grain shipments to the Soviet Union, very little concrete action has been taken by government to strengthen the market development programs. The Texas Wheat leader stated,

"U.S. WHEAT urged Secretary Berg-land and the National Association of Wheat Growers, to actively seek improvements in the available marketing tools so necessary for the expansion of U.S. grain abroad. Among the issues being supported by U.S. WHEAT are an increase in both the level of funding and the flexibility for PL 480 and Commodity Credit Corporation (CCC) export financing programs, as well as an increase in government financial support for export market development activities to match the increasing invest-

ment from the wheat producers. Witkowski stated that U.S. WHEAT ASSOCIATES also reaffirmed its commitment to carry forward its petition initiated by Great Plains Wheat with the support of Western Wheat Associates, against the European Communities' export subsidy program. The validity of the wheat farmers legal complaint against the European Community was earlier accepted by the U.S. Government and action must be taken on the complaint by the end of July.

According to Witkowski, the Executive Committee concluded with the call for the rapid expansion of the U.S. WHEAT information program to provide the U.S. wheat farmer and foreign customers with timely information on the wheat situation and the outlook for world trade. This would begin with the employment of a "Director of Information" to coordinate and expand on the work previously carried out by the two



Cattle Scabies Outbreaks Reported In 11 States

Psoroptic cattle scabies continues to plague the cattle business, F.J. Mulhern administrator of the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Animal and Plant Inspection Service, said today.

This past January, Mulhern said, there were 59 scabies outbreaks in 11 states. He listed the cases: Arizona--one case in Coconino

county. Idaho--one case in Payette county.

lowa--one case each in Cherokee, Dickinson, Mitchell, Palo Alto and Sioux counties. Illinois--one case in Fulton County.

Kansas--one each in Hamilton, Hodgeman, Ness, Rush and Scott counties; two each in Edwards, Ford and Haskell counties; three in Meade county; four in Finney county.

Minnesota--two cases in Brown county.

Nebraska--one case each in Boyd, Box Butte, Dundy, Fillmore, Hall and Rock counties. Mew Mexico--one case each in Colfax

and Roosevelt counties. Oklahoma--one case each in Beaver,

Beckham, Cimarron and Texas counties; two each in Blaine and Major counties. South Dakota--one case each in

Aurora, Lincoln, Minnehaha, and **Turner** counties.

Texas--one case each in Dallam, Donley, Hall, Hartley, Parmer, Potter and Swisher counties; four in Deaf Smith county. January's 59 outbreaks compare with

the same number reported in January a year ago, and 41 last December. Nationwide for fiscal 1980, the total stands at 126 cases reported, the same as for this time as last year.

Scabies has long been a problem in some areas of the Southwest, said Mulhern, but now it is appearing at an alarming rate in many midwestern and south central plains states. He said the only way cattlement can keep scabies outbreaks down and prevent its spread is to check herds regularly and refrain from mixing newly acquired cattle with already established herds.

A tiny, parasitic mite causes scabies. The mite punctures the skin of cattle to feed on body fluids released from the wounds. The mites spread by contact between animals. They are killed by dipping infested animals in pesticides approved by the USDA under state or federal supervision. Mites cause serious economic losses to cattlemen and feedlot operators but

do not affect the wholesomeness of meat, said Mulhern. Therefore, he said, infested and exposed herds are placed under quarantine until the animals are treated and found free of the disease.
