



Carthel added that the radar will also have a tracking device. "It will show where each airplane is when they are in the air. Also, every time the radar makes a complete turn, an attached camera will take photo of the screen. That way we can prove what the cloud looked like and where we were.'

The planned program will be for both hail suppression and precipitation augmentation, a new feature from area projects in the past. Carthel said he hopes the project will be able to increase rain and snowfall by 10 to 30 percent, as well as decrease damaging hail by 50 to 75 percent

"Every job I ve ever had, I liked. When I was working for the government in personnel, I liked it and didn't think I would



Personal safety may be a factor overlooked in cloud seeding...."Silver iodide, the chemical used, can affect the ecosystem adversely as it combines with other substances in the atmosphere, such as lead from automobile exausts, to form poisons that settle on grasses which are eaten by animals and possibly passed on at the dinner table," Claunch pointed out.

that the silver iodide used to seed the clouds is not harmful to the health of the people. After a cloud has been seeded, one of Korea.

the main problems scientists have is being able to

find traces of the silver iodide in that cloud or others downwind from it.' one PWIA director said.' "Nobody has ever

brought a sick cow in, or a blade of grass, and said 'Here are some traces of silver iodide.' There has been no documented evidence at all."



Remember the good ol' days of cloud seeding, when neighbor dunned neighbor to contribute to the expense fund? People in the towns were asked to contribute for hail protection. Hundreds of thousands of dollars were raised and spent during those years in this area.

On June 11, we will vote again to decide whether we want cloud seeding back. If it does come back, it will cost \$1.60 per acre and a sliding scale of charges for businesses and residences.

The Citizens for Natural Weather say that such money spent for cloud seeding is plain GAMBLING ... because no one can prove cloud seeding is effective for hail suppression or rain making.

Experts do not offer such proof, as a Senate hearing n Washington attested in October of 1979, where experts and practitioners alike agreed generally that cloud seeding is neither predictable or controllable and that not enough is known about clouds to make weather modification a practical art.

Here are some direct quotes from that Senate hearing:

"We still have not learned how to get reliable results from cloud seeding, and our attempts to do it are still shrouded n controversy and doubt." . . . D. Ray Booker, President, Aeroment, Inc.

"Further, because weather modification is not now developed as a readily applicable technology, it seems to us that agencies who will ultimately apply the technology must be involved in the technological development. We believe that weather modification is in the research phase." ... The committee on weather modification, American Meterological Society, Jeff Hill, Robert Sax, Richard Semonin and Donald L. Veal.

"Very little experimentation has been done on modification of severe storms." and "Much more work needs to be done to determine the efficacy of hail suppression and other

weather modification techniques." and "We must learn much more than we now know about the economic benefits and costs of weather modification, about the less tangible impacts on society of operational programs, and about the environmental impacts of deliberate changes in the weather." ... Richard A. Frank, Administrator, National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration.

"Most weather modification so far has been unintended, the product of urbanization, power production, cropping patterns, deforestation and irrigation. Learning more about the unintended consequences of modern industrial civilization is an essential part of learning how to change weather on purpose in ways that benefit people." ... Harlan Cleveland, Chairman, Weather Modification Advisory Board

"The science of weather modification, both deliberate and inadvertent, has many fundamental uncertainties and is therefore largely still in the stage of exploratory research and experimentation." The Faculty of the Department of Atmospheric Science, University of Wyoming.

"Regrettably, in the absence of adequate experimental controls, it is not possible to assess the actual effects of cloud seeding programs" . . . Louis J. Battan, member, National Advisory Committee on Oceans and the Atmosphere.

"Herbicides and cotton strippers have been the greatest breakthrough for the farmer - eliminating hoe hands and cotton pickers. In years past we had better pest control but because of government environmentalists, our best pest controls have been outlawed," Walker concluded.

Walker, his brother Ransom and one hired hand did most of the work. During hay-baling season they added some help to make four men on the haybaler plus a tractor driver. They started with 50 acres of alfalfa and four years later had expanded to 200 acres.



County loan and purchase rates or 1980-crop wheat grading no. 1 or better were issued today by the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Agri-cultural Stabilization and Conservation Service. The rates are based on the national average loan rate of \$2.50 per bushel, the same as the final rate for 1979-crop wheat. All 1980 county rates for wheat

An alcohol fuel symposium that will key in on small-scale production of ethanol from grain will be held at Texas A&M University July 1-2.

The symposium is being sponsored by two organizations of the Texas A&M University System-the Texas Agricultural Experiment Station and the Texas Agricultural Extension Service-along with A&M's Center for Energy and Mineral Resources.

Various issues relating to the production and use of ethanol will be discussed, including feedstocks, preprocessing requirements, use as fuel in engines, by-product use, and legal, economic and financial aspects.

Information will be presented on a number of ongoing projects related to alcohol fuel, including agricultural resi-due combustion-gasification as a heat source for distillation, development of sweet sorghums as feedstock for ethan-

ol production, operation of a small-scale ethanol demonstration plant, use of ethanol in diesel and natural gas-driven engines, ethanol-gasoline dual fuel systems, and economics of ethanol production.

Among speakers will be Dr. Neville Clarke, Experiment Station director; Dr. Wayne A. LePori, agricultural engineer, Dr. L.O. Schake, researcher in feedlot management, and Dr. E.J. Soltes, researcher in wood chemistry, all with the Experiment Station; Henry P. O'Neal, Extension agricultural engineer; Texas Commissioner of Agriculture Reagan Brown; and Rep. Dan Kubiak, vice chairman of the House Agriculture and Livestock Committee. Anyone interested in attending the symposium is encouraged to pre-register by June 23. County Extension offices have registration forms and additional details on the program.







A few insecticide which are available locally for use on bagworms are malathion, sevin, diazinon, and dipel. The homeowner should read the label to insure proper application rates and to be certain that the tree being treated will not be damaged by the insecticide.







Is there a blind spot in your checkups? The Texas Society to Prevent Blindness thinks there is - if that checkup does not include a test for glaucoma, the leading cause of blindness today.

"A test for the high eye pressure that is characterstic of glaucoma should be as routine a part of every checkup for people over 35 years old as is the test for high blood pressure," says Richard Kimbrough, M.D., Houston ophthalmologist who is the Society's gluacoma chairman. "A quick painless test with a tonometer can readily determine eye pressure and in an era where preventive health measures are being increasingly emphasized, patients should ask that such a test be included in every physical exam they

"Family practitioners and internists, the doctors who frequently give checkups, tested for glaucoma in medical school,' Kimbrough pointed out, 'but usually neglect to incorporate the test into their practice." Yet the Society estimates that one out of every 50 of their patients over age 35 may have glaucoma. However, because the disease comes on so painlessly, neither patient nor doctor can be aware of its onset in time to save valuable sight unless the patient's intraocular or eye pressure is regularly checked. GET MOST FROM COOLING DOLLAR

Consumers can get more from their "beat-the-summer-heat" dollar, says Dr. Jane Berry, a housing and home furnishings specialist. Dr. Berry is with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, at Texas A&M. She suggests some simple, no-cost steps consumers can take immediately to maximize cooling.

RAISE THERMOSTAT Raise the air conditioner thermostat to the highest comfort level possible. This will reduce energy consumption from three to 10 percent for each degree the thermostat is raised. When it's excessively hot outdoors, turn the thermostat up even higher to keep from overworking the air conditioner. Greatest efficiency results when a difference of no more

than 15 to 20 degrees is maintained between inside and outside temperature.

USE FANS

Fans, used either by themselves or with air conditioning, can enhance summer comfort while saving energy While a one-ton air conditioner costs around seven cents an hour to operate, a fan costs less than one cent an hour to run.

Fans won't make any change in the room's actual temperature, but the constant breeze they provide will make you "feel" much cool-

In fact, set the air conditioner at 82 degrees F., use a fan to circulate the air, and experience the same comfort as if the air conditioner were set at 74 degrees F.

DRAW SHADES Windows and glass areas transmit most of the radiant heat they are exposed to. So, block out heat on those sides of the house that get direct sun exposure. Draw shades or draperies on the east side in the morning and on the west side in the afternoon to reduce the heat load the air conditioner must remove.
