



His fourth season produced a 6-3 record and gave them second place in their district. In 1979, Sexton's fifth year in Lazbuddie, his team won their zone title but lost in play against Valley for the district championship.

By the fifth year in Lazbuddie, Sexton had 34 of the 38 boys in high school out for football.

He is a believer in a strong track program. By his third year, Lazbuddie title and placed fifth at the regional meet. The next year they also won district and they placed second in the regional meet, just three points behind the first place team. They placed sixth in the state meet. This year, 1980, after the Sextons moved to Lockney, the Lazbuddie team won district, won regional, and placed fifth in state.

He had 18 boys out for track the first year, 23 boys the second, and from 28-32 the last three years. Also, every boy in junior high school was in the track program the last three years.

A heavy emphasis on weight training is another area that Sexton believes to be important. He says, 'We put the boys on a year round weight program. Even during football season, we continue to lift weights two times per week. This keeps the upper body strength at a peak. I also believe it makes the players less susceptible to injury. Last we did and had a good year, we didn't have a team feeling. We were

player miss a game because of injury. Of course, luck has something to do with this, but conditioning also contributes."

There will be five coaches on staff this year. Mike Lebby from Bovina, who attended the University of New Mexico and Eastern New Mexico University, will handle the offensive line and the defensive ends. He will also be boys basketball coach.

Jim Ward, an all-state player from Canyon High School and a player at Baylor University and Carson Newman College in Tennessee, will be in charge of offensive backs and outside linebackers.

Lynn Caffey, from Sul Ross, will be defensive line coach and handle tight ends. Robert Murdock, the

only holdover coach, has been moved to high school where he will be in charge of defensive backs and wide receivers.

Sexton, who was named as All-South Plains Class B Coach of the Year won its first district track in 1979, will be the overall coordinator. He stressed that he would be working with all the boys in the football program, including junior high. "It is important to work with the younger kids. There is where your program is built. There is something that each boy can do well and we need to find that. A kid that age needs to have something that they can do well and be proud

> Sexton prefers to coach in a small school. "I think the better athletes come from the smaller schools. They are involved in all sports. In a large school athletes generally specialize in one sport. The small school athlete is a much better rounded indivi-

> Sexton's philosophy is summed up in his following statement, "Winning is great. I played two years on a losing team and they were two long years. But the best years I had were playing on a team that won some games and we were proud of the job

close. I believe in teaching a team concept, comeraderie and pride in what we represent, our school, parents and town. It is important to teach right from wrong. All the coaches on our staff have the same philosophy. If I have a player who will not abide by our rules, he will not play. If I compromise myself the other kids see that. I would rather have a 5-5 season and have good kids than have a 15-0 state championship team and have to turn my head to problems. It would not be a team I could be proud







Tools needed include a stepladder, newspaper or rags to clean the brushes and rollers and drop cloths to cover floors and furniture and a plastic bucket. A roll of masking tape for edging and a razor blade in a holder plus a straight-edged ruler for window touch-ups will make the job easier. Rollers are great for covering a large expanse of wall. Roller covers are chosen according to the type surface to be painted. A variety of brushes make the job easier. A wide brush is good for corners and door panels where the roller can't reach. 



Good Yields On Onions

Onion harvest begins this week in Floyd County with both packing sheds expected to be running.

"I've been growing onions here for 24 years," said Chuck Holmes, 'and this is as good a crop as I've

Holmes is with the DeBryan Produce Shed and expects to start shipping the end of the week.

The onion market is only fair with yellow pre-packs and large mediums selling at \$3.50. Jumbo yellows are bringing between \$6

The white market is \$4.50 for re-packs, \$6.00 for mediums and \$9.00 for jumbos.

"This is the tail end of the Las Cruces deal," Holmes said. Las Cruces had a good crop this year and they were about two weeks later than usual, which has kept the market down.

Arizona has finished shipping, but California is still strong. Onions are coming from the Indio and Palm Springs area now.

Hereford will come off in another 2 weeks. "They had a little more Holmes said.

Holmes estimated that there are around 1000 acres planted in Floyd County. The Hereford-Dimmitt area

The county cucumber crop also looks good and should be ready in about two weeks, possibly by the Fourth of July.

Peppers are expected to start about August 25.

Wheat harvest is winding down and now onion harvest is beginning. There are about 1000 acres of onions in the county. Yields are running high this year and the prices are only fair but market generally falls off before the 4th of July and comes back afterwards.

Jon LaBaume, district conservationist for the soil conservation service stated that SCS would be involved in terracing some wheat ground and doing some other conservation practices on wheat ground, but at the present time, no cost share monies are available in the Great Plains Conservation Program or ACP program. Home. Whitfill died Thursday at Lockney General Hospital after a lengthy illness.


A native of Alma, he moved to Floyd County in 1904 from Ennis. He married the former Eva Weathers June 4, 1916 in Plainview.
