"It was a very traumatic experience. We were all extremely apprehensive about whether we would be allowed to leave the country and return to our homes. I was never more homesick in my life," is the way Mrs. Bill Strickland described her experience as an American tourist in Cairo, Egypt on the day the President Anwar Sadat was assassinated.

"Our four country tour plan called for us to arrive in Cairo on October 6. but we were informed by our tour guides that, since the Egyptians planned a huge holiday celebrating their "victory" in the 1973 war against Israel, that the border between Israel and Egypt would be closed on that day. So our tour directors arranged for us to travel by bus from Jerusalem to Cairo on the fifth so that we would be inside the Egyptian border before it closed. "They couldn't have timed it worse, since we arrived at the Pyramid Holiday Inn near the pyramids on the outskirts of Cairo, at 11:30 p.m. on the fifth after

suffering the 100 degree temperatures of the desert on an un-airconditioned bus all the way from Jerusalem through the Saini desert, the Gaza Strip and on through the desert until we were held up at the Egyptian border for at least four hours awaiting clearance through customs.



Watson resigns as **Floyd** County auditor

District Judge George Miller announced this week the resignation of O.M. Watson Jr. as County Auditor of Floyd County. Watson submitted his resignation last Monday which will be effective December 31, 1981.

"I feel that twenty-two years in the auditor's office is long enough." Watson said in his resignation letter. "It is time for a new person to bring fresh ideas and enthusiasm to the office."

The County Auditor is appointed by the District Judge for a two-year term. Watson was appointed on November 15, 1959, by District Judge L.D. Ratliff. Judge Miller expressed his regret losing a person of Mr. Watson's ability and dedication to public service, and will consider applications for the office effective January 1, 1982. Qualifications

set out in the law are as follows: Article 1648, V.A.T.S. "Said auditor shall be a citizen of the county of at least two years residence, and must be a man of unquestionable good moral character and intelligence, thoroughly competent in public business details; and he must be a competent accountant of at least two years experience in auditing and accounting. The judges mak-

ing such appointment must first carefully investigate and consider the qualifications of said person. If no such qualified citizen of the county can be procured, said judges may appoint a qualified citizen from another county". Acts 1905, page 381. Applications from men and women

should be written and mailed for delivered to Judge Miller.

The Lockney General Hospital now has a valuable new service to offer the public. Mrs. Gail Fortenberry, Hospital Administrator, announced this week.

A fully equipped and manned physical therapy department with all the latest equipment in the field of physical

therapy is open and ready for patients. Mrs. Fortenberry stated. Mr. Gib Gimbel of Plainview is the physical therapist, and is aided by Rise Taylor, his well qualified aide.

Mr. Gimbel received his original training at Nebraska State University. earning a B.A. there and his graduate training at the University of Houston medical branch at Hermann Hospital. He brings a wealth of experience and background to the Lockney hospital department. Mrs. Fortenberry said. Mr. Gimbel emphasizes that physical

therapy is a vital part of any medical practice, and can save a community like Lockney in excess of one million dollars a year in lost income, disability income and lost production.

Though all patients seen are by medical doctor referral, most of the patients' treatments are programmed by the therapist. When asked about what type patients a therapist might treat, Mr. Gimbel mentioned the following as some of the most common ailments and problems: backaches. sprains, strains, arthritis, post fractures, strokes, whiplash, frozen shoulders and burns.

The department will also see those who wish to quit smoking and those with weight problems. Gimbel explained.

Mrs. Fortenberry invites the people of the community to drop in for a visit at the new department and see for themselves what a fine addition it is to the hospital's services.





Library receives funds from Revenue Sharing

"Friends" are hopeful that there will be enough money to go ahead with the card file system at that time.

At the Commissioners Court meeting, Janice Lloyd recommended that a Library Board be formed with two representatives from each precinct and one member-at-large from the county. Commissioners indicated they would study the suggestion.

Judge Smith said that three applications had been received and that another had indicated that she would submit an application for the County Librarian position

Jim Scheppke of West Texas Library System informed the court of the requirements necessary to certify the librarian so that the county can continue to receive state funds.

Those requirements are;

Graduation from high school (or GED) and successful completion of 30 semester hours in an accredited college or university; or

Graduation from high school (or GED) and six years library experience vithin the past ten years, or

Graduation from high school (or GED) and three years library experience and attendance at four library-related workshops or professional meetings within the past five years.

Renewable annually with attendance at a minimum of one library-related workshop or professional meeting (i.e., TLA, SWLA, ALA, etc.)

Crime rate rises in October **Texas 3.3 per cent**

The number of major crimes reported in Texas during the first six months of 1981 rose 3.3 per cent compared to the same period last year, according to DPS Director Colonel Jim Adams.

"Although this is a significant increase, it does indicate that the volume of major crimes in our state is rising at a lower rate than we saw last year." Adams said. In 1980, major criminal

Saying soybean cyst nematodes (SCN) are most often spread to new areas by contaminated equipment, the plant scientist strongly advised a thorough equipment cleaning this fall. Further, he recommends working an infested field last. He added rotation, resistant soybean varieties and nematacides will also assist in reducing damage. Before lanting a resistant variety, owever, he suggests checking the field to determine if SCN is present and its specific SCN race. Local crop production specialists or extension plant pathologists can test soil for the presence of SCN. And, to prevent field contamination, ne advises always buy seed rom a reliable source.









weekly rate, for a particular contract, he can not change to another ceiling rate during the life of that contract.

Applicable rules of the law to a specific situation depend on whether an open-end account or a closed-end contract is involved. An openend account is a typical charge account or a revolving loan agreement. If the open-or closed-end

loan is on a variable interest rate. the rate charged must not exceed the ceiling chosen for that agreement.

Once parties have agreed on an interest rate. they are also considered to have agreed to any lesser rate that a creditor may elect or be required to implement. unless other arrangements have been made.

Regarding an open-end account, once a fixed rate is elected for a quarter or a year, that rate may not be increased during the speci-

fied period. If a borrower refuses an interest rate increase on an open-end account. he has the right to pay off the existing balance, at the old rate and over the time period, under the same terms as prior to the rate change. However, additional charges to that account will be subject to the new terms.

Applicable ceilings for renewals and extensions are the same as any other contracts negotiated at the time of the renewal or extension. Pesticide Applicator Training to be held

State and Federal Laws require any individual planning to purchase pesticides bearing a "Restricted Use" label to have a Certified **Private Applicator License.**

Many farmers, ranchers, and homeowners obtained a license in 1977 by attending a similar training meeting when the State and Federal law first went into effect. Other individuals have completed a home-study course since that time in order to obtain an applicator license. However, many producers in Floyd and surrounding counties still do

not have a license and will no doubt need one in the near future as State and Federal laws continue to crack down on the use and abuse of hazardous chemi-


Overapplication of water above that needed to fill the soil to field capacity costs the irrigator at least \$2.00 per acre inch, in fuel cost alone. Each "extra" inch can cost a farmer over \$320 on a 160 acre field. Under-irrigating, on the other hand, can cost producers millions of doliars in reduced yields.

For the dryland producer, the soil moisture monitoring program can provide data to help him select crop varieties most suitable for his existing soil moisture conditions.

The survey will also have a tremendous irrigation water saving potential. especially in years when the soil moisture deficit is small, such as is expected for this season if current weather patterns continue.

The High Plain's first soil moisture monitoring program was developed and maintained for many years under the guidance of Oliver Newton, who worked for the National Weather Service at Lubbock, Technical guidance was provided by Texas Agricultural Experiment Station at Lubbock with funding support from the Plains Cotton Growers Association

With Oliver Newton's recent retirement and the closing of the local Weather Service offices, a new sponsor was needed to continue the program. The High Plains Water District accepted prime responsibility for the program. and developed a cooperative agreement with the SCS to expand the program. The Texas Agricultural Experiment Station will continue to provide technical assistance as needed.

What should we do with the vegetables in fall garden after they have

The harvest time in the fall is important to know and understand for each vegetable so that you can get each vegetable at their prime quality. For example tomatoes, the tomatoe fruit that are set today, the blossoms that are set will not produce their red ripe fruit for at least 60 days. If the temperatures are cooler, the last stages of ripening form the time the tomatoe is premature (as large as it's going to get, but before it starts to turn red) that time from the green mature to full ripe, is extended as much as 3 weeks to a month. If you got tomatoe fruit coming along toward maturity during the cool days of fall, as soon as they are full size and have started to turn color at the very blossom or tip end, they should be picked from

the plants and taken inside. They will ripen (finish the final stage of ripening inside) faster because temperatures are higher inside then they are out in the garden. All tomatoes will have to be harvested before the first frost date or they will be killed by the low temperatures. We usually have a frost around late October or early November. Any vegetable like tomatoes, squash, cucumber, beans, any thing that is frost susceptible has to be harvested before that date. As far as the other vegetables are concerned, you've got many weeks after the first frost; cabbage, cauliflower, broccoli, all the root crops, the green lettuce, spinich, beets and leaf lettuce.

The harvest period is going to be different for the various vegetables. The important thing is to harvest the vegetables as they come into early maturity and extend the harvest period in this matter. Don't wait until the entire crop is ready. A good example is the cabbage, the sotne head variety, will have a hard head when the little



head is about 3 inches in diameter and will weigh less than a pound. Harvest some at this stage and use them. The outer leaves are going to be killed by the frost, but the inside of the head of cabbage is perfectly fine. ROOT CROPS Carrots, beets, turnips, the true root crops don't have to be harvested when they're mature. There is nice sandy soil in most areas of the Plains. All you have to do to keep the roots in the garden and keep them in prime condition is to mulch up around the crowns with good clean wheat straw or clean mulchy material that will protect the crowns from freeze damage. You can obtain

clean sheat for feed in the fall. How should you look at harvesting of the crops in the fall garden in the summer


You should keep in mind the average date of the first frost in the fall and make certain that as the vegetables come into early maturity that you harvest as soon as possible, but don't harvest everything at once. If you're a month or several weeks away from frost, harvest steadily over time so that you can have a little bit in the house. Don't try to stack pile a bunch of crops. like the greens the vegetables that you know will tolerate the frost. Keep disease out of the vegetables and if worms get started make sure you plant Diapale to keep the worm population under control.
