Before sewing on a knit fabric. a test Before sewing on a knit fabric, a test
seam should be made to determine the pressure. tension and proper pressing
techniques needed. Use similar stitches and layers of
fabric to test for the right pressure and tension.
Pressure is usually adjusted for light to normal settings. depenting on the
weight of the fabric, and the right a mount of pressure is important.
Too much pressure Too much pressure can stretch or
ripple the fabric and too little can cause ripple the fabric and to little can cause
skipped stitches. When checking pressure. two lengths of fabric cut the same
length should come out identical when length should come out identical when
stithed without thread.
Loose tension should be used on Loose tension should be used on
knits. To check tension, the top and knits. To check tension, the top and
bottom will look the same with stitches interlocked between two fabric layers.
However. for top stitching the top
hread may be looser than the bottom Fabric curling can be prevented by
placing pins close together and perpen placing pins close together and perpen-
dicular to the fabric edges. Starching edges also helps. When cutting fabrics that tend to curl. consider using a wider-than
called-for seam allowance and trimming the seam allowance after stitching. You can also use double stick tape
along the seam line and seam allowance along the seam line and seam allowanc
of fabrics that curl considerably. of fabrics that curl considerably.
Pressing helps obtain the desired look on most knitted fabrics. though some are resistant to pressing. The resistant determined through seaming. These hints will help when pressing
