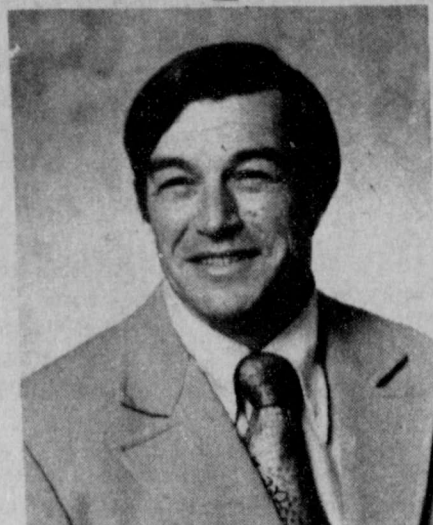


Humorist to speak at Chamber Banquet next Thursday night

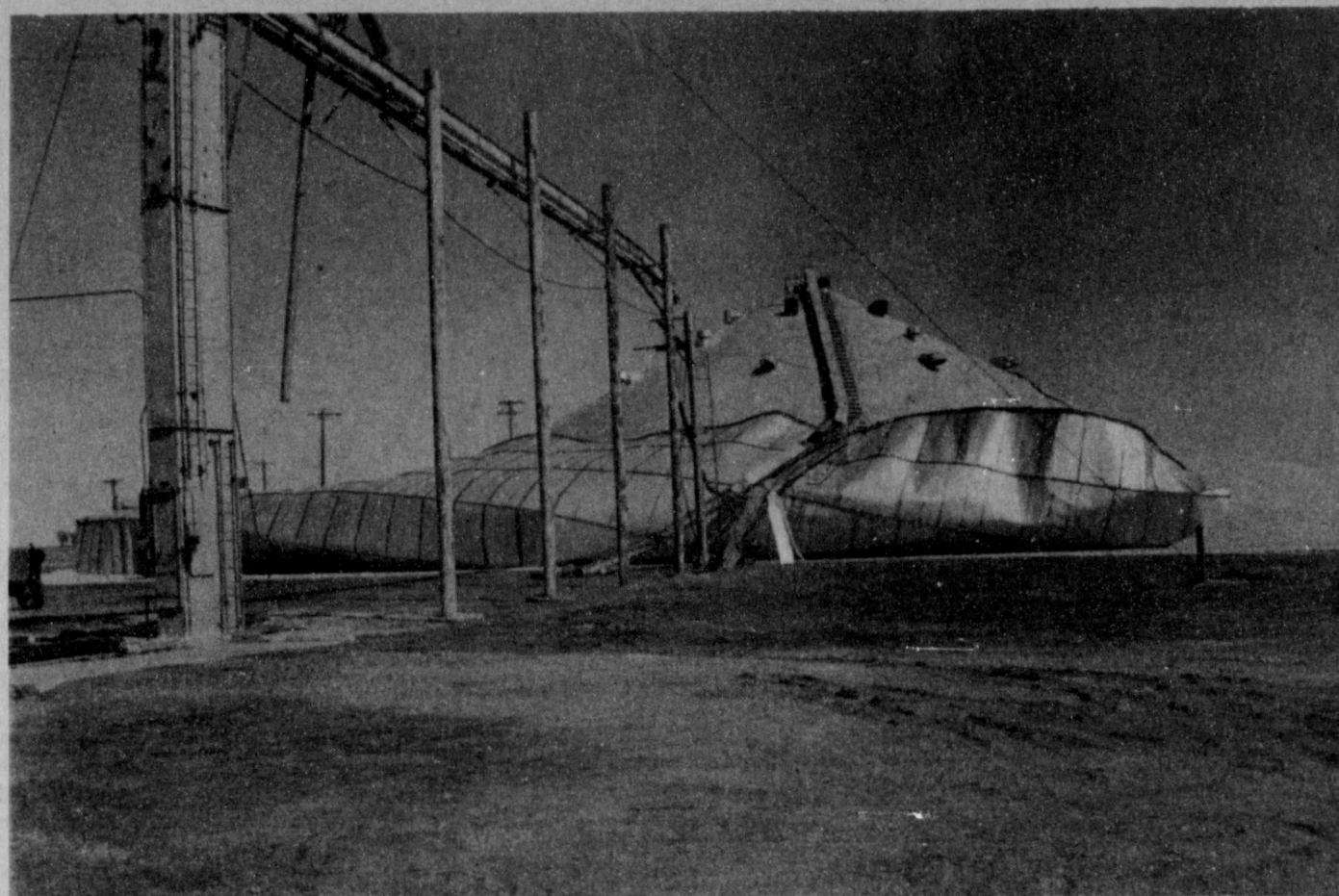

Two hospital board members seek re-election April 2 election

In a regular monthly Thursday night meeting of the hospital board, all members and the administrator were present the night of February 24. In old business the board discussed and made plans for the upcoming election on Saturday, April 2. The polls will be located at the east entrance of Lockney High School at 410 S.W. 4th Street, with the hospital district and the school district sharing the same centralized place to vote. Two of the board members, Rusty Baucus and Kenneth Tate, are serving in their second terms. Both have indicated they will run again. Chester Carthel, who is serving in his third term, is not eligible another term. The board deliberated for some little time to fill their responsibility in attempting to recommend qualified candidates to approach about the candidacy. Two names were eventually selected and the prospective candidates will be contacted by the board in order of best qualified until a candidate is secured. The deadline to file a petition for candidacy will be March 7. The election will be announced in the paper 5 days

before it will be held. Improvement of the south parking lot was on the agenda again, but the matter was tabled until warmer weather when the project could be undertaken without risking the loss of some of the improvements before the project could be completed. A revision of the medical staff by-laws was approved in regard to whom a physician can give verbal orders. In the administrator's monthly report a total of \$54,000 of previously charged off accounts have been sent to a collection agency in Dallas, Hospital Receivables Service. Administrator Guy Hazlett also announced that delinquent accounts amounting to \$36,000 have been sent notices. The near \$90,000 of accounts receivable in the 538 delinquent accounts are almost eligible for charge off, according to new credit and collection procedures. They are being worked extensively. Fees for Health Fitness Center was recommended by the administrator to be decreased from \$30 to \$20 per person per month. Outpatient visits to the hospital fell sharply due to the bad weather in

January, but inpatients had increased to 12 a day for a month. In other data given in the administrator's report a department by department report was given, clinically and administratively. In new business covered by the board a financial and statistical report for January showed an operating loss for the hospital of \$11,661 compared to a loss of \$14,263 for January of 1982. Year-to-date operating loss for the period from October, 1982 through January, 1983 is at \$53,819. The same period in 1982 showed a loss of \$80,066, for an improvement of \$26,247 for the first four-month period of the physical year. This year's YTD was an improvement of \$13,080 over 2 years ago. Figures are based on hospital revenue only. January's collections increased over that of November and December. Because the board meeting was held later in the month, February figures indicated that \$41,042 had been billed and \$53,354 had been collected, for a 129% collections on the amount billed. Also in the financial and statistical report for January the equivalent of 55 fulltime employees was shown for the hospital district.

Sterley Elevator collapses

No one was injured when a storage tank at the Sterley Elevator collapsed about 3:00 a.m. Wednesday morning. A falling wall of the tank knocked down a power line and power was out in the surrounding area for about one hour. As a result of the collapse, 24 million pounds of corn poured onto the ground. Cleanup has begun and is expected to last about 2 weeks. The corn is being moved to other elevators around the county for storage.

According to Gail Kring, manager of Lockney Coops, estimated damage to the tank is between \$250,000 and \$300,000. Cause of the collapse will not be determined until all of the corn has been removed and engineers can examine all the parts of the tank. Kring said that the suspected cause of the collapse was that the foundation gave way under the tank due to extended wet weather having weakened

the foundation, causing a pressure wall to pull away from the foundation. Pressure inside caused the walls to collapse. In 1979 a tornado had dented a wall of the elevator, causing only minor damage to the tank which had been repaired and approved. Several parts of the tank are salvageable including roof trusses and several fans and motors. Some of the bottom fans have not been found yet.

The church prepared for the missions conference with prayer sessions Wednesday night at the Charles Huffman and Barry Barker homes and with a 5 a.m. to 5 p.m. prayer vigil Thursday. The conference begins Friday evening at 6:30 with a covered dish supper at the church. The program starts at 7:30. Saturday's schedule includes a men's breakfast at 7 a.m. and a noon salad luncheon for ladies and children. Youth of the church will meet at 5:30 p.m. to hear one of the mission speakers. Church-wide sandwich supper will be at 6:30, followed by the program at 7:30. Coffee and doughnuts will be served from 9:15 to 9:45 a.m. preceding the Sunday School hour. Barry Barker certified to offer Federal Crop Insurance

Barry Barker of the Barker Insurance Agency in Lockney has achieved Certification from the Federal Crop Insurance Corporation to sell and service insurance coverage on wheat, oats, grain sorghum, barley, corn, cotton, soybeans, peanuts, sunflower and sugar beets. According to F.W. Crouch, Jr. Director of the FCIC, Barry Barker earned the Certification by participating in an intensive training program recently conducted in Lubbock and successfully passing examinations that required a knowledge of all aspects of the Federal-backed insurance program as well as of the coverage available for individual crops produced in Floyd and Swisher. The training and testing program was

initiated in the fall of 1982 to assure a high level of professional competency among private insurance agents who offer Federal Crop Insurance to farmers in their communities. Federal Crop Insurance policies, which provide coverage against all unavoidable causes of loss, are designed to offer farmers an affordable way to protect the substantial sums of money which must be invested and risked to produce a crop. The insurance can also assure a source of income to repay outstanding production loans and to meet fixed expenses such as taxes and mortgage payments. To make the coverage as economical as possible, the Federal Government currently pays up to 30 percent of the premium cost.

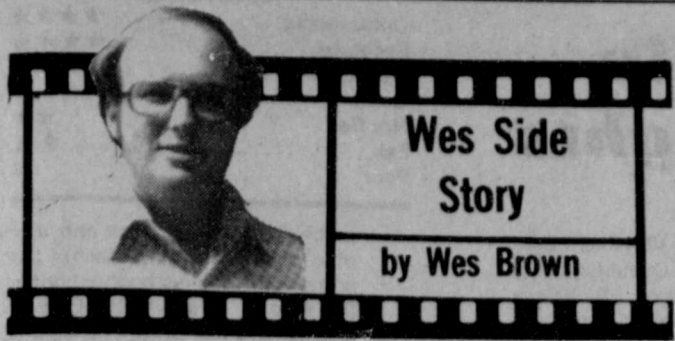

"That's squash. Just eat the pork and do as I say."

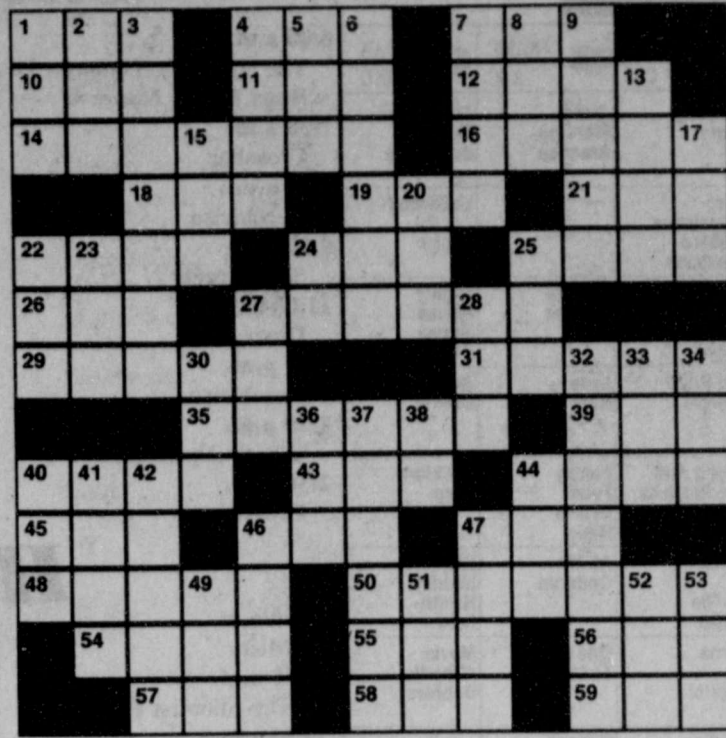
Pork was finally eaten, but not as much as it is today. I am sure cooking had something to do with pork being accepted. Which led to my next question: who invented cooking?

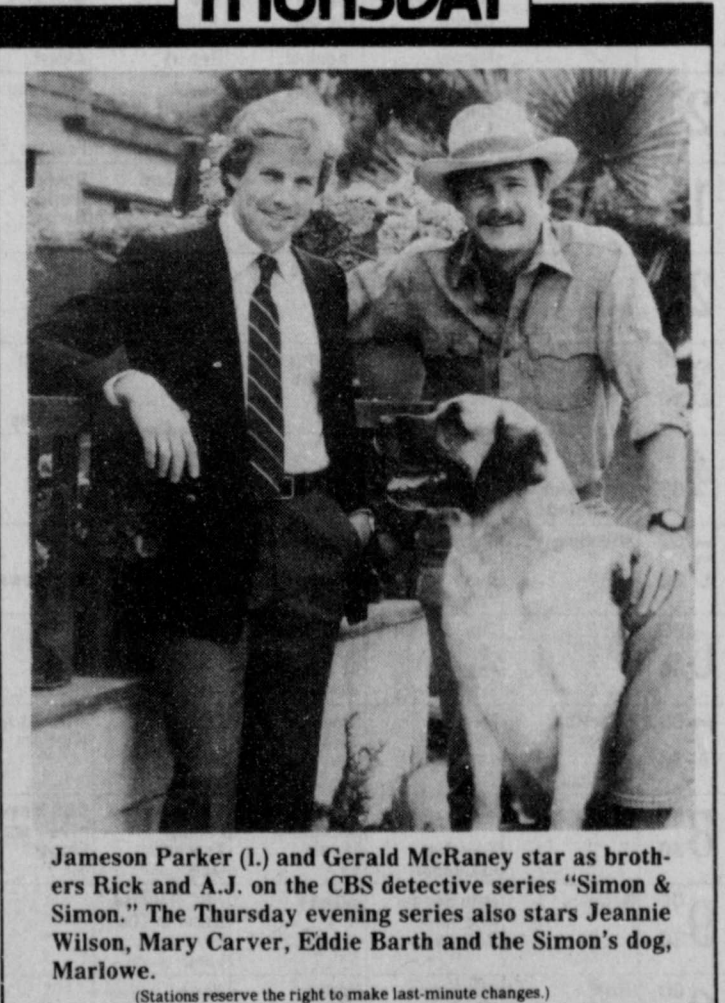

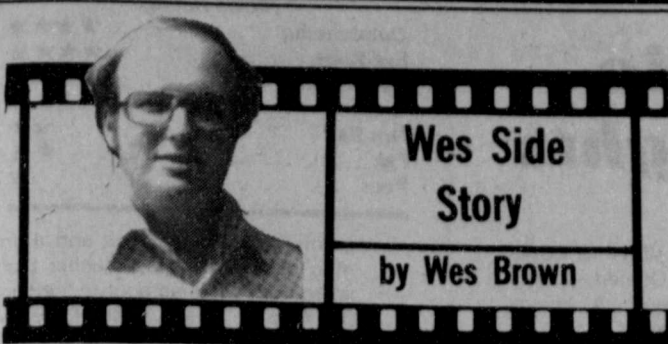

"That's squash. Just eat the pork and do as I say."

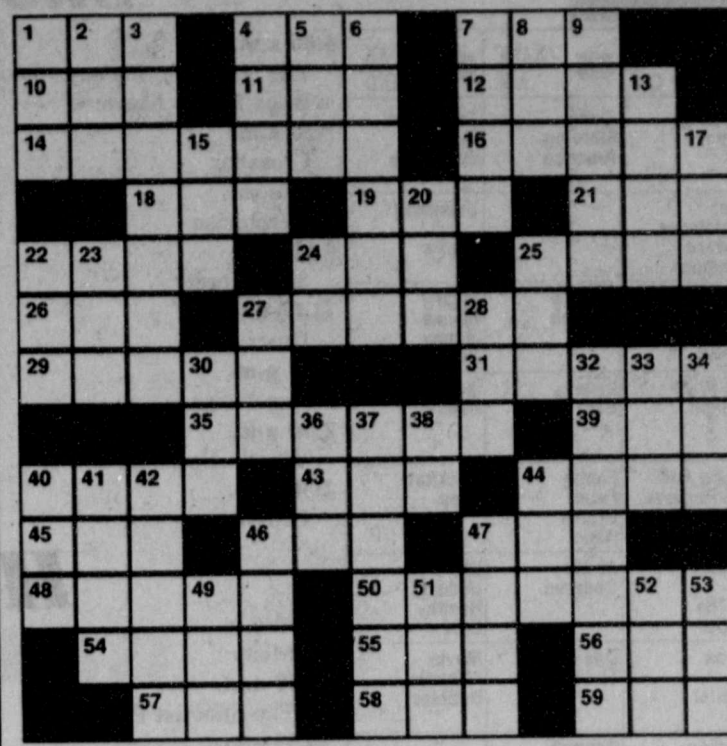
Pork was finally eaten, but not as much as it is today. I am sure cooking had something to do with pork being accepted. Which led to my next question: who invented cooking?

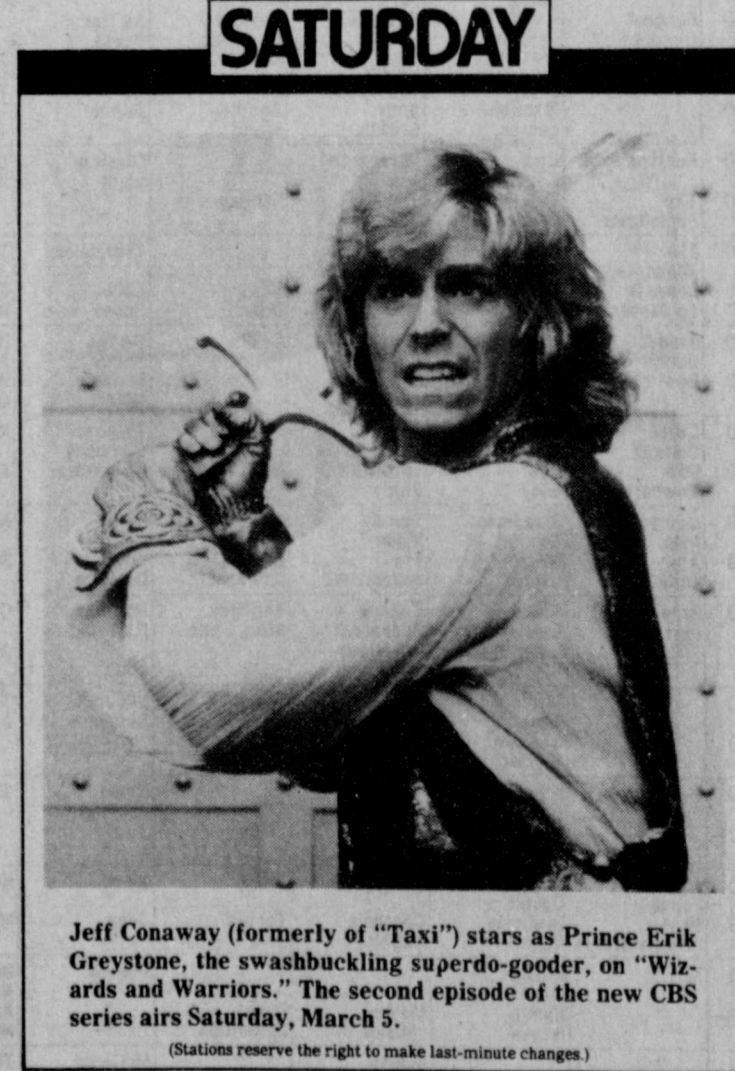

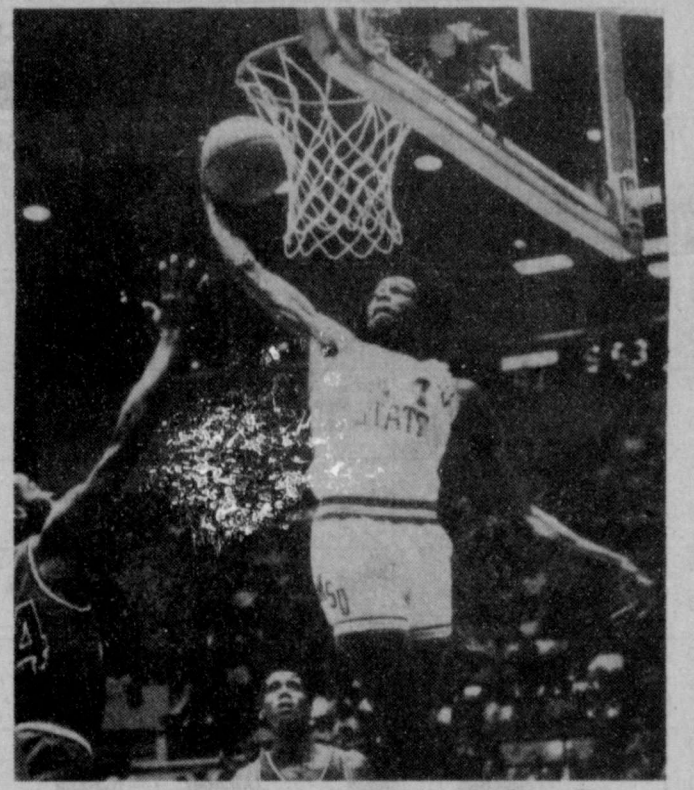

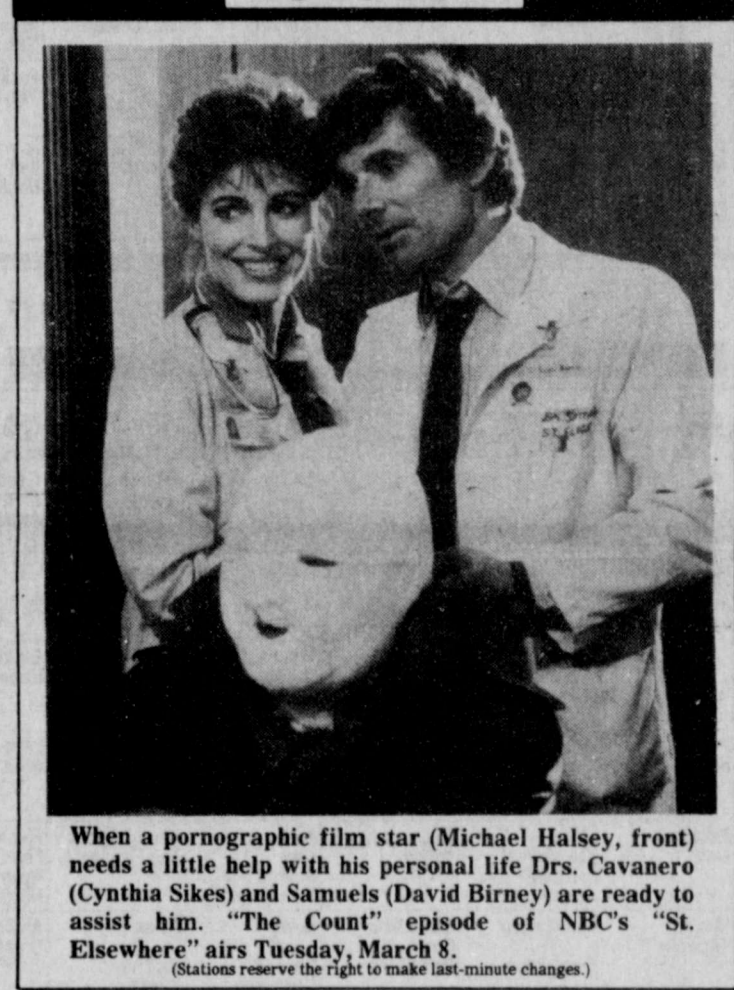
