

Cogdell Foundation makes generous gift

On Friday afternoon. September 30, 1983, Lockney General Hospital received a check for \$100,000.00 from the Martha Ann Cogdell Hospital Trust at the request of the Trust's Advisory Board President, Mr. D.M. Cogdell, Jr.

The Martha Ann Cogdell Hospital Trust was created by the wills of the late David M. and Johnnye Kate Cogdell in memory of their daughter. Martha Ann. who died at the age of 13. The Foundation has previously donated a total of \$200,000.00 to Lockney General Hospital. \$150,000.00 was donated in October. 1978, and \$50,000.00 was donated in April, 1981.

The \$150,000.00 donation was used for the purpose of constructing the new Cogdell Clinic which was completed in December of 1980. The \$50,000.00 donation was used for the construction of a new room of diagnostic radiology equipment and a new surgical table for the Operating Room, these being completed in November of 1982 and December of 1982, respectfully.

Cogdell Foundation donations, the hospital was not able to fund the needed equipment replacement, new equipment, and facility improvement requirements. The Lockney Community and enjoyed these benefits, had it not been the area around Lockney which the hospital serves can hardly be keenly enough aware of the important role that the Cogdell Foundation has played in the growth and success of Lockney General Hospital.

The use of the \$100,000.00 donated on September 30, is unrestricted. However, the Board of Directors of Lockney General Hospital District have assured the Cogdell Foundation that the hospital will exercise good stewardship of these funds for the benefit of the patients. More specifically, the Board of Directors has agreed that these funds will be used for improvement of patient care equipment and patient care facili-

The Board of Directors, the Medical Staff, the Staff and Management of the hospital would like to openly and formally express their appreciation to the Advisory Board Members of the Martha Ann Cogdell Hospital Trust. Plainview, died Tuesday afternoon in a tailwater pit near his home. Griffith was the brother of Lockney resident Harold Griffith and a second cousin to Nora Bybee. Services for Griffith were held Friday at the 11th and Amarillo streets Church of Christ and burial was in the Lockney Cemetery.

Griffith, born on December 1, 1919, in the Lone Star Community, moved to Plainview in 1945. He and his brothers and sisters were reared on land which his grandfather, J.D. Griffith settled when he came to the Lockney area in 1891

Griffith came to Lockney with his wife Sallie and their seven children by wagontrain from Eaton, Tennessee. They settled in what is now the Lone Star Community, 11 miles north and three miles east of Lockney. Upon arrival at the location chosen for their home, Sallie, an asthmatic, though that she would surely died in this land covered by tall waving grass. But that is where she was wrong. She rose from what was assumed to be her deathbed to regain her strength, raise her family, and live to the age of 85.

The Griffith family lived in a half dug-out, looked out for Indians and fought to establish a permanent home and develop a community that would attract more settler to the area.

Life in a half-dugout. Indian watches. struggles to establish a permanent foothold on the land and build a community to attract other settlers consumed the interests of this family. With a sod plow they broke out one hundred acres to grow feed for their cattle and build up a herd.

They freighted to obtain supplies; they hauled wood from the breaks and began with what tools they could obtain to develop the land.

Forest firest often raged, and the winters were often severe, with no protection for the cattle. There was open grazing but because of loco weed it was necessary to herd the stock away from the plant in 1891 loco was extremely bad.

As Griffith became more prosperous he filed claims on more land closer to the town of Lockney and later moved into town where he was very active in the development of the town.

In 1908 the First National Bank of Lockney was organized and Griffith served as one of the first directors of the bank. He also served as the president of the bank from 1911 to 1914. He owned several lots of land in what is now downtown Lockney.

In 1919 the Westside Church of Christ was organized. It later became the West College and 3rd Street Church of Christ. Griffith along with J.H. Nall, and C.W. Smith served as directors of the church upon its beginning.

Sallie Griffith died in 1933 and her husband followed in 1938. They were typical hardy pioneer stock who were

County Judge explains confusion

TO THE VOTERS OF FLOYD COUNTY:

On Tuesday, November 8th, you will have two ballots in Floyd County, to-wit:

(a) The ballot with the 11 proposed constitutional amendments, and (b) A SPECIAL BALLOT FOR FLOYD COUNTY, which will state "For" or "Against" THE ADDITION OF ASSESSOR-COLLECTOR OF TAXES

This special ballot is confusing, and this explanation is made to assist you. The Texas Constitution states, that when the population of a county is below 10,000 according to last census, that the Tax Assessor-Collector shall be the Sheriff of the county, unless an election is held and the voters elect to "add the office of Tax Assessor-Collector to the list of elective offices" Floyd County dropped below 10,000 population this last census for the first time since 1930. Therefore, the commissioners court is giving the voters the right to decide if the office of Tax Assessor-Collector will be filled by appointment made by the sheriff or will the office be filled by vote of the people.

A vote "for" adding tax assessor-collector, simply gives to the voters the right to decide who will hold this office, as an elected official, as it has been for the last 50 years.

A vote "against" adding tax assessor-collector, simply gives to the sheriff of Floyd County the right to appoint a person to fill this position.

A vote "for" adding tax assessor-collector, will not add any new employee and will not cost the taxpayers extra. The office of Floyd County Tax Assessor-Collector will continue regardless of how this vote may turn out. and the only issue here is shall the office be elective by the voters as in the past, or shall the sheriff appoint a person to fill this job.





Television is an amazing part of our culture. It eats up a goodly portion of time in many households, even in those where the folks say they don't watch it much. It has the power to entertain us, to turn us into zombies, to challenge our thinking, or perhaps to lull us into complacency.

I have been concerned about the effect of television for a long time. Unfortunately, like most other subjects. you can find nearly any position you want to take expressed by someone's research. TV does a great deal of harm; it does not do much harm. It is OK to let children watch some otherwise objectionable programs if their parents are watching with them and interacting; it is never acceptable for children to watch objectionable material on TV.

Public Opinion magazine did a survey of leaders in the media, and the results they came up with were not encouraging. Their survey showed a definite bias on the part of the media elite toward liberal politics, away from religion, and they they definitely felt TV should be used to bring about change in our attitudes

Since Public Opinion is a conservative publication, it did not take long for the howls to start. The basic argument was that old saw about TV producers only giving the public what it wants. They only report the news, not make it. Arguments like those sound good until you pay attention to the programming.

For instance, would James Watt still be secretary of the Interior if there had not been a story on how incredibly stupid he was every time we turned on the news, or picked up a newspaper? Just exactly whose were the cries demanding his resignation?

On one particular weeks worth of programs that I saw, I was amazed at the number of news analyses I saw on the homosexual phenomenon. By coincidence (?) that same week, several of the fiction pieces aired contained "gay" characters. The message in all of the programs was the same - homosexuality is OK. There was never a single negative word uttered on the subject.

The list could go on - the nuclear disarmament question, "Reaganomics" (even the President noted that term had declined in popularity since there seems to be a turn around in the economy), the validity of our presence in Lebanon, all sorts of things like these often get one-sided coverage on Television news, and dramas give us their views as well. Should a police officer appear nude in a men's magazine; is it alright to engage in sex with people you are not married with; the answers to those questions were answered in the affirmative in the same program.

Television may be the worst thing ever to happen to a civilized society. It could be just the opposite, but we must demand that it be responsive to us, not the other way around.

Rape Crisis Center

October 1 was the opening date for the new Hale County Rape Crisis Center in Plainview. Begun with a grant from S.P.A.G. coupled with community donations, services of the Rape Crisis Center are available free of charge to the residents of Hale County and the surrounding area.

Services include: a 24 hour crisis hotline, hospital accompaniment at Central Plains Emergency Room for rape examinations, follow-up counseling for victims and their families, referral and information, and group dis. 10-21 presentations on rape prevention and sexual assault.

Citizens from the Lockney area are asked to undergo crisis intervention training to aid the center in expanding services outside the Plainview area. 

Bake in a 350° oven for 30 to 35 minutes. Cool 10 minutes. Remove from pans; cool. Fill and frost top with Coconut-Pecan Frosting. Serves 12. **Coconut-Pecan Frosting**

1 egg

1 5¹/₃-ounce can (²/₃ cup) evaporated milk

²/₃ cup sugar 1/4 cup butter or margarine

Dash salt

11/3 cups flaked coconut

1/2 cup chopped pecans

In a saucepan beat egg slightly. Stir in milk, sugar, butter or margarine, and salt. Cook and stir over medium heat about 12 minutes or till thickened and bubbly. Stir in coconut and pecans. Cool thoroughly. Spread on cake. Frosts top of one 13x9-inch cake or tops of two 8 or 9-inch layers.

Add shortening, brown sugar, and buttermilk or sour milk. mixing till all the flour is moistened. Beat 2 minutes. Add eggs: beat 2 minutes more. Stir in nuts. Turn into pans. Bake in a 350° oven for 30 to 35 minutes. Cool 10 minutes on wire racks. Remove from pans: cool. Frost with Orange Butter frosting. Makes 12 servings.






