Peralez family thankful for their blessing, Jesse

With the Thanksgiving season upon us we are all thinking about our families and friends. We all have so much for which to be grateful. One Lockney family has an especially good reason for thanksgiving this year.

The Joe Peralez family, living on east Poplar in Lockney are all thankful this vear for their youngest son, Jesse, being alive and able to spend Thanksgiving at home with his whole family ths

On June 30, 1982 Joe and Tommy Peralez found out that their son, Jesse had leukemia, cancer of the blood. For about three years prior he had been treated for what appeared to be viruses. At the end of June, 1982, when he got sick again, Dr. Acar of Floydada examined Jesse and diagnosed it as cancer. Immediately Jesse was taken to Dallas and admitted to the Wadley Institute of Molecular Medicine. Upon arrival Jesse was examined by four doctors including his present physician Dr. Pordue. All four doctors concurred Jesse 24 hours to live. Seven days after being admitted, Jesse woke up hungry. Nurses and doctors alike were and still are amazed at the strength and determination of this 8 year old boy.

While at Dallas, the boy's father, Joe, a reformed alcoholic for the past nine year, wanted to know why this had to happen to them, why God wanted to take his baby from him? With the help of a pastor in Dallas the couple realized they had to accept what God had placed upon them. They said when they realized that Jesse was a gift from God and that God had "loaned" Jesse to them, they could not argue about when

God would take him back. Jesse improved and had to under go treatment including chemotherapy, bone marrow tests, and spinal taps to keep his condition regulated and to keep the doctors up-to-date on his progress. He staved in Dallas until December of 1982 but was home for Christmas.

He was unable to go to school for quite some time last year and in order to keep up with his school work he had two tutors, Barbara Carthel and Leslie Patterson. Even with all the school time he has missed Jesse had maintained good grades.

Jesse had been in remission for approximately 10 months, but last week during a routine physical Jesse's blood count revealed an increase in his platelet count. On Friday he returned to Dallas for more treatments. He and his mother were hoping to return that night

from Dallas. While there he underwent blood and bone marrow tests, a spinal tap and chemotherapy. It is not known at this time when he will be able to return to school after the backset.

Jesse is a very strong 8 year old. He full understands his illness and inquires about anything he does not understand. He even asks the doctors about his medications and what they will do and also about any reactions they may cause him. His mother said she and her husband have gained their strength and patience from Jesse. At first the tests upset Jesse and then one day he came home from church and told his mother he would not cry anymore when they do the painful bone marrow tests because he knew that Jesus was with him and that Jesus would always be with him. Jesse refers to his future destination as that "good ole home" with Jesus.

When the Peralez family first discovered their child was stricken, a Love Fund was started to help with the medical expenses the family would incur. Not only were they helped by these donations made by many, but Joe Ochoa of Plainview donated his services and the materials to add a room onto the Peralez home especially for Jesse. Another family friend donated a ceiling fan for the room. Jesse spends much of his time there watching TV and playing video games.

The doctors and nurses at Wadley refer to Jesse as a miracle child, because they never expected him to live. Jesse has made many friends at the hospital and prays for them nightly. In the last few months Jesse has lost nine of his friends, all about his own age. Jesse not only receives support from his family, but also his many friends. When he was in the hospital he received cards and letters from his friends here in town. One little girl even wanted to have the cancer for him. She sent him a letter with a piece of gum in it and asked him to chew it and send it back to her and she would chew it and then she would get leukemia and then he wouldn't have to be sick anymore.

The boy's mother said that the thing she is the most thankful for this year is that Jesse will be home and the entire family will be together and celebrate Thanksgiving together. She said "this will be the best Thanksgiving ever."

Fingerprinting session is planned for Lockneyites

According to the U.S. Department of Health and Human services, nearly 1.8 million children disappear every year. While the majority are runaways, over 100,000 are never found. More tragically, an average of 2,500 children are buried each year without ever being

On October 12, 1982 President Reagan signed into law the Missing Children Act which inspired many organizations to initiate fingerprinting programs. The National Crime Information Center (N.C.I.C.) missing person file has set criteria for missing persons to be entered into their computer file. The F.B.I. Identification Division (I.D.) receives the missiong person's fingerprint card, classifies and searches the deceased file, and if no identification is made, the card is classified M.P.

"Missing Person." The i.D. recommends that the child's parents or legal guardian retain a fingerprint card until such time as it may be needed for identification purposes. Then the card would be received by the law enforcement agency receiving the missing person report. That agency can make the appropriate entry into the N.C.I.C. Missing Person File, submit the fingerprint card to the I.D. with a summary of the incident and a current

description. Fingerprint programs demonstrate the desire of the law enforcement community to react to the specific needs of the public. Some segments of society look upon these programs as an encroachment upon one's privacy, citing the strong risk of potential misuse of the prints at some future time. For this reason, NCSC supports programs which allow the parents to keep the fingerprint

The knowledge that if and when the child is found, a positive identification is highly probably, is reassurance enough to justify participation in a fingerprint

We seldom, indeed never, see a TV reporter stand before the people and say "I am a left-wing liberal, and I am going to El Salvador to report to you on the troubles of that country from the point of view of a left wing liberal." Rather, they posture themselves as "objective reporters, seeking, ostensibly, only to ferit out and report the truth. The report we see however, in all too many cases, is the report of a left-wing liberal. giving us left wing views designed to influence the viewer along perfectly predictable lines.

Because we feel strongly about the views expressed above, we want to tell you what you can expect, and what you

We will attempt, in our news stories, to be honest and objective in the presentation of reports concerning events in our community. I have been around long enough to know that we will occasionally make mistakes, by acts of both omission and commission. But we will do the best we can to hold to that

We will attempt to be a constructive and cohesive force in the community. It will not be our purpose to exploit controversy merely for the sake of controversy, or for the purpose of gaining circulation. We will, of course, give our views from time to time on what we think is the best course of action for the community to take, but we will respect the views, and report the

views, of those who may differ with us. In terms of local elections, we will report fully on the issues and personalities involved, but we will not attempt to instruct the people of Floyd County whom they should vote for in this regard. Ma Bell to change billing Peralez...

Although the breakup of the Bell System isn't scheduled until January 1, Southwestern Bell in Texas is getting a head start by issuing a more detailed customer bill which reflects some of the coming changes.

Southwestern Bell is revising its bills before the scheduled breakup of AT&T to prepare for the way they will be going business after January 1.

The new statements will break out the components of phone service that will be provided by different companies next year, according to Jim West, Community Relations Manager for Southwestern Bell in Lockney. However, there will continue to be only one bill for services previously provided by the Bell System. Payment for all those services will be made to Southwestern Bell, West said.

"We are making changes now because we want to make a smooth transition and get customers used to the new bill format," West said.

Beginning with the November billing, he said, long distance charges for all Southwestern Bell customers will be split into two categories. One category will be for long distance charges from Southwestern Bell. The other category will be for long distance calls handled

After January 1, Southwestern Bell will continue to handle only those long distance calls made within specific geographic areas called Local Access and Transport Areas (LATAs). There are 15 LATAs in Texas.

Calls made within Texas from one LATA to another or calls to outside the state will not be handled by Southwestern Bell after January 1. These calls will be handled by a long distance company of the customer's choice. If the inter-LATA or interstate calls are handled by AT&T, the billing will be done by Southwestern Bell under contract with AT&T. These calls will be listed separately on customer statements.

The separate statements reflect the fact that beginning next year, AT&T's long distance network will be a separate company not affiliated with Southwestern Bell's local phone service. Previously, all long distance calls were billed

Lockney to receive money

White said.

Governor Mark White has announced the award of 117 grants to Texas communities for water, sewer and street improvements; construction of com munity recreation centers; repairs to low income housing; and other public works projects. These grants, totaling \$28.9 million will be administered by the Texas Department of Community Affairs (TDCA).

The City of Lockney is scheduled to receive \$145,000 of this grant money. The money will be used for the improvement of streets and drainage in the northeast section of town. Hearings on the application for this money were held in August and the application was filed in September.

Other grants to be received by towns in the area will be \$115,000 to Petersburg for street paving and water and sewer facilities ion a FmHA 515 project site; \$850,000 to Abernathy for water distribution and fire protection improvements, sewer taps, demolition, clearance, and code enforcement;\$ 105,000 to Crosbyton for street paving and drainage improvements; \$120,000 to Hale Center for water supply, storage and distribution improvements; and \$94,000 to Post for water and sewer distributions improvements.

"For the first time, the state has worked with the Texas Municipal League, Texas Association of Counties, our councils of government, and groups

like Valley Interfaith to devise a system of distributing block grant funds where the money is most needed," Governor

The Governor appointed 24 regional review boards to screen competing applications for Community Development Block Grant funds. These boards forwarded a list of funding priorities to a state review board composed of 12 elected officials appointed by the Governor. The TDCA will distribute the block grant funds based on the state review board's recommendations.

"Under this new statewide review process, the block grant program is more responsive to local needs than when it was previously administered by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development," Governor White

"More small communities in all parts of Texas are receiving block grant funds." he said.

Scheele named to sorghum board

In its regular bi-month meeting in Amarillo on November 9, Texas Grain Sorghum Producers Board installed four new directors. They will serve six-year terms on the board which administers the programs of the sorghum check off established in the Texas High Plains by a referendum of sorghum producers in 1969. Directors are elected by the producers who are affected by the sorghum check off.

New Directors are: George Reeves of Dalhart, Jack Cobb of Plains, Delbert Watson of Muleshoe and Weldon Shelton of Lamesa.

Following the installation of new directors, the board elected officers. Albert Scheele of Lockney is the board's new chairman. Scheele previously served as vice chairman. The new vice chairman is Jim Dowty of Dumas. Dennis Anthony of Friona was elected secretary-treasurer. These officers were elected to two year terms. Other members of the twelve-man board are: Jack Crowl of Morse, Bob Gillispie of Gruver, Loyall Turner of Spearman, Ralph Mabry of Lubbock and K.B. Parish of Springlake.

Texas Grain Sorghum Producers Board (TGSPB) conducts and directs grain sorghum promotion through market development, research and education. Its greatest efforts are directed toward establishing and improving markets for Texas sorghum. The work is financed by a refundable assessment of five cents (5 cents) per ton of sorghum deducted at the time of first sale.

Commodity checkoff programs are vital to establishing and maintaining world markets for U.S. feed grains. They provide funding for U.S. Feed Grains Council, a non-profit corporation which expands export markets for U.S. feed grains through a network of fourteen offices with programs in 50 countries of Latin America, Europe, the Middle East, Africa and Asia.

Council activities promote the sale of and demand for U.S. feed grains through technical information and assistance programs. Farmers in the United States depend upon the Council to promote the sale of corn and grain sorghum in world markets. This work is financed jointly by producers and agri-business with two-thirds of the funding from producers checkoff proTHE LOCKNEY BEACON

2 cups medium white sauce with 1/4 t. paprika and 1/4 t. white pepper " 1/2 cup soft bread crumbs

1 Tablespoon butter or margarine, melted

Cook cabbage, covered in a small amount of boiling salted water for 10 minutes or until tender crisp. Drain well.

Saute green pepper in 1 Tablespoon bacon drippings. Spoon 1/2 of cabbage into lightly greased shallow 21/2 quart casserole. 

There is nothing that shows more the rivalry between the Communist world and the Western democracies than the divided city of Berlin. The Communists built the Berlin Wall in 1961 to stop East Germans from fleeing to the West. German economists have reached the conclusion that East Germans are at least 20 years behind West Germans in economic development. Their standard of living is half that of West Berlin or West Germany. Even the air in East Berlin shows the difference. Most energy there comes from burning cheap, brown coal and there is a very acrid odor from it.

The Communist regime of Erich Honecker boasts of economic progress, but is silent about the massive financial aid it receives from West Germany. Bonn gives billions of marks to East Berlin to show hopefully that Germany, though divided, still is one nation. There is even a "Help East Berlin"

November 24, 1983 Page 5 campaign. West Berlin appears to be prosperous, but it too receives support from Bonn and West Germany. Although it does have its freedom, life in West Berlin holds little promise for German youths and many of them have moved to West Germany for jobs.

Although some of them say West Berlin "is a great place to get an education" but they do not get to use it especially in high technology. Bonn's financial aid promotes three symphoney orchestras and 12 theaters, and new hotels for conferences and conventions.

Bonn seems never to tire of its promotions in West Berlin and paying their bills. A good explanation of it all comes, not from a government official, but from a chauffeur who works in the Communist, surrounded city: "Everytime I visit my relatives in East Berlin, I' find out all over again why West Berlin has to survive, no matter what it costs. As long as we are here, they can still hope that someday they will be able to live the way we do and have the things


