
Games start at 4:00.

# **Our September Song...**

Editor's Note: The following is an account given by Faye Barker, in cooperation with Dottie Stansell, of the travels by Art and Faye Barker of Lockney and Dewitt and Roberta Seago of Arlington in the European countries during the month of September 1983. The Seagos are former residents of Lockney and Floydada. This is the second account of several that will be printed in the upcoming editions of the paper.

At day break on a beautiful morning we drove past the autoroute or freeway to the toll road out of Paris, past the large train station which housed the many trains that traveled 160 miles an hour. The area outside the S.E. side of Paris was rocky but covered with pine trees and is the hunting grounds of Fountainbleu for kings and royalty.

The Fountainbleu castle was nearby. We went by so many parfum factories, but found that the French parfumes not to be any cheaper there.

A sign which said "Restop" was a restaurant, rest stop - made over the toll road. It looked like three train cars as we passed under it. There were rows and rows of trees between the fields of mostly corn The corn is used in vegetable oil, the powdered corn as corn flour for thickening and the bulk fed to the cattle, so none of the product is wasted. Charlot cattle were grazing along the hillsides as this is a large breeding area for these cattle. The hills are steeper and more wooded as we pass 13th century fortified farms, French chateaux and castles on top on the hills. The driver of the bus played "The Sound of Music" as we approached the higher region. The vineyards are beautiful as we near the wealthy province of Burgundy which is rich in history, Art and tradition. Burgundy has more than 100 wells preserved chateaux, many still family-inhabited. The Burgundy canal is still used for transportation of barges. Dijon is the capital of the province of Burgundy as is famous for its wine as well as 40 different varieties of mustard. We passed by historic Beaune and across the La Saone River and tree lined canals through the village that used to be the capital for French watch making, but has since gone out of business

mainly because of the fine Swiss watches. The Peuget car factory has the Lion ensigne and the Peuget cars covered the whole area.

As we drive between two chains of mountains, we reach Switzerland, and stop for lunch and change our American dollars one more time into Swiss francs, and enjoy Swiss chocolates for which they are famous. The Swiss claim their chocolate is the world's best and we had plenty of opportunities of testing this in the countless candy shops.

Although German, French, Italian and Romansch (derived from Ancient Latin) are the main tongues, English is spoken and understood widely. The Swiss are very clean, prosperous and are expert in banking, insurance, pharmatical and chemical research, the watch industry and enjoy two seperate seasons of tourism. Although the Swiss are good fighters they have never been involved in a war. They have even been hired out to fight. Louis XVI of France was the last to hire them and one must see the famous Lion of Lucerne, carved in stone in the early 19th century and dedicated to the heroic Swiss Guards of Luis XVI, who defended the Tuileries, when the French Revolution, broke out in 1792. The Lion is in a niche hewn out of the cliffside near the celebrated Glacier Gardens, a unique collection of hugh pot holes created by glacier water during the Ice Age, but not unearthed until 1872. Hitler intended to invade Switzerland, but Mussolini discouraged him. They were equipped in the mountains to last for 7 years. It was the only country prepared for war, thus it was safe. Every road, bridge and tunnel was and is still ready to be blown up - they remain prepared for war. As we crossed over the border at Basel, we saw heavy industry but no pollution. They import some of their labor from Italy, Spain and Yugoslavia, so the employment is kept at 0.2%. The first encounter of the laborers with the police sends them home never to return. They have a strong military. Every man serves his country for a year, then he takes all his arms home with him for personal use and shooting practice. Shooting is a sport and every year these men are called back to prove they are in practice. It is the same in the Air Force.

All men can be in position within 24 hours. All men are kept in reserve. Even the lakes have protection. Switzerland has the lowest crime rate in the world. We drove through dozens of tunnels, some two miles long, all of which were equipped with discs of ammunition for protection.

We drove into the Zura mountains and the Swiss Alps, around Lake Sur, across the River Ruess, which flows out

of Lake Lucerne. Few cities are more

beloved by tourist then Lucerne, with its

15th and 16th century houses, its

medieval covered bridges, and its

dreamy old world atmosphere. It is so

quaint and full of flowers, winding

narrow streets and clean walking

# **Hospital board hears year** end financial report

The Board of Directors of Lockney General Hospital District held their regular monthly meeting on Thursday, January 19, 1984, at 2:30 p.m., in the hospital board room. Members in attendance were: Rusty Baccus, president; Kenneth Tate, vice president; Larry Golden, secretary; and Hubert Frizzell, member. Others present were Mr. Stan West, CPA, and Guy Hazlett, II, Administrator.

The meeting was called to order at 2:30 p.m. by the president of the board. The minutes of the previous meeting were unanimously approved as printed. Stan West, CPA, partner in the firm

of Mathis, West, Huffines, and Company presented a brief verbal overview of the 1982-83 fiscal year financial statement. The financial statement showed: total operating revenue of \$965,177, total operating expenses of \$1,212,286, total non-operating revenues of \$323,797, and a net revenue of \$76,688 for the year.

Guy Hazlett, II, administrator, presented a very brief review of the written monthly report for the hospital and its departments. Highlights from the report were: the sale of the health fitness center equipment to Wayland Baptist University for \$6,300, a change in strategies concerning the recruitment of a Canadian registered nurse due to unreasonable delays by U.S. Immigration and Naturalization, and progress report on each department.

The administrator briefly reviewed the December, 1983, financial/statistical report. The report showed: operating revenues of \$95,408.23, operating expenses of \$97,205.24, and an operating loss of \$1,797.01. The operating loss for the first three months of the fiscal year was \$25,577.28, compared with operating losses of \$42,157 in 1982, \$65,802 in 1981, and \$73,435 in 1980. The hospital had 282 actual patient days in December, an average of 9.1 patients per day.

There being no further business, the board of directors adjourned at 5:45 p.m.

The next meeting of the board is tentatively set for February 16.

a view from The Lamplighter **By Ken Towery** 

This will probably be a long column. The reasons are (1) It's terribly cold, and (2) I have a long, and at times, a tortured memory.

I get through winters fairly well, until we get the kind of weather we have been having lately. Then, invariably, my memory is jogged and I am taken back, for a time, to other times and other places where the weather was even rougher and the circumstances rougher still.

Following the fall of the Philippines in 1942 prisoners of war from throughout the islands were eventually gathered together in a camp near Cabanatuan in north-central Luzon, from whence small groups of us were sent thither and yon over the Orient. I was selected for a group that ultimately ended up in a place called Manchuria, a province in northern China bordering another place called Siberia. There the winters came early and stayed late, and when they were gone one knew he had been through some cold weather. Our normal day in winter was around 20 degrees below zero. Occasionally, of course, it got much colder. I remember we had one siege where the reading was 43 below zero for three days running.

I suppose that in itself would not have been so bad. But we had come straight from the topics, exhausted, beaten down, starved. We entered a prison camp where the ground was already frozen, to be greeted by a Japanese prison commander who informed us that he did not like white men, and that "as long as there is a white man in Asia

there will be no peace in Asia". He proceeded to complete the job of starvation that had started in Cabanatuan. And had not the Japanese Army, which had sent us there to work, seen that dead men do little work, I suppose he would have finished the process. Before they moved him out however, the winter was nearly over, and our ranks had dwindled. The ground was frozen so hard that no graves could be dug by those able-bodied enough to do such work. So the bodies were stacked like cord wood in a prison warehouse. When the Spring thaws began it was a race against time. The bodies were thawing faster than the ground that was to receive them. But the task was finally done, and on one cold day in the Spring of 1943 we buried 176 comrades from

I don't know what makes our memory work the way it does. Sometimes the sound of laughter, or the fragrance of a flower will take us back to other times and other places. A grandchild's embrace can transport us in an instant to a time when our children did the same. And memory has a way of doing away with rough edges and making bearable that which once seemed almost unbearable. All in all it is a good thing.

our little band.

Perhaps the secret of a happy life is to get involved only in those things that are apt to leave pleasant memories. But it seems to me we would miss a lot of what life is all about, whatever that is. At any rate, I still don't like cold weather, and I've changed my mind about writing a long column

The Lockney FFA and 4-H students are making preparations for the Lockney Stock Show to be held February 18. Students have been working hard for the past several months feeding and caring for their animals.

High school ag teacher, Mike Mowrey, reported, "the cold weather has had an adverse effect on the students' pigs in that the pigs have not been gaining weight like they should at this time.

Entries for the Lockney Stock Show are expected to number between 35 and 40 this year. Students will be required to have their animals for the show in the barn and weighed in by 6:00 p.m. Friday, February 17. Since the students will be out of school on that day, no problems are anticipated with this deadline. Judging of the show will begin at 10:00 a.m. on Saturday beginning with the junior showmanship of lambs.

Mowrey reported that the prices paid for this year's animals were down slightly overall from the past years' prices. Two lambs purchased were the animals that did not come from sales in the general Lockney area.

Judge for this year's Lockney show will be Paul Smith of Friona. Smith judged the show last year.

In judging of the lambs, Smith is expected to look for the same basic attributes as he did last year: the length of the loin from the last rib of the lamb, good muscled hind legs, and light shoulders. Weight limits for the lambs are a minimum of 80 pounds for Southdowns and a minimum of 90 pounds for the rest of the lamb breeds. There is no maximum weight for the lambs.

Judging of the steers will follow the same guidelines as the past two years.

After the Lockney Stock Show on Saturday, the students will move their animals to Floydada on Sunday for the County Show to be held February 20-22. The County Stock Show Banquet is scheduled for Thursday, February 23. The Lockney Silver Spurs Rodeo Club will have a concession stand at the Lockney show.

Five members of the Lockney FFA will be going to the El Paso Stock Show prior to the Lockney show. Those scheduled for the El Paso show are Earl Broseh, Heath and Wymon Retrode, Gary Bigham, and Tommy Floyd.

The Houston Stock Show will begin February 27. Lockney has 22 boys entered for that show. They include Earl Broseh, Ronnie Ford, Trent Gant, Randy Race, Billy Bob Sherman, and Glen Sutterfield who will all be showing lambs. Those showing pigs include Romeo Araujo, Clint Bigham, Gary Bigham, Troy Bigham, Terry Carlton, Russell Carthel, Jerald Johnson, Ricky Key, Carlos Molinar, David Martinez, Keith Owens, Heath Rexrode, Wyman Rexrode, Terry Taylor, Daron Widener, and Joe Widener.

Beginning this year at Houston, all pigs entered will be going to Brenham first to be sifted. Pigs making the sift will then go to the Houston Show.


Brown's art work has been shown in galleries from Indiana to South Texas and has spread over 38 states and 9 foreign countries.

The Reagan administration is moving towards closer relations with Israel, and the Israeli government welcomes the switch in U.S. policy. They have been perplexed for a long time by U.S. criticism, but now since President Reagan and Prime Minister Shamir met November 29, there are closer ties between the two countries. Two days later President Gemayel of Lebanon and President Reagan consulted each other. Quite a change has occurred since Israel invaded Lebanon. Such an invasion resulted in a deep freeze coolness from Washington. However, now is seen a new appreciation of Israel. It could be used as a base from which the U.S. could mount a defense of the Persian Gulf. A ranking U.S. expert said that in case war ever breaks out in the Mideast,

Israel could play a role comparable to that played by Britain for the U.S. in World War II.

Since Shamir has replaced Begin as Prime Minister last October, ther has been more of a pro-U.S. sentiment. Israel's high priority is increased American aid for their defense industry. Also they would like a more apparent American military backing such as joint military exercises and frequent visits to Israeli ports by American warships.

America is concerned over the impact such a close relationship might have on moderate Arab nations. They might remember that Egypt's Sadat, highly respected by Arab nations, made a peace pact with Begin. So that should speak well of Israel.



# PERSPECTIVES

Down in South Carolina some Anabaptists are preaching on the streets in and around the town of Swansea. Problem is that part of their preaching style includes telling folks that they are going to hell and the receivers of this tiding don't care for it a bit.

Legal action is pending in the incident, and that can only serve to make matters worse. The preachers were cited under a town law prohibiting their actions without a license. The church sued to prevent enforcement of the law.

Street preachers are not a new phenomenon. They have been around quite a while. One of the professors of the seminary I attended used to do that sort of thing at a bus station. It was a way of doing evangelism, not very effective, to be sure, but still one way of doing things. I might add that the

professors had permission to set up his P.A. and do the preaching.

People who have studied the matter for a long time have found that winning people to churches and the kingdom of God is done most effectively in the context of what they call "friendshipkinship" networks. That is, people are most likely to be influenced by people they have a relationship with, their friends and family.

The way the message is presented is important as well. Positive messages go over better than negative ones. Telling someone he is going to hell may scare him into a response, but is more likely to evoke anger, as in the case of Swansea's residents.

It is a shame that zeal should be misdirected. That little church's efforts at evangelism would be more effective if they would lighten up, or concentrate on developing relationships with their listeners before they laid out their concerns for eternal destiny. One can only hope that this incident will not cause a rift in the community of believers.







### In and around Lockney **By Felicia Applewhite**

The Indians say, "If you would know me, you must walk in my moccasins." According to Indian philosophy, if

you would know your Lockney schools, you must walk with the school administrator. The system is headed by a school

board. One administrator described the board as one that "looks ahead." Much of the change and upgrade begins with the board. More is planned for the future.

Superintendent W.H. Hallmark reports a stabilized school enrollment of 375 students. The enrollment change is controlled by the number of farm labor in the school area. Since recently farmers have let numbers of farm labor go, the school enrollment is down by so much. Then, too, migrant farm laborers have dropped down in number. Also regular farm labor is lowered now in number. The farms have dropped down to the employment of only one in many cases none. This makes a difference in school enrollment.

One change is being brought to schools through House Bill 246. This bill calls for reconstructing all curriculum. English, math and science are directly affected in the Bill.

Mr. Hallmark also, reports that the computer class has reached 37 in number in separate classes of adults. The maintenance and upgrading of

the school facility began before Hallmark took office, he says, but \$30,000 to \$70,000 every year is spent on some facility.

For the first time in several years, it is reported, school indebtedness will be clear this year. Lockney schools will be free of debt.

No one has had more interest in maintenance and upgrading schools than James Poole.

His latest visible change in High School is in the windows with corrugated metal for looks and for temperature control. This treatment of windows makes a difference of 6 degrees. Such treatment leaves the original space for windows to be used for bulletin boards.

Eventually, central heating will be the result of the window treatment.

An earlier improvement in the high school building concerns the front entrance. Any former student or teacher can not help but appreciate how hammer and paint produces an expression of school spirit in that entrance. A visitor, the principal from Post, could not believe "a building built as far back as '29 could look so good."

In this school, there are 19 teachers teaching grades 9 through 12. Curriculum and personnel changes are a part of the future.

As principal, Mr. Poole's door is open for students and faculty to come in when they want to talk. He says, "We like for people to visit - especially parents." It is understood in high school that "there is a thing" here about a student or teacher that would walk the hall with no smile.

There is no stated dress code in Lockney High, but there is an accepted appreciation of neatness — neatness is the word. As a result girls wear dresses more than in years.

"You look neat today," is a remark often used.

"Kids like to be noticed."

There are no major problems in school. Two-thirds of graduates attend college following graduation from high school.

Then there is Junior High with Raymond Lusk and ten teachers looking forward to some change in the re-constructing of the school curriculum even though the present schedule is adequate in many ways.

One example — a new dictate requires teaching of reading in Junior High, but they "already teach reading," so no change.

The new program demands two specifics. The first is the requirement of teacher lesson plans. The second is a requirement of teacher talks with persons appointed by state.

Junior High school set a school ideal of computer literacy before students graduate from Junior High.

Mrs. Lusk is doing special study now and is to teach computer science again in the school.

The lowest grade-level school, Elementary School, is where the introduction to the basic studies is begun. R.L. Knox is principal.

It is doubtful whether anyone knows more about the Lockney school system than Mr. Knox.

He graduated from Lockney High School and did his college work in West Texas University where he wrote his graduate thesis on the history of Floyd County schools.

Mr. Knox has been principal of elementary six years, principal of high school nine years, and principal of junior high three years. He taught in high school two years before becoming principal.

His thesis study goes back to early Floyd County schools including Lockney Christian College which taught from kindergarten through graduation. High School also taught from 12 through to Kindergarten. At times there was an exchange between the two schools.

People who have gone from Lockney through college are fitting into medicine, law, military, science and any number of fields. The list is too long to name.




