### New coach hired

The Lockney School Board met in an executive session Tuesday, April 24, for the purpose of interviewing prospective basketball coaches.

After interviewing three applicants the board voted to hire: Robert Redden who is presently the head basketball coach with the Munday I.S.D. The board had at least eight prospective coaches but only three were present for the interviews with the board.

Redden has had 12 years of coaching experience, the past seven years as head basketball coach in Munday and Crowell. In Crowell, under his coaching, the team came in no less than third place in district and during the 1980-81 season they were district and bi-district champs. In Munday again the team came in no less than third in district and in the 1981-82 season were the district champions. Redden comes to Lockney with a varsity coaching record of 92 wins and 43 losses.

Redden is a 1972 gradute of Austin Peav State University in Clarksville. Tennessee. Following his graduation he took his first job with the Panhandle I.S.D. While there he was in charge of the 7th and 9th grade football, basketball, and track. Redden remained in Panhandle until 1977 when he went to Shamrock for one year. At Shamrock he was the varsity football assistant coach, and also coached JV football, basket-

ball, and track and also was the head golf coach. In 1978, Redden went to Crowell. In 1979 he was named as the head basketball coach in 1979.


Redden will be head basketball coordinator at Lockney. He will be coaching both the girls and boys basketball. The board and head coach Bob Purser commented at the last board meeting that having a basketball coach for both the boys and girls would be an "asset" to the basketball program in the Lockney school system. Redden's main function will be the coaching of basketball. This will be the first time to act as a head girls coach.

Redden and his wife, Sharon, have two children: Scott, age 10, and Kimberly, age 7.

### School marker erected

Only a few bricks, some piles of rubble and many memories remain of Providence School. The 56-year-old building was recently razed after standing vacant since 1970.

Residents of Providence, mostly German-Americans of the Lutheran faith can still visualize themselves, their children, or grandchildren sitting at the school's old wooden desks and hearing the handbell that summoned pupils to their classes.

They also remember the after-school functions-the Halloween parties, Christmas programs, and spring activities. But most area school-aged children are now bused to schools in Lockney, 14 miles southeast of here.

The Providence Community in the northwest corner of Floyd County was named by W.J. (Uncle Jack) Lovvorn for his home town in Providence, Alabama, where he was born on August 19, 1854. He married Miss Crebella Cebell Alexander, who was born on September 18, 1867, in Providence, Alabama. They were married on July 5, 1883 and came to Floyd County in March, 1891, where years. they homesteaded on one section of

land in the northwest corner of Floyd County. They later turned it back and took four sections a few miles northeast.

The first Providence School was a wooden building with a bell tower, erected about 1910. Mrs. Ted Boedeker attended church services there before the present Trinity Lutheran Church building was constructed.

Ewald Quebe, who was a student in the small frame, two-room schoolhouse remembers that the first four grades were taught on the stage and instruction went through the ninth grade. "We got our drinking water from a windmill," he said. "Everbody dipped their cups in

The case has caused a good deal of renewed interest in the phenomenon of healing and in those who claim to practice it. The Lubbock newspaper is going to run a series on healing, and pastors are being asked what they thing about healing and "faith healers."

I tend to be very suspicious of people who claim the gift of healing. I believe that God can, and sometimes does, sponaneously heal people, and have heard numerous tales in corroboration of that beief. I even once sought prayers from other Christians for healing. Unfortunately, I stayed in the hospital for another week after they prayed for me. Since they believed I could be healed and I believed I could be healed, something must have gone amiss. The experience did not diminish my belief in God, His power, or the possibility of divine healing. It did, however, cause me to think seriously about healing.

I hope that something similiar will happen in the current case, that people will think seriously about who God is, what He does, and how phenomena like healing fit into the scheme. In the mean time, if you think you have been healed, it would not be a lapse of faith to get confirmation from a doctor. Doctors are God's instruments too.
