

### **Board hires three new teachers**

The Lockney School Board approved the hiring of three new teachers for the 1984-85 school year in the regular monthly meeting held last Thursday night.

New teachers hired include Linda Marr in third grade, Cindy Smith as a high school English teacher, and Charlotte Mitchell as a junior high math teacher. Adding another third grade teacher has been made necessary because of an increase in students coming to third grade from the second grade. Another English teacher in high school has been added to meet the new curriculum requirements. Charlotte Mitchell will be filling the position of Cindy Cotham. The board also accepted one resignation during the meeting.

The board also approved calling for bids on the lots across from the elementary school. However, the school will delay publishing the legal notice for bids for another several weeks, until the legal work on the lots can be finished by the attorney.

The board approved 17 transfer students for the 1984-85 school year. Fee for the transfer students if \$30 per month.

During the superintendent's report,

board members copies of the Caprock Coop policy manual, which has been updated to meet State, and Federal requirements for special education students. The manual outlined guidelines for placing students in special programs, evaluating each student, rights of students, promotion and retention of students, referral processes for students, and guidelines for materials used to teach these students. The board approved the new guidelines in a unanimous vote.

R.L. Knox, elementary principal, then presented results of the T.A.B.S. test for Lockney. (For complete details on the Lockney tests see related article next week.) Knox reported that all the scores were good and he said "I would put our scores up against any town's scores." He reported that he had been watching all the papers and that Lockney scores were as good or better than all of the published results he has seen.



# In times like these...

Jasi Napoleon Duarte proclaimed himself winner in Sunday, May 6th presidential election in San Salvador. Duarte, 58, is popular with U.S. congressmen but is hated by the land owing and big business factors in El Salvador. He pushed through limited land reforms and nationalized banks and big enterprises during the 16 months he headed a civilian-military junta in 1980-1981.

He is backed by a devoted following of small shopkeepers, peasants, and unionized workers. He argues that many rebels have grievances in what is an unjust society.

His opponent in the election is D'Aubuissan, a 40 year old former Army intelligence major. He insists that only all-out war can crush the Marxist insurgents. Surrounded by wealthy professionals and landholders, D'Au-



buisson capitalizes on the fear of Communism held by the elite.

Neither Duarte nor D'Aubuisson is popular with military leaders. The Army stopped Duarte from taking office after he won presidential elections in 1972. Ten years later the Army blocked the new Constituent Assembly from naming D'Aubuisson provisional president.



PERSPECTIVES By The Rev. Michael O'Connor

I have been thinking about suicide a lot lately. Not committing it, mind you, but about the amount of attention it seems to be receiving as of late. Not too long ago there were stories of an epidemic of suicides among younger teenagers, and just the other day I read the story of a boy who was supposed to go to Texas Tech on scholarship, but took his life instead. Even the most recent issue of a clergy journal I receive contains an article on suicide.

There was a time when suicide was considered by most folks as an automatic ticket to hell for the one committing suicide. Even the ancient Hebrews had a great distaste for suicide and felt that such an act condemned a person. Suicide has been, and may still be, illegal in some states. Prosecution, of course, was limited only to those who fail to accomplish the task.

A study I read once indicated that better than 90% of all Americans had comtemplated suicide at least once in their lives. The reasons for such a high percentage were not explained.

A lot has been said about the causes of suicide. Some feel that an unsuccessful attempt is a cry for help. Others say that warning signs precede an attempt, and that most suicides can be averted if we only knew the signs.

I am disturbed by the apparently high rate of suicide among our youth. What are the causes? I suppose a few could be

to succeed, the pressure to be popular, the pressure to act in a manner more befitting an adult life style are some of the pressures I have seen mentioned.

Kids should be given the opportunity to be kids, and they need to take those opportunities. Unfortunately, it seems that those opportunities do not exist in our world as much as they used to. Families break up, low incomes dictate an early entry into the labor force, the societal attitude as a whole is that success (read winning) is all that matters, and there is an increasing attitude which says people should be able to have the quality of life they desire or there is no real need to hang in there.

The solutions will not be simple. Some pressures can be reduced or eliminated, others simply tolerated. In that cases we need to learn the wisdom of that ancient prayer, "Lord grant me the courage to change the things I can, to accept the things I cannot change, and the wisdom to know the difference." But we must also work to change attitudes about what constitutes success and the quality of life. Until then, I pray that the epidemic will subside. Our future lies in those kids.



The Lockney City Council met in its regular monthly meeting Thursday morning, May 10.


Among the business conducted by the council was a proposal to support the increased state highway funding, passage of the pothole bill and increased highway user charges. The council passed a resolution to support all of these.
