

the Barbie doll is now not too sure he did children a favor by giving the doll the proportions he did. He feels there may be something to the theories that Barbie's looks may have caused inferiority feelings in teenage girls, and that in turn could have led to all sorts of ills, including the current problem of anorexia, girls starving themselves to be thin. Barbie is a classic by now. I am sure she will go down in history with the Teddy bear, Raggedy Ann, and a whole host of other famous dolls and toys. She has been a fixture in many a young girl's life, and will continue to be part of many more lives. But is she an evil influence?

My daughter was given a Barbie recently. I had originally thought that might not be such a good idea, but watching her play with the doll, dressing it, pretending all sorts of things with it, I can see a healthy imagination going to work, something I don't always see when other toys are played with. My anxiety about the doll centered around her looks. By allowing my child to play with such a doll, would I be condoning or pushing a poor concept of what women ought to look like?

To be sure, Barbie is a bit top heavy. If you proportion her measurements to a woman 5 ft. 6 in., the woman's chest would be some 14 inches larger than her waist. "Ideal" proportions would have the chest only ten inches larger than the do not a useful person make.

The man who designed the shape of waist. But the problem is not her chest size, it is the rest of her. Barbie is remarkably thin compared to the average woman. Her chest size is average for the size woman mentioned, but her hips and waist are ridiculously small. Barbie alone, however is not likely to

cause a great deal of trauma to a child. Dolls are dolls, and one of the features I noticed about dolls is that, unless they are patterned on real individuals, they really don't have much in common with humanity. My daughter's other dolls wouldn't measure out right proportionally either. Her baby dolls have heads that are too small compared to a real baby's, for example. No, I think dolls are useful for developing imagination and fantasy in a young child's mind.

Instead, the blame is going to have to be shifted to a wider group. It will have to be placed with advertisers who almost universally show us women who are thin, except when they are trying to make us thinner by selling diet food and aids. Blame will have to be placed on we men who are stupid enough to want the women we love to look like the fashion models and beauty queens, instead of appreciating the qualities in women that do not dim. And the blame will have to be placed on women who succumb to societal demands for thinness rather than health.

Barbie is here to stay. It is up to parents to teach their children that looks

TABS tests scores released **B** & **PW** elected officers

by local school officials

R.L. Knox released the Lockney T.A..B.S. scores to the Lockney school board and to the Lockney Beacon for publication during the May 10 meeting of the school board. These tests are given to students in grades, 3, 5, and 9 to assess the students' knowledge of the basic skills including math, reading, and writing.

The third grade scores proved to be excellent, well above the 85% mastery recommendation set by the state, in all three subjects. In math the students scored 100 percent on 6 of the 10 objectives on the test. They also scored 98 percent in 3 of the objectives and 95 percent on 1.

The third grade reading test was much the same with students showing 100 percent mastery of 6 objectives and 98 percent in 2 of the objectives. Of the 3rd graders handwriting test 98% were acceptable with only 2% being hard to read.

The writing test had 5 objectives and the students showed 100 percent in 4 of those and 98 percent in the remaining subject.

The test results from last year showed a total of 98.6% mastery in all three subjects and this year the students improved to 99.3% mastery of all three tests.

The fifth grade tests showed the students are grasping the main ideas in each subject with the only score under

The ninth grade tests were the only ones to show slight decreases in the results. The math tests had results ranging from 95% mastery down to 27% which involved problems solving personal finance situations. Posing some handicap for the ninth graders were the use of decimals, fractions, measurement units, and ratios.

The ninth grade did not meet the 85% mastery recommendation set in reading. The scores ranged from 84% in three objectives to 59% in the area of distinguishing fact from non-fact.

Ninth graders mastered 2 of the 6 objectives in writing. The four not mastered included: spelling at 82%, commonly used forms at 67%, punctuation at 58%, and 56% in the correct use of English.

Members of the school board and the principals of the junior high and high school sited part of the reason for the decreases in ninth grade scores could be that "these students have entered their first year of high school and do not spend as much time on studies as they should."

The ninth grade students not mastering any part of the tests this year will be retested next year. When necessary it will be repeated each successive year until they have mastered each part of the test.

As in past years, the teachers will be given copies of the T.A.B.S. tests and





In times like these...

Politically and economically the Philippines is facing the worst crisis in 38 years of independence. President Ferdinand Marcos has headed the island nation for 19 years as President and dictator and is expecting to retain his powers until the end of his term in 1987.

Political tensions have risen since last August when the popular opposition politician Benigno Agrina was assassinated. He was at the Manila airport only minutes after returning from self imposed exile in the United States. Marcos claims that the murder was hired by Communists. Critics charge that the evidence shows that Aquina was shot by military guards escorting him from the airplane-most likely on orders from the administration or the armed forces. President Reagan had to cancel a state visit to the Philippines in November due to the anti-Marcos demonstrations. The Philippines is home to two large

U.S. military bases-the Clark Air Base and the Subic Bay Nval Base. The U.S. held the Philippines for a half century until 1946. Now they are wary of interfiring in the island nation's affairs for fear they might jeopardized the use of the two bases.

The bases are so important to the U.S. that the Reagan administration agreed to nearly double the "rent" paid Manila in military and economic aid for their use to 900 million dollars over five vears.

Clark Air Base and Subic Bay Naval Base are vital to America's position, military power, and future planning in the Pacific and Indian oceans
