\$21 million construction

project slated

Construction of a \$21 million power line from Abernathy, Texas, to a site near Vernon, Texas, is planned for this fall, officials of Southwestern Public Service Company (SPS) said this week.

The line will allow SPS to exchange power with Public Service Company of Oklahoma (PSO) and other utilities in the eastern electrical grid.

"The line will follow an easterly route from SPS facilities near Abernathy to Oklaunion Power Station," said W.T. Seitz, SPS vice president of engineering and operation. "Connecting the two utilities in this way will enhance the service reliability of both."

Oklaunion Power Station is a coalfired power plant currently under construction near Vernon. The plant is owned by West Texas Utilities Company (WTU) and PSO. Oklaunion Station is also the site of a proposed direct-current intertie between WTU and PSO.

"Southwestern Public Service Company's 345-ky power line will be 162 miles long. It will be supported by 100-foot tubular steel. H-frame structures," Seitz said.

SPS will purchase all construction materials, as well as provide engineering supervision, for the project.

Southwestern Public Service Company primarily provides electric utility service to a population of more than one million in a 70,000-square-mile area of the Panhandle and South Plains of Texas, eastern and southwestern New Mexico, the Panhandle of Oklahoma, and southwestern Kansas.


Safety cautions motorists



There has been mining of Nicaragua's three major ports. Americanfinanced guerrillas backed by the Central Intelligence Agency have a delicate objection, and that is to disrupt commercial shipping without sinking large vessels or costing lives.

Commandos operated at night in small speedboats and laid hundreds if miner in the harbors at El Bluff on Nicaragua's Caribbean coast and Puerto Sandino and Corinto on the Pacific. The charges planted are described as acoustic mines tethered to the ocean floor and detonated by the sound waves of passing ships.

The CIA sponsored venture has been aimed largely at driving up insurance rates of international shippers, which would discourage trade with Nicaragua. In the bay at Corinto, which handles three quarters of Nicaragua's international trade, explosives rocked at least two cargo ships - a British freighter landed with Nicaraguan molasses and a Japanese ship preparing to load cotton bales bound for Tokyo's textile mills.

There is concern among some that the missing could cause a large loss of life or spark a confrontation between Washington and Moscow. However, American intelligence officials believe this is unlikely because of the limited explosive power of the mines. Acoustic mines can be tuned to explode while a ship is still some distance away, thus minimizing the damage.

Even if the mining operating is abandoned, there will be-harassment attacks against cargo ships by guerrillas in high powered boats armed with machine guns and rockets supplied by the CIA.





Of course I have read the stories about the recent burglaries, and I have had people in my congregation who have been broken into, but it still does not come home to you that you are a potential victim until it actually happens.

Let me hasten to add that while I was upset at having personal property taken from me, I am probably as much at fault as the character who took the stuff. I violated every principle of protecting one's property, and I did so because we live in a small town. I don't expect things like that to happen to me. So, I guess I had it coming to me.

The real problem I had with the whole experience is an attitude I have expressed publically which says that all my possesions really belong to God. The implications of such an attitude are that having someone take your stuff is not the end of the world. People have often followed to begin with. After all, I don't questioned me as to how far I was want to cause anyone else to be tempted willing to take that attitude. Do I not and thus to fall.

take normal precautions? What about having someone come and either ask for, or just take all my stuff?

Now I have experienced reality. How do I feel about it? First of all, what has taken did not amount to the values of anything I have read about being taken in this town, so from that perspective, I think I'm fortunate. Secondly, the theft amounts to an inconvenience more than anything else, even in the financial sphere, and I can handle an inconvenience. Thirdly, what really upset me was that most of what had been taken was given to me, the only real meaning I could attach to the loss. But even at that I found it curiously easy to get over the upset, forgive the unknown thief, and get on with it. After all, I do bear some responsibility for the loss.

I don't understand that kind of mentality any more. Once I might have, but now I do not. Why people do such things is beyond me, but I do know that when I replace the missing items, I think I'll follow a few more of the precautions I knew I should have
