

President, Reeda Cay Smith, said the main objective of the PTA is "to be more informed about our children's education. We want to help the administration and the teachers in any way we can to help keep the public informed about public education and how it effects our children."

Lockney Gin Company purchased by Mullins

School board calls for bids

The Lockney Independent School District approved calling for bids on the purchase of a new school tractor. The board has decided on a three cylinder costing \$65.00 per machine plus repairs diesel 16 horsepower tractor with a and mileage It is getting quite expenmower attachment. Complete specifications can be found in the classified section of this paper.

The board also called for bids to sell two old buses owned by the school system. The buses include a 66 passenger 1966 model International, on which the board set a minimum bid of \$1500.00. The other bus, a 1964, 72 passenger, International, is inoperable. The board set a minimum bid of \$1000.00. After the school obtains required permission from the State, a notice to bidders will be published.

A new bus, delivered this year, is presently in Plainview having a new motor installed. While enroute two weeks ago, it experienced a broken valve, a broken piston, and a ruptured head, because of no fault of the bus driver. The new motor will be installed at no cost to the school as it was still in warranty, and the bus will be back in

use soon. In other action taken the board approved the addition of a rider to the present insurance policy that covers the boilers and other equipment to include air conditioner compressors and equipment. The rider will cost \$1096.00 per year; this action came after one of the compressors broke down recently and had to be replaced.

Superintendent W.H. Hallmark discussed enrollment figures with the board members. At this time last year there were 715 students enrolled in the school system with 355 in elementary, 167 in junior high and 193 in high school. Presently there are 729 students enrolled with 369 in elementary, 145 junior high, and 215 in high school.

Hallmark also discussed the condition of the copy machines used by the three different school buildings. Between the three schools a total of 35,000 or more copies are made per month with the

repairman being called to the school at least once a month for repairs on one or more of the machines. "The service are sive for the school system," Hallmark said. The board granted his request to check into cost replacement.

Hallmark informed the board that a new PTA (Parent Teacher Association) had been started in Lockney (see related article) and that the students had started the Fellowship of Christian Athletes in Lockney again. The FCA is affiliated with the National organization this time. The FCA members are presently meeting in the homes of the students, but the First United Methodist Church has offered a room for their

D'Lyn Morgan came before the board to request their support in an exchange program. Morgan has applied with the teacher exchange program to exchange with a teacher in England. If accepted, she would teach in England for one year with a teacher from there taking her place here.

Morgan commented that she felt "changing places and teaching in another country would make me a better teacher. Much of our history and English (her majors) got their roots in England. This would give me the chance to further my knowledge and education as well as giving the kids here a chance to be exposed to a teacher from another culture.'

The board asked Morgan to furnish them with more information on the project and the names of other schools who have participated in the program before they reach a final decision.

About two weeks ago Lester Carter sold the Lockney Gin Company to Bobby Mullins of Sinton, Texas.

Mullins and son Larry have 13 years of ginning experience, and operated a gin in Taft, Texas. Bobby will continue to run the Taft Gin while Larry supervises business at the

Larry says they "bought the gin because it came up for sale and is a good facility with a nice plant and good equipment." Thus far they have ginned 127 bales at the gin this year.'

Of the customers and the people of Lockney he has met, Larry said, "I really like them. There are some really good people here, and I am really enjoying getting to know them. Lester's past customers seem to be very receptive, and we are getting along fine." Larry also said one of the main reasons they decided to purchase the gin came after meeting and getting to know Carter and his wife. "They are good

Larry stated, "Carter will continue to work at the gin as an overseer, and the gin will continue to be run the same way Lester has done in the past."

Larry is presently living in Plainview but will move to Lockney as soon as he can find a house. He joined the Lockney First Baptist Church this past weekend.

The Lockney Gin is one of the oldest operating businesses in Lockney, having opened in 1924. J.W. Baggett (Carter's grandfather), George Meriwether, and a Mr. Moody built the gin. In 1925 Moody was bought out by Ed Whitfill, who in turn sold out to Baggett in 1942. In 1945 when the gin was passed to Carter's mother, he began managing the gin and has continued to do so up until the sale.

Carter was working on his 45th year to operate the gin, but he chose to sell and continue to work for the gin.

In the history of the Lockney Gin there has only been one major fire, which occured either the first or second year of the gin's operation. Since that time there has been no major fire, according to Carter, due mostly to Carter's policy of keeping the gin clean.

Carter said, "I would like to thank everyone for their support these past 44 years, and I encourage everyone to continue to support the new owners with your business."



Horns breathe fire on Dragons

Last Friday evening the Lockney Longhorns hosted the Paducah Dragons and came away with their second district win. Final score of the game was Horns 54, Paducah 7. Lockney's record for the year is now five wins, one loss, and one tie.

Lockney began its journey to a victory in the first quarter of the game. With 7:30 left in the first quarter and on a 4th and 2 play, quarterback Brent Hallmark hauled off to Buffo Rodriguez who carried the ball 31 yards to score. Danny Peralez made the extra point and Lockney had a lead they would not lose.

Lockney's next two TD's came in the second quarter. The first came with 7:45 left in the quarter when on a first and ten play on the Paducah 12, quarterback Hallmark again to Buffo Rodriguez, who scored six points on the 12 yard run. The extra point failed. The second touchdown came with 3:25 left in the half. On a second and 24 yard play Hallmark went into the passing formation and hit Gary Kent who scored. A two point conversion came as Hallmark took the option and ran the ball for two

The Horns came back after the half and continued to run up the score. With 5:21 left in the third quarter. Hallmark handed off to Jerry Mathis who ran 23 yards for Lockney's fourth touchdown of the night. Tony Banda, replacing Danny Peralez, who had a twisted ankle in the second quarter, booted the extra point. Lockney scored again with 3:03 left in third period of play. Leading up to this TD, Lockney had the ball on the Paducah 33 yard line on a third and fifteen play after receiving a penalty. Hallmark took the snap reared back and hit Terry Mathis for a 43 yard pass. Three plays later Lockney was on the one yard line and Hallmark handed off to Dickie Hernandez who scored the touchdown. Tony Banda made the extra

In the fourth quarter Lockney scored three more times. With 10:43 left in the final period of play Dickie Hernandez rushed 10 yards for a touchdown. Tony

Banda made another 6 points on a two yard run with 7:41 left in the game and with 2:40 left. Steven Cates at quarterback hit Ritchie Thornton on a 34 yard pass that netted Lockney another six points. Tony Banda made two of the three extra points.

Paducah's only score came wit 6:48 left in the first half of the game.

Coach Bob Purser said "The boys played a hard game." Of Paducah coach Purser commented "They play better than they had been. We just wore them


On the Crosbyton game this week Purser said "They have an outstanding


