ney area gins had produced 55 s.166
ginned bales of cotoon. This count
includes Lockney Coop and South
Plains, Evans, D and J, Lockney Gin,
Sterley Gin, Crume, Barwise, and
Marble Brothers gins.
This year's harvesting has been
slowed down considerably by the wet
weather which has plagued the area.
The last of these wet spells hit the
Leckney area on Thursday of last week.
On Friday the wet weather continued
with rreezing rain having fallen Thurs-
day night. This will put off harvesting
the reamaining cotton for a minimum of
two weeks.
In 1983 this paper surveyed area gins. In December, 1983, a total bale count of
21,609 was reparted. This count was made with an estimated two thirds of the cotton stripped. The total bale count
for 1983 was only 32,839 . The 1984
cotton crop has already exceeded this amount with approximately one quarter
of the cotton left to be harvested ginned.
The main problem facing farmers
now is that the cotton market is slow now is that the cotton market is slow
and prices are down from last year. In 1983 prices ranged from 62 to 65 cents. This year the price is around 50 cents per pound. In past years many farmers
paid for their ginning costs with the paid for their ginning costs with the
money raised from selling the cotton seed, but this year seed prices are alton
depressed.

The grades and staples on the 1984
cotton crop are good, but the micronaire is bad on much of the cotton and the ba
mic makes the cotton hard to sell. mic makes the cotton hard to sell.
