## 76,000 bales ginned

 in Lockney area
## through ginning this year's corton crop the bale count for this half of the county

 the bale count for this half of the countyhas reached 76,244 bales. Included in this count are Lockney Coop, South
Plains, Sterley, Lockney Gin, D\&J Gin, Evans, Barwise, Cru
and Providence gins
and Providence gins.
This count has already surpassed last year's total by more than half as last
year's total bale count reached only year's total bale count reached only
32,839 . Even though farmers have produced more octogn than last year,
his year's prices are considerably lower this year's prices are eonsiderabty lower
than they were last year and the farmers than they were last year and the farmers
are experiencing some difficulty in are experiencing
selling their crops.
selling their crops.
The 1983 coton prices ranged from
about 62 to 65 cents per pound. In December of 1984 this paper reported that prices were around 50 cents per pound, and they have dropped again to
around 43 to 44 cents per pound. around 43 to 44 cents per pound.
This year's cotton crop held great This year's cotton crop held great
promise for farmers until they tried to
sell it. With prices so low, many area sell it. With prices so low, many area
farmers could have problems with just paying their expenses that went into The weather, for the most part,
cooperated with farmers during the rowing season in that much of the rain came when needed and the cotton crop couple of years. When farmers began to harvest their crops, the wet, freezing
moisture came. Many farmers were weeks at one time, waiting for the
ground and cotton to dry enough to ground and cotton to dry enough to
harvest it. When the cotton harvest
