 Scientists have long thought that acidrain is linked to sulfur dioxide and nitrogen-oxide e emissions, especially
from distant coal-burring from distant coal-burning power plants.
Those discharges are chemically transThose discharges are chemically trans-
formed at high altitudes and swept
eastward by winds, and then fall back to eastward by winds, and then fall back to
earth hundreds of miles away as acidic rain, snow, fog and dust. The
transformations are suspected of stun ing tree growth and killing lakes. In the search for answers, scientists
are examining clouds at a 4,800 -foot are examining clouds at a 4,800 -foot
mountain summit and analyzing fish, mountain summit and analyzing fish,
water and soil samples from 1,200 lakes spread over 6.5 million scenic acres in
upstate New York. Some of the remote lakes are accessible only by helicopters
or sure-footed llamas. The summit of Whiteface Mountain,
4,867 feet above Lake Placid, is con4,867 feet above Lake Placid, is con-
sidered one of the best places in the world to study cloud chemistry. At the
larger base stations 1,500 feet below the balsam fir, and other soft-pine species
has fallen off by 40 percent in the last 20 has fallen off by 40 percent- in the last 20
years. On Whiteace Mountain a 3,800
feet the balsam trees are still feet the balsam trees are still growing
but with sparse midsections oitted with
bare branches and brown instead of green ones.
Just as extensive is the search for
answers about acid rain's aust as extensive is the search for
