# Lockney General Hospital opens new health agency for homebound patients

Services at Lockney General Hospital have been expanded through the opening on February 4, 1985, of the Lockney General Hospital Home Health Agency.

The agency is directed by Janice Hatcliff, R.N., whose office is in Lockney General Hospital. The agency utilizes hospital referrals from physicians in Lockney and neighboring towns, and provides services in a multi-county area, including Floyd, Motley, Briscoe, Hale, Hall and Swisher counties. The agency is licensed by the Texas Department of Health.

Lockney General Hospital Home Health Agency is a non-profit organization governed by the hospital's board of directors. The program is under the supervision of hospital administrator, Terry Keltz. The agency is guided by a professional advisory committee made up of physicians and registered nurses who advise on medical and nursing policies. This system will assist the

agency to maintain maximum standards of service.

With orders from a patient's attending physician, the agency will provide health care to homebound patients. Services are available 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Payment for the agency's services are made through the following sources with approval: medicare, medicaid, private insurance and private pay. Some other sources may also be available.

Services are available on a per-visit basis and only by physician's orders. Visits from the staff are available on a scheduled basis as well as for emergencies. Examples of service include catheterizations, cardiac management and instructions, diabetes management and instructions, teaching and training selfcare, rehabilitation, intravenouses, injections, medication evaluation, drawing blood for laboratory tests, monitoring blood pressure and vital signs, nutritional guidance, feeding tubes, inhalation treatments and instructions, enemas, bed baths and other personal care. Also, home health aides are available to assist in providing personal and environmental care.

When ordered by a physician, physical therapy will be provided by a registered physical therapist. Physical therapy will be given by or under the supervision of the registered physical therapist, who may be assisted when needed by a registered nurse, licensed vocational nurse or home health aide.

Clients with special problems such as speech, hearing or handicaps may be serviced by the agency when possible, or proper referral to other resources will be made.

Sometimes supplies, such as linen savers, sterile dressings, syringes, needles and enema supplies, are furnished. If needed, clients will be assisted to make arrangements for other needed equipment and/or supplies from the dealer of their choice. When physicians order items such as hospital beds, wheelchairs, walkers, canes, crutches, bedpans and urinals, trapeze bars and many other items, these may be made available to the homebound patient.

Agency director Hatcliff emphasizes that all clients are treated without regard to race, color, creed, sex, national origin or handicap. The requirements for admission are the same for all. There will be no distinction made in eligibility or services provided to patients.

Furthermore, Hatcliff says, "When services are rendered in a patient's home, we at Lockney General Hospital Home Health Agency realize that we have been invited into one's life in a very personal way. It is the policy of Lockney General Home Health Agency to show respect, to allow the patient his/her rights to dignity, and to keep all matters confidential.'

# In times like these... By Mary Jo Fielding

President Hosni Mubarak is Egypt's cautious man with a mission. He is as solid as the Sphinx and is a chunky man who runs Egypt with the same methodical way he once used as a pilot of Soviet-made jets. On his visit to Washington March 9-13 the Egyptian hoped to persuade President Reagan to receive a delegation of Jordanians and Palestinians as a prelude to joint peace talks with Israel.

Mubarak is brisk in manner and well-read. He caught Sadat's eye in the early 1970s. The Moscow-trained Air Force officer master-minded the surprise air attack on Israeli troops in the Sinai. That sparked the 1973 Arab-Israeli war. Within two years Sadat had named Mubarak as Vice President. Mubarak was so loyal to his chief that some called him "Sadat's Sadat."

Mabarak was at Sudat's side on the receiving stand that bloody day in 1981 when Moslem fundamentalists gunned down the Egyptian President. Mubarak's steadiness healed the trauma of Sadat's assassination and may now lay the foundation for restoring Egypt's international prestige.



# Are drugs a problem in county?

This guest editorial was written by a mother and civic servant to the community in many capacities for the benefit of our readers who are concerned with the welfare of our community.

Drug abuse is a problem in Floyd County, among adults and teenagers and even down into the elementary school. All parts of the country are dealing with this problem, and parent groups in various places have discovered guidelines that can help the parents of Floyd County to both detect and prevent drug and alcohol abuse.

A group called Parents Who Care in Palo Alto, California, gives the following suggestions about preventing drug and alcohol abuse:

1. Teenagers should be required to stay home on school nights except for school or community events. (No running the streets or driving around aimlessly.)

2. Weekend curfews should be determined, preferably by several parents working together. Suggested curfews are: 11 p.m. for 9th graders; 11:30 p.m. for 10th graders; 12 midnight for 11th graders; between midnight and 1 a.m. for 12th graders

3. Contact parents who are hosting parties to find out if there will be adult supervision and whether drugs and

alcohol will be permitted.

4. Parents who host a party should be visible and feel free to ask anyone using drugs or alcohol to leave.

5. Parents should get to know their children's friends and parents.

6. When your child is to spend the night away from home, contact the parents or adults in charge to make sure that there will be adult supervision.

It may be difficult to face the fact that your child may be experimenting with drugs, and it is not always easy to get real evidence, but Parents for Drug-Free Youth suggest that parents look twice anytime that they see the follow-

1. Sudden changes in behavior, such as coming in late, avoiding family gatherings, or extreme hostility;

2. Secrecy, and more time spent alone in their room;

3. A drop in school performance, an increase in lateness or abseenteeism, a loss in interest in sports or extra-curricular activities;

4. A change in friends, especially association with known drug users;

5. An increase in requests for money, unexplained disappearance of valuables, suspicion of shoplifting or theft;

6. Disappearance of pills or liquor from your cabinets; 7. Repeated lying.

Many teenagers exhibit some of these characteristics on occasion, so the thing to look for is a change in behavior.

What do you do if you suspect that your child is abusing drugs?

1. If you are very sure, snoop. This is the one case where you are justified in violating your child's privacy in order to protect him or her from serious harm.

2. Take a firm stand against drug and alcohol abuse, but try to stay as calm as possible.

3. Educate yourself about the harmful effects of drug abuse and present the facts to your child.

4. There are medical tests that can usually determine if your child is using drugs, especially marijuana.


5. Realize that you cannot reason with your child unless he or she is drug-free! It takes a marijuana user a minimum of 3 weeks to become drug-free.

6. If you need advice, call 1-800-554-KIDS. (Parents for Drug-Free Youth).





Margie Torrez 5th in spelling and Cindy Castro first place in shorthand.



Danny's three best lifts included squat, 400 pounds; bench press, 300 pounds; and deadlift, 510 pounds.


Allen Stallings placed 4th in the 114.5 class of 10 lifters and was only 30 pounds away from the third place qualifying weight.


