## The Lamplighter V Lusk resigns junior high principal's position By Ken Towers

It now appears that Texas farmers and ranchers, hard pressed as they are, will have to get along without the marketing expertise of Ms. Susan deMarco of New Jersey.

According to press reports out of Austin, State Agriculture Commissioner Jim Hightower has entered into a "gentleman's agreement" with Rep. Robert Saunders, head of the House Agriculture Committee, wherein he will replace Ms. deMarco as head of the Department's Marketing Division, in return for approval of his request for funds for a few pet projects involving the environment, research, marketing and policy. She is the lady, our readers will recall, whose presence as head of Hightower's marketing division caused an uproar sometime ago when it became known that she was the Commissioner's live-in girl friend, being paid \$1 per year for her services (to the state). Spokesmen, or rather spokespersons, for the feminist movement complained that she should be paid a full salary of \$49,000 per year. There were others, of course, who thought she was being overpaid at \$1 per year, given her credentials.

Mr. Hightower, at the time, indicated he would make no change in the situation. But now, faced with a loss of money for his department, he has evidently had second thoughts. Seeking to explain why he leaned on Hightower over the deMarco matter, Saunders was quoted as saying "We have been hearing complaints that his, uh, very close friend, Ms. deMarco was part of the department and was making a lot of decisions the commissioner should

So she will leave, but very few doubt that her influence will continue to be felt in the way Hightower runs his office.

Hightower loves to portray the image of "pore boy" country. But his life style seems not to match his carefully cultivated public image. His department now boasts a new \$475,000 airplane, and his record of out-of-state travel rivals that of our Governor. In only two years he has made 11 trips out of state, including trips to Israel and France. Taxpayers have picked up the tab for \$4,565 in commercial airline travel, plus \$2000 in expenses, in addition to paying for the new plane. All in all, not bad for a pore boy trying to get along in the world.

And we almost forgot. One of those trips was a three night stand up in Boston for a "food show." Ms. deMarco went along. Her trip cost was \$736, which was a small part of the \$2,825 she has collected in "expenses" since she has been with us.

Board members canvassed the April 6 election results. Board president Eddie Foster administered the oath of office to Eddie Teeter and Jim Bob Martin who were reelected to the board. Teeter is beginning his third term in office, and Martin will be serving his second term on the board.

## Problem solving team to compete

For the third year in a row Lockney will be represented by a team of students competing in the Texas Future Problem Solving Bowl in Austin.

Margie Torrez, Erik Anderson, Jeffrey Sutterfield, and Ronnie Whittington will be accompanied to the meet in Austin by their coach, Carolyn Whittington. The meet will be held on May 3 and the awards to the winning teams will be presented on May 5 on the University of Texas campus in the LBJ

Auditorium. The Lockney team was chosen from a field of 1800 teams. The teams submit a possible solution to a problem and are judged on this solution; the top 30 teams are selected to participate in the State Meet.

This year students will be considering the Greenhouse Effect and its implications. On Saturday, May 4, the four member teams will receive a secret situational problem about the Greenhouse Effect and will entertain solutions to the problem posed. Students will then have two hours in which to

compose their team booklet.

The booklets will then be evaluated and the winners selected. The winning Texas team will be invited to compete in the International Future Problem Solving Bowl in Cedar Rapids, Iowa. Attending the international competition will be representatives from England, Western Australia, Guam, Japan, Canada, and one from each of the fifty states in the United States.

The Future Problem Solving Program has a great many values which are to be considered. The goal program instills team work and the importance of the different views brought to a team by each of the members.

The Future Problem Solving program was initiated by Dr. E. Paul Torrance, an expert in the field of creative thinking, in 1974 and since its inception the number of students participating has greatly increased. In Texas this year over 6000 students participated in statewide Texas Future Problem Solving activities.

During the superintendent's report W.H. Hallmark and R.L. Knox, elementary school principal discussed the teaching situation at the elementary school. Presently there have been 59 students pre-enrolled for the 1985-86 school year in the kindergarten department. Knox explained that with a ratio of one teacher per 22 students, another kindergarten teacher will have to be added to the staff of the elementary school. Space was discussed with the board as another problem. At the present time, in order to accomodate another kindergarten class, Knox said either Title I Reading will have to be moved back to the portable building or the physical education class will have to be moved to the cafetorium. He said the problem could also carry into the first and second grades where the ratio is also one teacher per 22 students. With

and first grade there will be 65 kindergarten students advancing and 62 to 66 first graders advancing. With the expected addition of at least five students in each grade after school starts, the elementary principal explained this could add to the problem of not enough space. A building committee has been selected by the board and the space problem will be discussed at the next board meeting after the committee has had time to investigate all of the possible alternatives.

A request from Texas Energy was discussed by the board, requesting that they be allowed to supply some of the fuel for the school system. The board passed a motion to give them one fourth of the school fuel service which has been split between Webster Service and Supply, Consumers Fuel, and Lockney Oil and Butane up to this point.

The board has set April 16 for a special board meeting to interview three local men for the position of ag teacher

## Jerry Johnson sworn in as new city councilman

Jerry Johnson, newly elected Lockney City Councilman, along with incumbents Kenneth Wofford and Mayor J.D. Copeland were sworn into office last Tuesday morning as the council met for its regular monthly meeting.

The election was canvassed and declared legal with a total of 181 ballots cast. Johnson was elected with 100 votes; Wofford and Copeland were reelected with 118 and 141 votes, respectively. Others in the city council race were Dan Smith with 73 votes and Harold "Buck" Ford with 61.

Mayor Copeland suggested that all councilmen retain their same departments. Those include Copeland, the city office; Dub Dipprey, police department; Paul Reecer, fire department; Pat Frizzell, water and sewer; Kenneth Wofford, city farm; and Jerry Johnson requested that he be in charge of the

street and alley department. Kenneth Wofford was also selected to act as the mayor pro tem should the

need ever arise. In other action the council approved the budget for fiscal year 1985 which

will be in the amount of \$548,823.00. They also elected to appoint David Frizzell to represent the City of Lockney on the Mackenzie Municipal Water Authority.

## Lockneyites attend conference

Leslie Patterson and Maria Elena Arellano from Lockney Independent School District were among the approximately 1,000 educators from throughout Texas who convened for the fifth annual convention of the Association of Texas Professional Educators (ATPE) March 14-16 in Fort Worth, where they elected new state officers and spoke with state education officials about current Texas school reforms.

Sue McGarvey, a Hallsville government teacher, was elected to president of the 42,000-member association for 1985-86. Jann Bogenschutz, Daingerfield, was elected vice president. Tony Diaz, Corpus Christi, was elected treasurer and Marion Wagamon, Huntsville, was elected secretary.

"We're going to keep reminding the Legislature that if they really want reform, that's where they've got to put the priority of the money," Brumley said of the board's commitment to smaller classrooms

Approximately 94 percent of ATPE's members are classroom teachers. Administrators, support personnel and student and retired members make up the remainder of the membership.


