

Horns tied for first place in district

On might have thought that after the first play of last Friday's game with the Crosbyton Chiefs, the Lockney Longhorns might get a little discouraged. But that was not the case, as the Horns came from behind two times and ended the game with a 14-14 tie with the

The Chiefs took the lead in the first 15 seconds of the game as the kickoff was returned for a touchdown. The extra point attempt failed and the Horns were down six to nothing.

Lockney's first score came with about 9:00 minutes left in the first quarter. Crosbyton had the ball on their own 11 yard line in a third and 13 situation. On that play a quarterback sack and fumble by the visiting quarterback, put Lockney in a first and 10 on the Crosbyton 17 yard line. Lupe Basaldua recovered the fumble and Lockney quarterback, Jimmy Ballejo, on the first and only play of the scoring drive, took one step and fired a 16 yard pass to Johnny Torrez who was wide open in the endzone. Ben Schuster made the extra point and the Horns lead by on with 8:45 left in the quarter.

Crosbyton took the lead with just 0:37 left in the half, when a Lockney fumble put the visitors on the Lockney 48 yard line with a first down. A 47 yard pass and a two point conversion put the Chiefs up 14 to 7 at the halfway mark in

After the half the Horns returned to the field, as Jimmy Ballejo returned the ball to the Lockney 35 yard line. The Horns kept the ball for over seven minutes of the third quarter with a 14

play drive. However on the third and seven play on the Chiefs 16 yard line, quarterback Ballejo was sacked and fumbled the ball. The visiting team now had the ball on their own 26 yard line.

Crosbyton then took the ball down the field 63 yards, and posed a serious threat, as they were in scoring position at the Lockney 11 yard line. However the Horns defense came alive and held the visitors to three incomplete passes. The Horns then took over at their own 12 yard line.

Lockney was unable to move into scoring position and returned the ball to the Chiefs, who began the next drive on their own 35 yard line. The Chiefs went for the first down, in a fourth and one situation, but the Lockney defense again came through and the Horns took over on the Crosbyton 44 yard line.

Horns Matt Mitchell and Jimmy Ballejo took turns carrying the ball putting the Horns in scoring position on the opponents seven yard line. Three plays later with Lockney in a fourth and four play, quarterback Jimmy Ballejo took the keeper four yards for six points. After checking with the officials as to opponents timeouts and penetrations, Coach Bob Purser opted for the one point kick rather than the two point conversion. Ben Schuster's kick then tied the game at 14 all, with 4:24 left in

Crosbyton took the kickoff but never moved the ball past their own 40 yard line. Because Crosbyton had been backed up to their own 16 yard line by penalties and the Lockney defense, when they punted to Lockney the ball was on the Crosbyton 33 yard line.

Lockney took the kickoff with 2:18 left in the game. They had control until the last 15 seconds of the game, when Crosbyton took the ball at their own five

The Lockney defense limited the visitors to only 164 total yards offense. The Chiefs had averaged 245 yards per game before they faced the Longhorns. The Horns on the other hand picked

up 187 yards total offense. The offense was lead by Matt Mitchell who picked up 84 yards on 16 carries. He was followed by Jimmy Ballejo who had 32 yards on 15 carries. Tony Banda picked up 12 yards on seven carries and Steven Cates had 12 yards on four carries. Allen Stalling picked up four on three

Outstanding receivers for the Horns were: Johnny Torrez with two passes for 22 yards, Javier Bernal with one catch of 11 yards, and Rusty Teeter had one catch for 18 yards.

The 14 to 14 tie will remain a tie until the district games are over. If at the end of district play the Horns and Chiefs are still tied for first place in district, the Horns will represent district 4-2A on penetrations in this game. The Horns led penetration 4 to 3. If the penetrations had been tied also, the Horns would still advance on first downs. The Horns led first downs 14 to 9. At the present time Lockney and Crosbyton have 2-0-1 district records and are one half a game up on Ralls who has a



Bacon 350 years ago, but he didn't know the half of it. In California money is like poison, according to the state's tought minded environmental monitors, the Health Services Department. In a list of substances that are hazardous when shredded-including cars, telephone poles, food stamps, and air fresheners, the agency now includes greenbacks. "Lets just say we're being conservative," says Rick Wilcoxon, chief of the state's Toxic Substances Control Divis-

No one even knew that shredded money was toxic until officials at the Federal Reserve Bank in San Francisco told them so. The bank, which tears up two tons of soiled, frayed and worn out bills daily, had conducted experiments showing that the lead and copper

"Money is like muck," said Frances content in the ink, used to print old currency, was in excess of the state's allowable standards. If shredded money were disposed of in regular garbage dumps, according to Wilcoxon, the lead could leak into the ground and contaminate drinking water supplies.

> California is the only state that considers shredded money a potential hazard. Until May of 1984, in fact the offending bills were used as general purpose landfill. "The floor we're standing on, according to California law, is probably toxic," says William Kress, who supervises the shredding process. The Federal Reserve Bank's discovery has increased the cost of disposing of shredded money tenfold. Bank workers now have to pace the toxic residue in scaled containers that are trucked twice a week to hazardous

Jerry, a member of the American Angus Association, is one of some 300 Angus breeders who have been elected by fellow members of their state association to serve as a representative at the annual meeting. At this time, the state delegates will participate in the business meeting and vote for a proposed change in the Association by-laws, and elect a new president, vice president and five directors to the American Angus Association board.

The annual meeting is held in conjunction with the Annual Convention and banquet, and the 1986 National Angus Show during the North American International Livestock Exposition.

The American Angus Association has more than 30,000 active members and is the largest beef breed organization in

Fall herbicide application could assist in control of pasture weeds

a lot of grazing and hay potential each year, and producers can correct this problem with a fall herbicide applica-

"The time to control weeds on bermudagrass pastures is now, not next spring," emphasizes Dr. Dave Weaver, weed specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, The Texas A&M University System. "Use of a preemergence herbicide to control annual weeds can release the true potential a pasture or hay meadow has for producing top quality forage."

Broadleaved and grassy weeds, such as little barley, cheat, henbit, groundsels. Carolina geranium and seeding dock germinate and begin their growth during the winter season, Weaver explains. These weeds often go unnoticed until the spring when it's time to make a hay cutting or to put cattle on the pasture.

Applying simazine (Princep 80W or Caliber 90) before these winter weeds begin to germinate will eliminate 80 to 95 percent of the weed problems next spring, says the specialist. Since rain is needed to carry the herbicide into the soil where seed germinate, the herbicide should be applied early.

"If little barley is a potential problem, apply simazine between Nov. 1-20," recommends Weaver. "If spring germinating weeds such as sandburs, ragweed or croton (goatweed) are the only problems in a pasture, then the herbicide can be applied in January or February."

If simazine is applied too late and early germinating weeds show up before bermudagrass begins to green up in the spring, an application of paraquat may be needed, notes the

Weeds rob bermudagrass pastures of weed specialist. Paraquat, a restricted use herbicide, should be applied while

bermudagrass is dormant. Simazine should not be applied to coarse, sandy soils low in organic matter, including the more aikaline soils in the High Plains, cautions Weaver. Rate of application can range from 1 to 4 pounds per acre. Cattle should not graze treated pasture for 30 days, or for 60 days if the 4-pound rate is used. Also, hay should not be cut for 60 to 90 days when the 4-pound rate is used. However, with early application, these grazing restrictions should not be a problem.

"Simazine is registered only for use on bermudagrass pastures and should not be used on Kleingrass or other species," cautions Weaver.

He points out that atrazine, another preemergence herbicide, has a special 'local needs label" for use on bermudagrass to be grazed. Atrazine (Aatrex 80W, Aatrex 4L or Aatrex Nine-O) provides about the same degree of weed control as does simazine and should be applied early in the spring.

Atrazine does provide some postemergence weed control, Weaver points out. Treated pastures should not be grazed for 60 days, and the herbicide should be used on neutral or acid soils and should not be used in the High Plains, Trans Pecos or Far West Texas

"Atrazine is less expensive per pound than simazine," notes Weaver. 'The choice is dependent on whether the grass will be cut for hay or grazed. Also, if ryegrass or legumes have been seeded or if volunteer clover is valued in a particular pasture, then neither herbicide should be used."

Clay Hamilton experiences life on an island

ISLAND: A small body of land completely surrounded by water. Having grown up in the Panhandle of Texas, that's all I knew about islands and I learned that from books and movies. We got excited at having enough water to float a boat. Enough water to surround a point of land was a little beyond our comprehension.

Considering my ignorance about islands and large bodies of water in general, you can imagine how I felt when I was told that I would live on one for three weeks as part of my six month IFYE Trip to Norway.

As my ferry chugged its way toward Hidle Island, I couldn't keep the theme song of "Gilligan's Island" from running through my head. I didn't expect a small tropical island with sand and bikini clad inhabitants (after all 1/3 of the country is in the Artic Circle).

When we landed at the dock, I didn't find a hula girl waiting, but I wasn't disappointed. The island is small (.8 sq. miles with five farms and 38 people), but it is surrounded by six other islands called the Stjernoyen (Star Islands). From the dock, you have a breathtaking view of these islands and the endless ocean. On a clear day, you can see the mountains on the mainland and the mouths of some of the fjords for which Norway is famous.

Located on the west coast, these islands are protected from the cold north wind by other islands and part of the mainland. They also benefit from warm air from the Gulf air stream. This keeps the temperature moderate enough to grow a wide variety of crops.

My host family, for example, gets most of their income from a small dairy herd, but they supplement it through the sale of plums, apples, pears and

The flowers, a white lily with a purple center called Stavenger Lillies, were originally brought from Holland as a gift to a housewife. In September, the stalks are clipped just before the blooms open, they are packed in small bundles and sold throughout Norway through a co-op. The fruit is also harvested in the fall, packed at home and distributed through a co-op.

While the day to day life was just like other farms I lived on, you could never forget that you were on an island. The main difference is that everything centers around the ferrys.

The school ferry comes by promptly at 7:30 a.m. The tanker truck from the dairy comes on the 10:00 a.m. ferry and the mail comes on the 3:40 p.m. ferry. Hidle is just one of many stops along the way so the ferry captains don't wait to see if you are coming. They dock, unload and go in about five minutes. Sometimes if they don't see you waiting they don't stop. A day trip to the nearest large town (2½ hours by ferry) can easily be cancelled by being a minute late to the dock. On the other end, missing the 7:30 p.m. ferry home means you have to stay in town. I never missed a ferry during my stay but my host family always seemed to cut it close. We usually boarded at a dead run just before they cast off.

Since the island is small, things are done on a small scale. The road system is made up of two roads (each 1/2 mile long). A walk around the whole island takes 25 minutes and a community meeting could be held in someone's

The local post office was one of the highlights of the island. The postmistress kept the letter drop box by her front door and the office in her spare bedroom. Her office hours were very flexible (any time except during milking

If the island had been much bigger, keeping the mail straight could have been a problem. Four of the five families there are named Hidle (the 5th family is a daughter and her husband who moved back to the island). This dates back to the old days when it was tradition to take the name of the place you live for your last name. All of the Hidles can trace their roots on the island 6-7 generations back.

During my three week stay, I especially enjoyed my fishing trips. My host family thought nothing of running out in the boat to catch some fresh fish for supper. To me, it was always a real treat. We fished with a spool of line with five hooks. 30-40 meters of line would be let out and then pulled up by hand. You would usually always come up with at least one spear (small mackeral) and sometimes more. My best cast netted five sir (coalfish). We also fished with nets and put out crab traps. With the traps, we caught 14 crabs in four days. Mixed with a little boiling water, they made quite a feast.

Living on an island wasn't anything like I had imagined it would be, but then I didn't really know what to expect. I found it interesting and a lot of fun, but you have to get use to the isolation. You stay at home a lot so you learn to enjoy your family and your own company. I found my host family to be a close family, well read and very interesting to talk to.
