first first step. There's nothing more revolutionary than someone who, right in the
middle of a feud, suddenly turns around and forgives. We're all such monkeys by nature! What someone does to us we do to him - either the same thing or worse. And there's no way out, since we've drawn an infernal circle about ourselves and
can only pace around it, calmly and coldly, forever. Indeed, how can we get can only pace around it, calmly and coldly, forever. Indeed, how can we get
anywhere, seeing that we've agreed to disagree once and for always? There's only one solution, and that's for us to conceive the stupendous idea of
