# Horns advance to the playoffs for the second year

For the second year in a row the Lockney Longhorns have advanced to the bi-district playoffs and will face Hale Center Saturday night, in Plainviews Bulldog Stadium. The game will begin at 7:30 p.m.

Lockneys top seed district championship came Friday night with the defeat of Ralls by a score of 20 to 12. Lockney will be noted as co-champions with Crosbyton but the Horns advance in the spot after gaining more penetrations in the Chiefs-Horns game earlier.

# Mangold delivers 5000th baby at Lockney

On Thursday, November 7, a milestone in the career of Dr. W.J. Mangold was noted by the hospital nursing staff when Dr. Mangold delivered his 5000th baby at Lockney General Hospital.

The baby, a boy, was born to Saul and Sylvia Rodriguez of Lockney. To make the occasion more special, Sylvia is employed at the hospital in Central Supply. She began working at the hospital in 1979 and has worked both on the floor and in Central Supply. Even more special is the fact that Dr. Mangold had delivered Sylvia in September of 1955. He also delivered several of her brothers and sisters, as well as her other two children, Jeremiah, age 9, and Elisa, age 10.

Dr. W.J. Mangold began his practice in Lockney in December of 1951. He delivered his first baby, a boy, in Lockney on January 14, 1952, to Bobbie Jean Wright.

When asked about delivering a second generation of babies, Dr. Mangold said, "It's special to deliver babies for those I had delivered years before. Delivering babies is routine and I really like the ob's. I also like the new addition of fathers to the delivery room. If they

have had the childbirth classes, we let them go into the delivery room here for normal deliveries. I like having the fathers in the room with the mothers. It's a special time for both the mothers and fathers."

Another special delivery for Dr. Mangold was when he had to deliver his son, Gary. "We had called in a doctor to deliver Gary but he was called out on another emergency and there was not time to call another doctor so I got to deliver Gary here at Lockney General Hospital," said Mangold.

When asked what the main differences are in deliveries now and in the past, he said, "They are almost totally different. The techniques and instruments used are different and costs have increased. We have always tried to keep the costs down here but everything has gone up in price and we have to also. It is about eight to ten times more expensive to have a baby now than it was when I delivered the first baby

As for the patients Mangold said, "We try to treat each of our patients like we would want to be treated if we were in the hospital."





# Compensation Act amended

The 69th Texas Legislature amended the Texas Unemployment Compensation Act, increasing the number of farm or ranch workers who may be eligible for unemployment compensation by expanding the definition of an employer liable for State Unemployment Tax. House Bill 32. effective January 1

1986, defines as a liable employer anyone who employs:

1. FARM OR RANCH workers during 1986, or the preceding year, if they employ four (4) or more workers for 20 weeks or pay cash wages of \$7500.00 or more in a calendar quarter. Beginning January 1, 1987, employers of farm or ranch workers, who during 1987, or the preceding year, employ as many as three (3) or more employees for 20 weeks or pay cash wages of \$6250.00 or more in a calendar quarter are required to pay the tax.

2. MIGRANT workers (any individual required to be absent overnight from his or her permanent place of residence) regardless of the amount paid to that worker or length of time employed.

3. SEASONAL workers (any individual employed in farm or ranch labor of a temporary nature and who is not required to be absent overnight from his or her permanent place of residence): a. on a truck farm, orchard or

vineyard; or b. who work at the same time, same location, and do the same work as

regardless of the amount paid to that worker or the length of time employed.

Employers who meet any of the above conditions should contact their nearest Texas Employment Commission Tax Representative to establish an account. They may also write to the Texas Employment Commission Tax Department, TEC Bldg., Austin, Texas 78778 for the forms to establish an account.



# FARM NEWS

### Whole cottonseed can be a bargain for livestock feed

With the winter season approaching, cattlemen looking for a bargain in livestock feed should consider whole

Cottonseed is a high energy feedstuff and is readily available at a low price due to a large cotton crop this year, points out Dr. Larry Boleman, beef cattle specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, The Texas A&M University System.

According to Boleman, cottonseed is a good buy when 100 pounds costs less than 35 pounds of cottonseed meal plus 65 pounds of sorghum. Cottonseed is currently selling for about \$3 per hundredweight, representing almost a \$2 savings over a like amount of meal-sorghum mix.

Whole cottonseed is packed with energy (90 percent total digestible nutrients) and may be used to make up as much as 20 percent of the total daily ration of beef and dairy animals, says the specialist. However, livestock should also receive adequate levels of minerals, vitamins and roughage since the high energy content of cottonseed can cause scours.

Other factors that cattlemen should consider in feeding cottonseed are

1. Since cottonseed is fed whole, it

does not require grinding, rolling, pelleting or any other preparation.

2. Cottonseed can be fed alone or combined with other ingredients to produce a variety of mixed feed, cubes


3. Cottonseed can combust spontaneously if stored too wet and stacked too high, so it should be bought at a moisture level of 14 percent or lower and stored in a flat bulk container. Cottonseed can be stored a year or more without fumigation if kept dry.

4. Cottonseed is best fed from a trough since it will not flow well in self

5. Because of the high oil content, cottonseed should be fed so as not to exceed these daily limitations-4 pounds for weaned calves, 5 pounds for yearlings, 6 pounds for cattle from 1,000 to 1,300 pounds and 7 pounds for heavier animals.

6. Cattle unaccustomed to eating cottonseed may have to be trained a bit, and sprinkling rettonseed with molasses or grain will entice them.

Boleman advises cattlemen interested in cottonseed for feeding a cattle this winter to contact a cotton farmer or gin as soon as possible while supplies are still plentiful and the price is right.





Read Ephesians 5:21-33. "Submit yourselves one to another in the love of Christ...Wives, submit yourselves to your husbands as to our Lord...Husbands, love your wives, even as Christ loved his church and gave himself for it...He who loves his wife loves himself. For no man ever yet hated his own body, but nourishes it and cherishes it, even as Christ does for his church..."

I have to laugh at myself for the odd things I do. Some people cannot do that. This past summer I tried to water some artificial flowers. I've heard of other people doing that but not me! They looked so real that I finally had to take them to a bright light and even feel them to realize they were not real! Many of our personal relationships and marriages are much like those flowers. They look real but they're not. They have become meaningless and sterile, a far cry from what God originally intended. We have forgotten the blessedness of relationships and marriage for the sake of intolerance and divorce. We are sophisticated, proper, respectable and faithful people--but can't seem to tolerate the person closest to us. Like the poetic words: "We flatter those we scarcely know, we please the fleeting guest, and we deal many a thoughtless blow to those we love the best."

A successful relationship between neighbors and for marriage partners needs constant loving care, kind gestures and considerate acts. I am thoroughly convinced that the best thing parents can do for their children is to love their spouse. Let your children and neighbors and the world know that this one spouse is infinitely loved. Let them know that you care and love each other. If husbands and wives have not found fulfillment and happiness in each other, if they have allowed other priorities to take away the romance then it will not be uncommon to see marriages of 20 years end in divorce. Mainly because they have stayed together for the children and now that the children are grown and gone from home there is no need to continue

Unfortunately many people, young and old, take the marriage step before they are prepared. Much more preparation is required of us before we can get a driver's license than it is to get a marriage license. As ministers we attempt to alert potential marriage partners to both the joys and frustrations of marriage, but the spiritual aspect is often over-shadowed by the social. The purpose of the above text is not control or subjection but love. That is the guiding principle. Love means to love you spouse as Christ loved the church and as you love yourself! This love is not selfish but always seeks good for the other. This love unites.

How is your relationship with your spouse, your family, your neighbors? Is it artificial or real like Christ's love for you?
