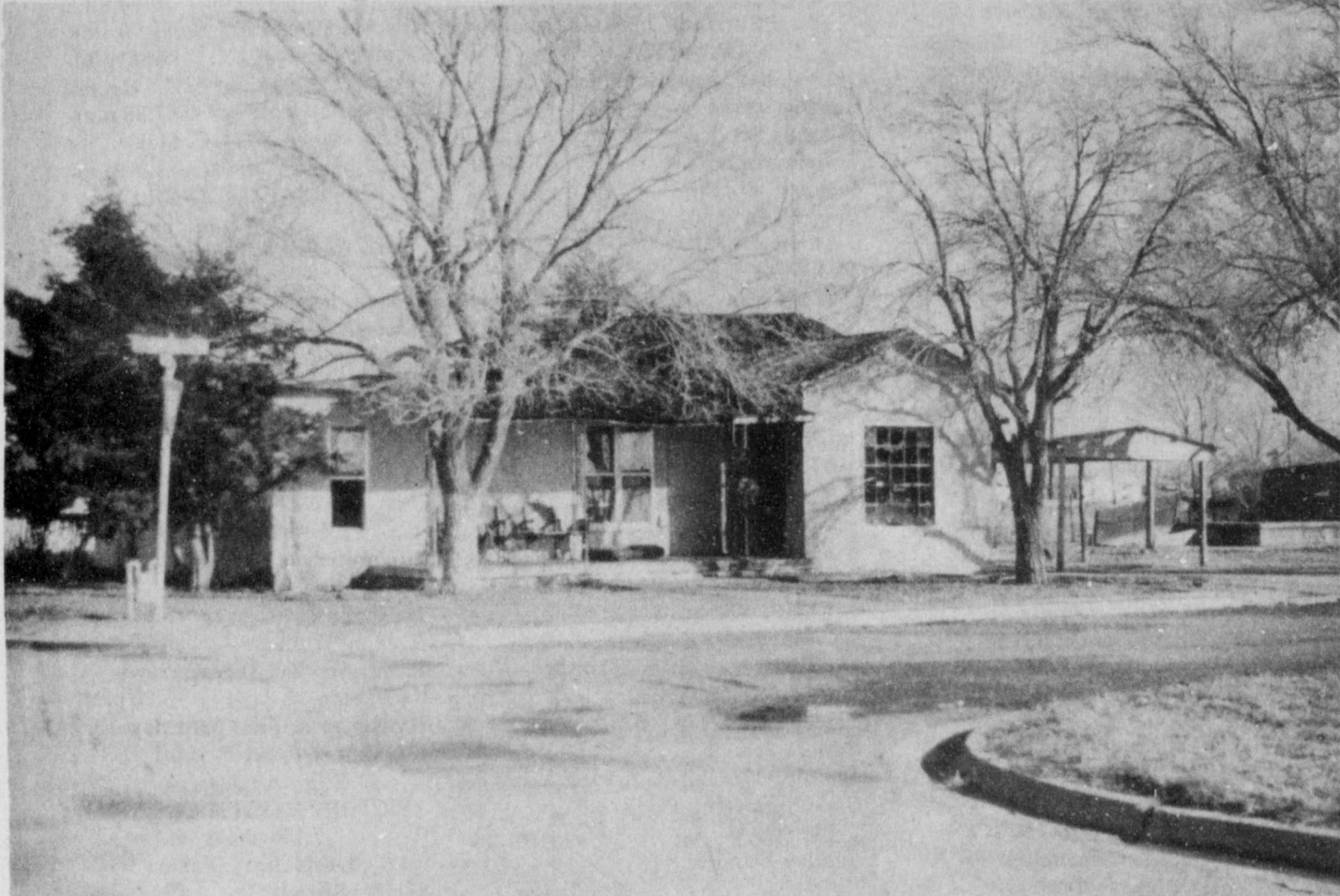

Fire destroys Monroe home in afternoon blaze December 19

At about 4:00 p.m. Thursday, December 19 a fire was reported to the Lockney Fire Department.

Upon arrival at the home of Floyd and Pauline Monroe located at 401 Houston in Lockney, the fire department found flames already coming through the roof of the Monroe home. Floyd had reported the fire after he came home and found the house full of smoke, and by the time the fire department arrived the fire was fully engaged. Fireman Jerry Johnson said, "they lost just about everything that was in the house."

The Monroe family lost all their clothing and possessions in the fire, though a neighbor did enter the house and managed to save a few of the Christmas presents. Floyd and Pauline have three children, two sons and a daughter.

A love fund has been established at the First National Bank of Lockney to aid the Monroe family in replacing their clothing and other possessions. Anyone wishing to contribute to the fund may do so at the bank. The Monroes have lived in Lockney

for a great number of years and Pauline is employed at the Lockney Care Center. Floyd is employed by Missouri Beef.

This is a bad time of the year for an incident like this one to strike any family, and any help, either through the love fund or by donating clothing or other things which the family can use would be greatly appreciated. There is a box at the Lockney Care Center for those who would like to give clothing or food items for the Monroe family.

DPS predicts 29 deaths over the holiday season

Texas Department of Public Safety officials have estimated that as many as 29 persons will die as a result of traffic accidents during the Christmas and New Year's holidays. The DPS expects 12 fatalities during the 30-hour Christmas period and 17 deaths during the 54-hour New Year's period.

Colonel Jim Adams, DPS director, asked motorists to maintain safe driving habits during the holidays to minimize the loss of life in vehicle crashes.

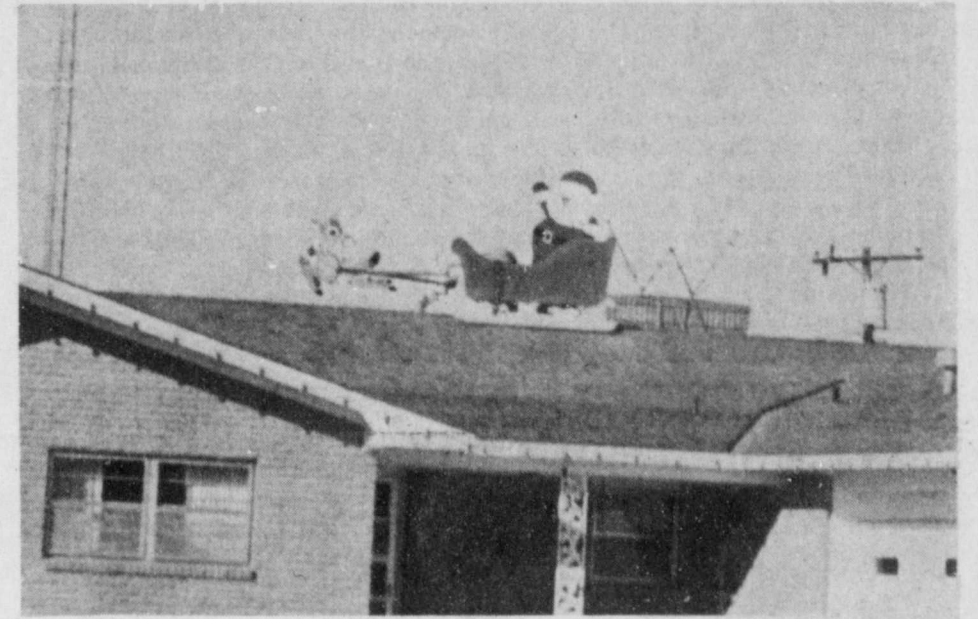
"We'd certainly like to see our fatality estimates prove to be too high," Adams said. "Unfortunately, there will be drivers who will ignore speed limits and attempt to operate vehicles after drinking. The best way to avoid becoming involved in an accident with a careless driver is to drive in a defensive manner. It also makes good sense to be sure everyone in the vehicle uses a safety belt."

Adams said he has authorized Highway Patrol captains to utilize troopers from other uniformed Traffic Law Enforcement services to augment the regular patrol.

"Additional troopers will be assigned where large volumes of traffic or additional accidents are likely," Adams said.

During the 102-hour Christmas period in 1984, vehicle accidents caused 43 traffic deaths in Texas. A total of 42 deaths were attributed to crashes occurring during the 102-hour New Year's period last year.

The Department of Public Safety will provide state traffic death updates as part of the "Operation Motorcade" program. The counting period for Christmas begins at 6 p.m. Tuesday, December 24 and concludes at midnight on Wednesday, December 25. The New Year's counting period begins at 6 p.m. Monday, December 30 and ends at midnight on Wednesday, January 1.

Wise Men Still Seek Jesus

"Now when Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of Herod the king, behold, there came wise men from the east to Jerusalem saying, Where is he that is born King of the Jews? For we have seen his star in the east, and are come to worship him." — Matthew 2:1, 2.

The visit of these wise men may have been as much as two years behind the visit of the shepherds. These men had to travel a long way at a considerable expense. They are wise men for they seek Jesus. All men that are truly wise will seek Jesus. Briefly let us expound upon such wisdom.

Wise men seek KING Jesus. Many in the world today seek the baby Jesus; many seek the teacher Jesus; many seek the good man Jesus; but wise men seek KING Jesus. The star that beamed so brightly that night, beamed for all to see, but only wise men saw it. The three gifts: gold, frankincense, and myrrh suggest three wise men, although there may have been more. At any rate there were only a few wise enough to regard the light and seek the King.

Notice that wise men seek Jesus in the house. Matthew 2:11 tells us: "And when they were come into the house, they saw the young child." The shepherds met Jesus in the stable; the wise men met him in the house. Many believe that the shepherds and the wise men came the same night, but the Bible says that one group met Jesus in the hay, and the other group met him in the house. The possibility of a two years difference comes to us from the fact that Herod slew all the children that were in Bethlehem and in the coasts thereof from TWO YEARS OLD AND UNDER. Many believe that an angelic choir SANG the good news to the shepherds, but the Bible tells us that the heavenly host was praising God and SAYING, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth, peace, good will toward men." The angels sang at creation in Job 38:7, but they will not sing again until they sing the new song of Rev. 5:9. Sin as ceased their singing. Many believe that Jesus came to work through individuals; actually He came to work through the Church. Wise men seek Jesus in the house, the House of God. Bethlehem means "the house of bread." The Bread of Life today is found in the House of Bread. Christ does not mean to work apart from the local New Testament Church.

Notice a third thing about these wise men: they returned a DIFFERENT WAY. When wise men meet King Jesus, they cannot go back the way they came. Blind men, both physically and spiritually, have met Jesus and left seeing. Deaf men, both physically and spiritually, have met Jesus and left hearing. DEAD men, both physically and spiritually, have met Jesus and left LIVING.

Wise men still ask the question, "Where is HE that is born King of the Jews?" They still fall down and worship. They still present gifts, living sacrifices, unto Him. They still return another way.

Svec, Bokhan, Yurchenko, and Gordovsky, four high level Communist intelligence agents fled to the West, one after another, in less than three months this summer. Today, Washington officials are rubbing their hands with glee. However, the case of Nicholas Shadrin is a grim reminder of how hard it is for a defector to escape his past. Shadrin, a young captain in the Soviet Navy who fled to the West, disappeared on a December night in Vienna in 1975. Now Soviet defector Yurchenko apparently has confirmed what was long suspected. Shadrin died at the hands of KGB.

His life in the West began in 1959 when he took a Polish woman he later married onto a Navy launch and across the Baltic Sea to Sweden. They came to the U.S., and he worked as an intelligence analyst. The KGB tried to recruit him in 1966. Shadrin tipped off the CIA and agreed to pose as a double

agent. His trip to Vienna nine years later was ostensibly to bolster that role.

Eva Shadrin, who lives in a Virginia suburb of Washington, believes her husband may have been used as bait by the CIA to enhance the credibility of another double agent, a man who may have been ordered by Moscow to lure Shadrin into a KGB trap. Her lawyer, Richard Capaken, says CIA surveillance of Shadrin's Vienna meeting with his Soviet handlers was mysteriously called off. Capaken said, "He was thrown to the wolves."

The FBI told Mrs. Shadrin in late October they now have evidence her husband is dead. Her lawyer says other government sources tell him Soviet agents fatally chloroformed Shadrin as they tried to spirit him out of Austria. While this was happening, his wife sat in the Vienna Opera House awaiting his return.

Toys could be dangerous

"It's a dangerous assumption to think that anything made and sold for children is reasonably safe," says consumer economics specialist Bonnie Piernot.

"Federal regulations governing toy safety cannot totally protect children," says the Texas A&M University Agricultural Extension Service home economist. "So adults who do the buying must take responsibility for keeping a child's playtime safe."

The Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) currently has specific regulations only on baby rattles, squeeze toys, dolls and stuffed animals, lawn darts, baby bouncers, toy caps, clacker balls, baby cribs and bicycles, notes Piernot.

When shopping for toys, the specialist suggests that consumers ask the

following questions:

*Are there detachable parts on the toys that could be swallowed?

Is the toy breakable, so that there might be wooden splinters or sharp pieces of plastic?

*If it's painted, is the paint non-toxic?

*Are there any points that could be stuck in the eye or nose?

*Is the toy suitable for the child's age?

*Does an electrical toy carry the Underwriter's Laboratory Seal of Approval? This certifies that the electrical parts meet certain minimum standards.

"If your child receives an unsafe toy from a well-meaning friend or relative, don't risk an injury to spare the feelings of the gift giver," says Piernot.

"If you can't return the toy, discard it," she advises.

Sparky the safety mouse warns of Christmas hazard

About 900 Americans a year require medical treatment from being careless with Christmas lights, according to the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission.

In an effort to help prevent injuries in our area, Southwestern Public Service Company (SPS) is conducting a Christmas-season safety campaign featuring its cartoon character, Sparky the safety mouse.

"Sparky's become real popular with kids," said Hermilo Martinez, SPS safety manager. "But the best thing is that adults pay attention to him, too."

Many shocks and burns around Christmas can be avoided by following some simple safety rules, Martinez said.

"Many shocks and burns around Christmas can be avoided by following some simple safety rules," Martinez said.

He said those safety tips include: * Before hanging strings of lights, spread them on the floor and check for frayed or bare wires, cracked insulation,

loose connections or damaged plugs or sockets.

* Check extension cords for wear or damage, and don't run them across walking areas.

* If you buy an artificial green tree, make sure it has been tested for flammability by Underwriters' Laboratory (UL). A small tag bearing the letters "UL" should be attached. Also, look for the UL tag that means Christmas lights and electric toys have been tested for safety.

* Never string lights on a metallic tree.

* Turn off Christmas lights before leaving home or going to bed. Along with being safer, you'll save energy.

The Christmas safety messages are part of SPS' year-round efforts to advise the public about the dangers of carelessness around electricity, Martinez said.

He said electric-safety posters, films, publications and presentations are available free to farm and industry groups, schools, youth groups, civic clubs and anyone else interested.

Health care expenses grow

Health care spending in Texas is growing faster than the national average, according to an article in the December issue of Texas Medicine.

Writing in the official Journal of the Texas Medical Association, the authors state that while spending for health is up in Texas, the health care burden is less. Expenditures for health services and supplies in Texas were 7.1 percent of the gross state product (the market value of economic output from Texas) in 1983. This is compared to 10.3 percent of the gross national product (GNP).

Through their analysis of health care expenditures from 1975 through 1983, they cite the strong Texas economy during the 1970s as the reason Texas

pay a lower proportion of personal income (9.9 percent) towards health care than the US does a whole (12.5 percent).

This and other data on health care expenditures in the US and in private and government sectors of Texas were compiled because of the rapid rise of health care costs, according to authors Charles E. Begley, PhD and Douglas A. Mains, The University of Texas School of Public Health at Houston and Coyle Kelly, formally with the Texas Department of Health, Austin. They add that in order to assess any cost containment efforts it is necessary to monitor health care services and supply costs.
