Methodists to honor pastor





Texas savings bond sales increase by 40 percent

Sales of U.S. Savings Bonds during January 1986 in Texas amounted to \$28,095,341, an increase of \$5,163,035 for 39.9% over the January a year ago, T.J. Morrow, District Director for U.S. Savings Bonds Division in Dallas, Texas, has announced. These sales represent 7.6% of the state's 1986 assigned dollar goal of \$370,000,000.

Sales of Series EE Bonds amounted to \$8335.00 during January 1986 in Floyd County, Lewis McDaniel, Volunteer County Chairman, said. These sales represent 5.7% of the County's 1986 assigned dollar goal.

Nationally, January 1986 sales of Series EE Bonds totaled \$575 million, an increase of 39% over 1985 sales, highest January total since 1979. Savings Bonds held by the public topped \$80 billion in January, increasing \$451 million in the month to \$80.25 billion. Much of the growth in sales is due to

Savings Bonds' new market-based rate which was effective November 1, 1982. This rate is adjusted on May 1 and November 1 each year. Bonds held at least five years earn 85 percent of the average rate on 5-year Treasury securities or 7.5 percent, whichever is higher. Sunbeam recalls coffeemakers

In cooperation with the Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), the Sunbeam Appliance Company of Oak Brook, Illinois, has announced the voluntary recall of 8,200 under-cabinet Model 15306 Sunbeam Coffeemaster® Flavor-Lock® drip coffeemakers, date coded as GJA, GJB and GJC. Sunbeam has learned that the heating element in some of these coffeemakers can loosen with use and shift position to cause a hot spot. Under certain conditions, the plastic shell of the coffeemaker can ignite to create a fire hazard.

From January 1985 to date, Sunbeam received 15 reports that this model coffeemaker caught fire. These reports involved some property damage to nearby combustibles and included a January 1986 minor hand burn incident in Illinois. No other injuries were

Recalled units can be identified by the model number 15306, the service number 15-30AC, and the date codes GJA, GJB and GJC all stamped into the metal plate on the back of the coffeemaker. The recall is limited only to the





Help prevent sexual abuse of children

Sexual abuse of children is a serious report sexual abuse, for two main problem in the United States. Sexual abuse may be defined as "anything sexual between an adult and a child in which the purpose is to gratify the sexual needs of an adult." Estimates of the incidence rate of sexual abuse vary, but many researchers agree that one in four girls and one in eleven boys have a sexual experience in childhood with a much older adult. While most sexual abuse victims are female, this may partially be due to the fact that males are much less likely to report sexual abuse. It is clear that the number of reported cases is just the "tip of the iceberg"; many children feel fear and guilt and do not report the incidents.

The popular image of the sexual offender as being a "pervert" or "molester" or "dirty old man" is not accurate. In from 60 to 80 percent of the sexual abuse cases the abuser is known to the child, either a relative, neighbor, or acquaintance of the victim.

reasons:


1. Sexual abuse is not usually a single, isolated incident, but typically occurs repeatedly over a period of time, often years. If no intervention occurs, the abuse will continue for this particular child and may extend to other children as well.

2. The child may feel that he or she is to blame for the sexual episodes. The resultant guilt can have a devastating psychological impact on the child. This psychological trauma leads to the most long lasting damage to the child, not the physical trauma which may or may not occur. Therapy for the child needs to begin as soon as possible, to prevent lifelong psychological problems.

If a child reports a case of suspected sexual abuse to you, you should do the

1. Remain calm. The way in which the child's parents and involved professionals react are believed to be the most Children need to be encouraged to important factor in determining how traumatic the experience will be for the child. Your becoming emotional will not

2. Report the incident to your local Child Protective Services worker (in Lockney 652-2416 or 652-3548, in Floydada 983-2280, 24 hours a day) or on the toll free Child Abuse hotline (1-800-252-5400). In either case the incident will be investigated promptly and confidentially.

God's Glory In The Storm

The season for thunderstorms is now upon us. We are privileged to witness some of the most spectacular events of nature in the thunderstorms that roam the plains. Because of the favorable atmospheric conditions we often can see more clearly the clouds and lightening. Others who live in other parts of the world may never see these spectacles. Our thunderstorms are probably very similar to the storms that developed over the eastern Mediterranean Sea and moved inland over Palestine and neighboring states.

Long ago David was credited with authoring a song which captured the glory of God as seen in a thunderstorm. Apparently David intended that the song cause a remembrance, a feeling, and an acknowledgment of the power and protection of God over our lives. My sources reveal that Psalms 29 was sung at the close of the Festival of Tabernacles. The wheat and vintage harvests were past, the new year had just begun, and the end of six months of dry weather was replaced by the

beginning of the winter rains. Psalms 29 contains at least two elements about a thunderstorm which should cause us to worship God. First, a thunderstorm is known for the thunder, lightening, wind, and precipitation that it produces. Each of these characteristics can be seen as a blessing or a curse. The obvious power and potential for destruction of a thunderstorm gets our attention. Soon we will be reminded almost daily of the destructive force of the storms. The storm affirms that God is omnipotent, and yet that he protects us. God deserves our respect because of his

power and his protection. Secondly, the thunderstorm is a blessing. Even the rains or other forms of precipitation may be very destructive in some storms. However, the rains are usually welcomed. We ultimately depend for survival upon the rains that fall. We are essentially powerless without God's gifts from the storm. We may choose to live as though God is not our provider and sustainer, but Psalms 29 teaches us the truth. A thunderstorm is God's visual aid to instruct us to remember, to respect, and to acknowledge him. There is more to a thunderstorm than what we see, hear, and feel. It is our reminder that God is to be glorified by the way we live.

Write, call, or visit a licensing office of the Texas Department of Human Resources (DHR). The people there will answer your questions and give you the papers you need to register.

You'll get instructions, forms, check lists, and other information. The check lists will help you make sure you're following the rules. (Otherwise, state courts may fine you or not let you operate.)

The rules are for the sake of the children. For instance, your home must be inspected for fire prevention, health,

Want to care for other people's and safety. And parents must give you children in your home? If so, you must emergency medical information about their children.

When you're sure your home is set up form and mail it to DHR. DHR will mail you a notice of registration and place your home on its list of Registered Family Homes.

After you're registered, DHR will be on call if you need help. There will be community child care workshops which DHR will invite you to.

A DHR representative will visit your home upon your request or if there is a complaint. Although the Department will not inspect you home routinely, a small number of homes will be visitedunannounced-each year.

Registration is to help you give children good care. By finding out who's registered, parents know which homes to choose from.

Everyone benefits. But registration also makes child care everyone's responsibility. You must supervise yourself. And parents help oversee the care of their children

To many the idea of gang sters brings to mind the 1920s and 1930s, when characters such as Al Capone ruled Chicago. His legacy lives on, at least in one form.

Then: Al Capone controlled the Chicago underworld in the 1920s. His gang ran most of the illegal operations in the city. He was the sole chieftain of a vast illicit empire of misdeeds with an annual income estimated at \$110 million. From 1928 to 1932, Capone's headquarters were located in the grand Lexington Hotel. In 1931, a federal jury convicted Capone of income tax evasions. On May 5, 1932, Capone left the hotel for Alcatraz Island to serve his sentence. He served almost eight years in prison and then retired to his home in Miami, Florida, where he died in 1947.

Now: Now the reign of Al Capone may have an interesting epilogue. A sealed, 125foot vault has been found in the basement of the now abandoned and run-down Lexington Hotel. A masonry expert who inspected the vault estimated that the cement was poured some time in the 1930's. The crudely poured cement indicates a hasty job done by amateurs. On April 21, the world will learn what the vault holds. With the television cameras, and the IRS on hand to collect \$800,000 in back taxes the long-dead Capone still owed, the vault will be blasted open on live TV, as part of a special entitled, "The Mystery of Al Capone's Vaults." Co-produced by the Chicago-based

Tribune Entertainment Company and The Westgate Group, the two-hour special will be hosted by Geraldo Rivera. Speculation as to the contents of the vault runs from cars and money to guns and bodies.
