"Verily, verily, I say unto you, Except a corn of wheat fall into the ground and
die, it abideth alone: but if it die, it bringeth forth much fruit.". John 12:24. Jesus is giving us the reason that He had to die on Mount Calvary. He was

a precious child taken in death. They have children born deaf or blind. They have suffered much heartache and sorrow and pain.
Now in closing I want to leave just a few more thoughts. First of all, nobody

Secondly, the harder we get, the harder it will be for God to break us and the harder Secondly, the harder we get, the harder it will
