

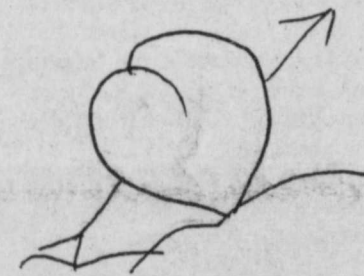

packages under the tree of their grandparents, Jim and Peggy Roberts of Sterley. There are sons of Terry and Lisa Roberts. — Staff photo

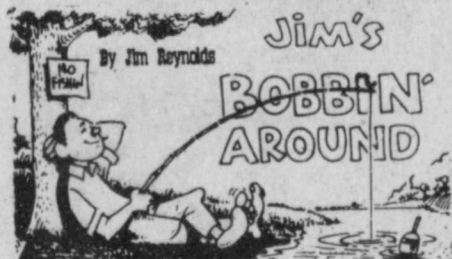
Dear Santa Clause

Christmas came early for the Longhorns as they eased past Petersburg by a 38-35 count Saturday to capture the championship trophy in their own tournament, the Double L Holiday Classic.

"This was a great win for Lockney," says Coach Phil Cotham. "Even with Todd Hallmark being injured early in the game, we had enough horsepower to win. The key to the win was great defense. We made it tough for them to get the ball inside."

"I don't know how long it's been since Lockney won two tournaments in one year."

Earning their second tourney championship in a row — they recently won the Springlake-Earth meet — wasn't easy for the Red and White, who now own a 12-2 record.

They led after each quarter but couldn't pull away from the Buffaloes. The score was 15-12 after eight minutes and 23-21 at intermission. Lockney's lads owned a 30-26 advantage heading into the thriller's final quarter.

Big Ron Cates sank 13 points, Javier Bernal put in 10, Wesley Teeter added 9 and Jimmy Ballejo scored in 6 for the Horns.

### S-E GIRLS WIN

Prior to the Longhorns keeping the boys first place trophy at home, Springlake-Earth had little trouble putting away Smyer, 58-32, for the girls title in Longhorn Gym.

Petersburg stopped Lockney, 51-25, in the girls third place battle. Floydada JV nipped Cotton Center by 36-30 in the consolation match and Tulia JV polished off Patton Springs, 55-35, for seventh place.

In the male division, Springlake-Earth stopped Patton Springs by 60-46 for third place, Floydada JV slipped by Smyer by 64-60 for consolation, and Tulia belted Cotton Center by 48-24 for seventh.

The two-day tourney opened Thursday with first round contests. Semi-final

contests unreled Friday and finals were played Saturday.

Coach Cotham gave his entire varsity plenty of playing time Friday as the Horns crushed Cotton Center, 98-15. Quarter scores were 17-3, 56-8 and 81-10.

Five Longhorns shot in double digits: Cates 22, Albert Martinez 12, Ballejo 11, Javier Bernal 10 and Teeter 10. Others ringing the scoring bell were Hallmark and Luis Peralez, 9 each, Joe Louis Guerrero and Jorge Bernal, 6 each, and Joe Mitchell 3.

"This was a great offensive showing," Coach Cotham says, "but even a better defensive showing. Most of our points came off good defensive plays."

Lockney's boys built an 18-7 first quarter cushion against Patton Springs but the gap was cut to 30-26 at half in a Thursday game. It was 43-36 after three quarters and 50-48 at the final buzzer.

"We did not play well on either side of the court, but it is still nice to win," Coach Cotham says. "Two technicals assessed the opposing coach cost them the game."

Hallmark held a hot hand, scoring 27 points. Ballejo and Javier Bernal each netted 8, Jorge Bernal put in 4 and Cates had 3.

## LADY HORNS WIN OPENER

The Lady Horns of Coach Eddie Fortenberry shot down Cotton Center, 53-30, in their Thursday opener. This was the LL fems fourth win, one more than all of last season.

The youthful Lady Horns owned quarter advantages of 10-7, 24-15 and 39-19.

Veronica Blanco and Tandi Gant each canned 15 and Rosellen Arjona added 10.

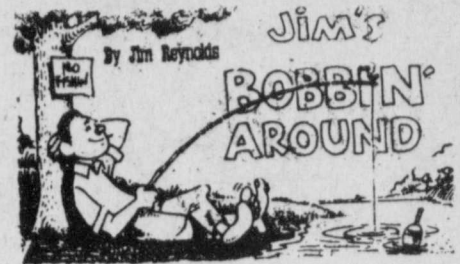
Smyer's 54-33 decision Friday sent the Lady Horns into the third place match the following day. Lockney jumped off to a 13-11 first quarter lead, but a 17-5 spurt sent Smyer ahead 28-18 at intermission. The count was 39-22

after three. Gant was the LL point leader with 11. Improving Petersburg stopped the Lady Horns in the Saturday third place tilt, 51-25. The Lady Buffs owned quarter leads of 8-2, 24-10 and 35-16.

With injuries having taken their toll, Lockney utilized several younger players in the tourney. Blanco, Edin Adrian and Shedia Hill each connected with 5 points in the Saturday match.

So they took Grumble into the jail. And that was that!

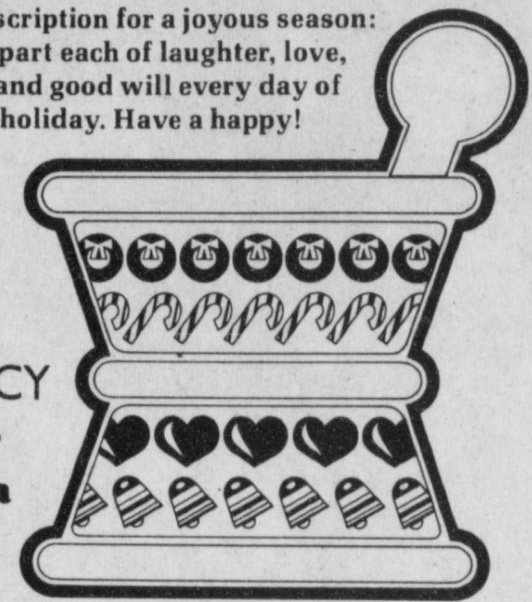
## Santa Letter

**EDITOR'S NOTE:** The following was submitted courtesy of the Floyd County Library. It is a reprint of a letter that was sent to the Editor of The Sun, a New York newspaper. Virginia O'Hanlon wrote the original letter in the fall of 1897. The letter and reply was printed Tuesday, September 21, 1897. The editorial reply was by Francis Pharcelus Church.

**The Editorial read:**  
We take pleasure in answering at once and thus prominently the communication below, expressing at the same time our great gratification that its faithful author is numbered among the friends of The Sun.

**Dear Editor:**  
I am 8 years old. Some of my little friends say there is no Santa Claus. Papa says "If you see it in The Sun It's so." Please tell me the truth; is there a Santa Claus?

VIRGINIA, your little friends are wrong. They have been affected by the skepticism of a skeptical age. They do not believe except they see. They think that nothing can be that is not comprehensible by their little minds. All minds, VIRGINIA, whether they be men's or children's, are little. In this great universe of ours, man is a mere

insect, an act, in his intellect, as compared with the boundless world about him, as measured by the intelligence capable of grasping the whole truth and knowledge.

Yes, VIRGINIA, there is a Santa Claus. He exists as certainly as love and generosity and devotion exist, and you know that they abound and give to your life its highest beauty and joy. Alas! How dreary would be the world if there were no Santa Claus. It would be as dreary as if there were no VIRGINIAS.

There would be no childlike faith then, no poetry, no romance to make tolerable this existence. We would have no enjoyment, except in the sense and sight. The eternal light with which childhood fills the world would be extinguished.

Only faith, fancy, poetry, love, romance, can push aside that curtain and view and picture the supernal beauty and glory beyond. Is it all real? Ah, VIRGINIA, in all this world there is nothing else real and abiding.

No Santa Claus! Thank God! He lives, and he lives forever. A thousand years from now, VIRGINIA, nay ten times ten thousand years from now, he will continue to make glad the heart of childhood.

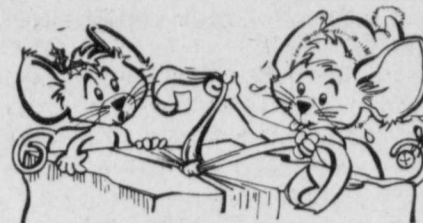

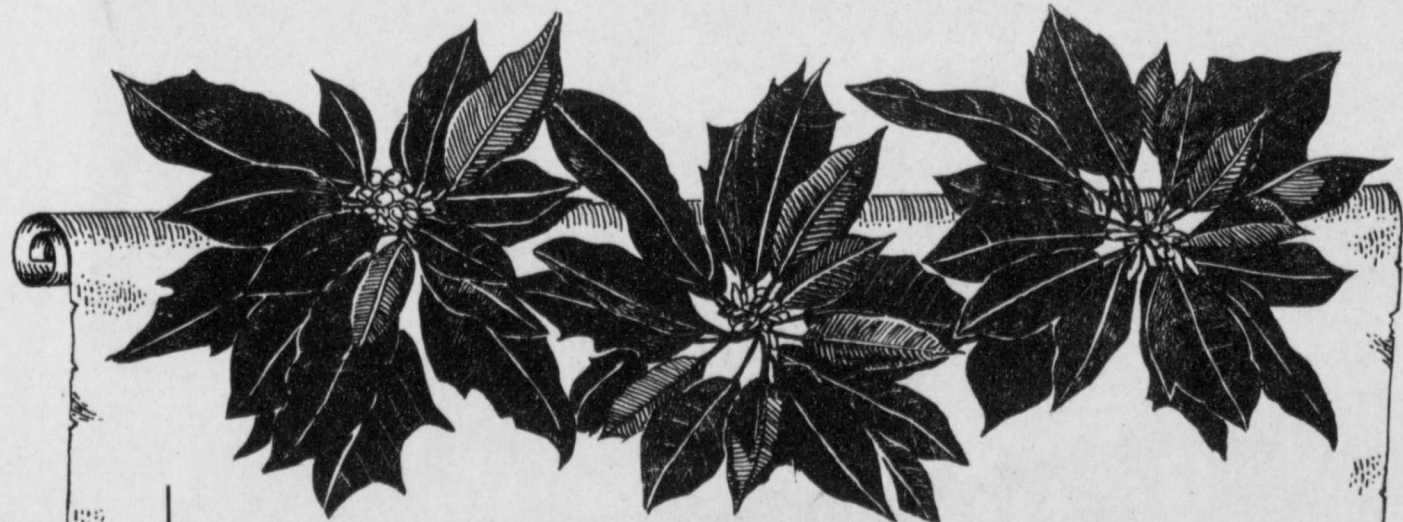

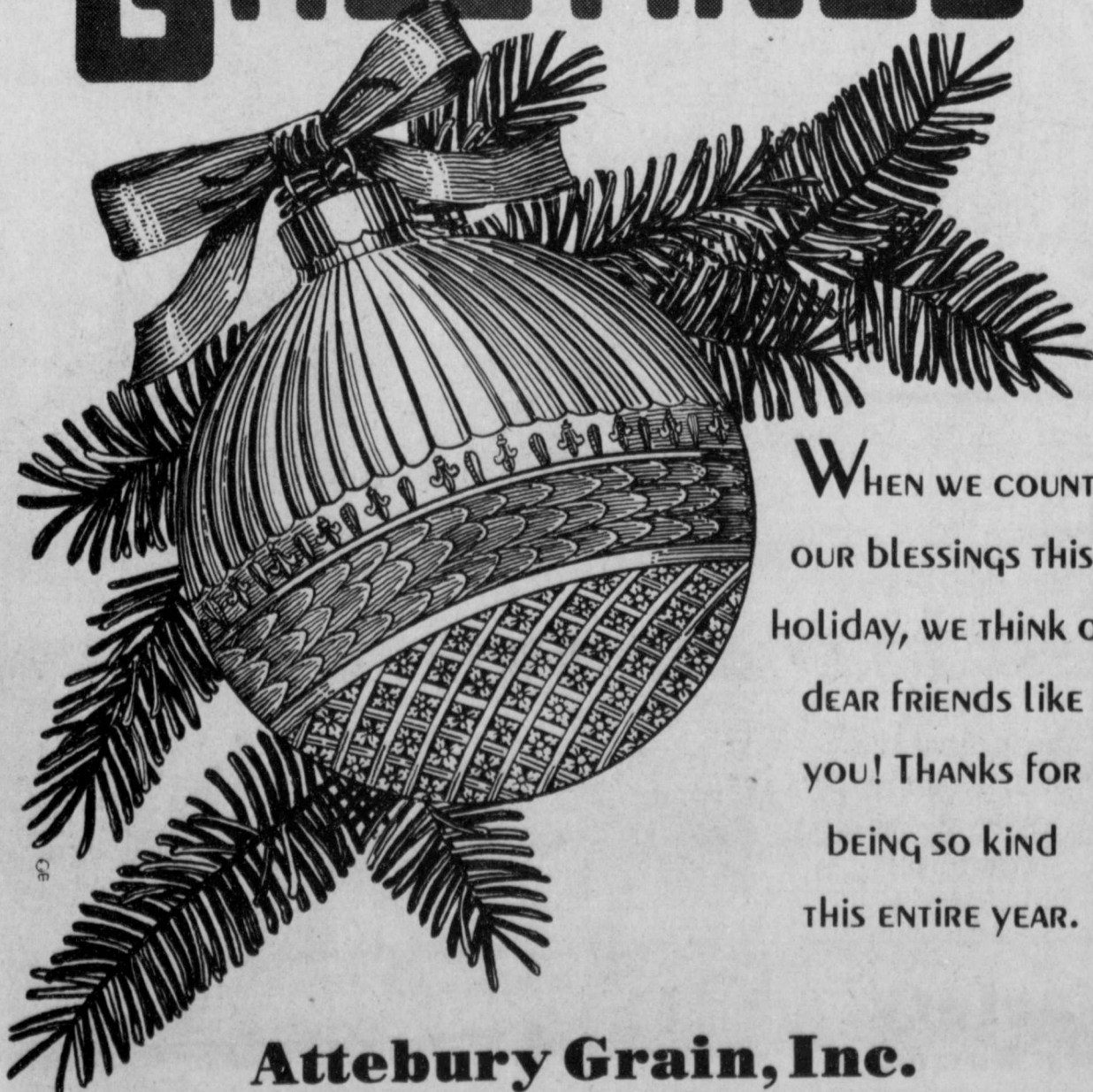
