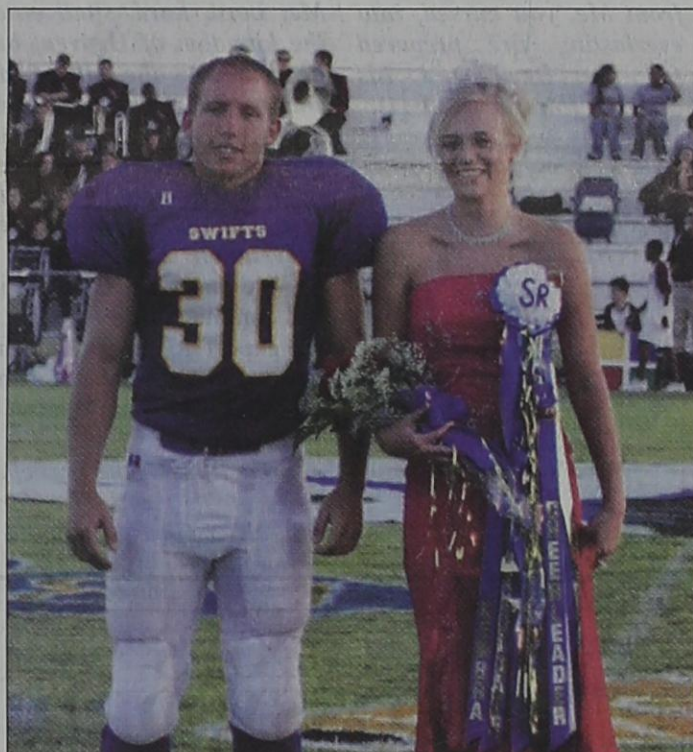

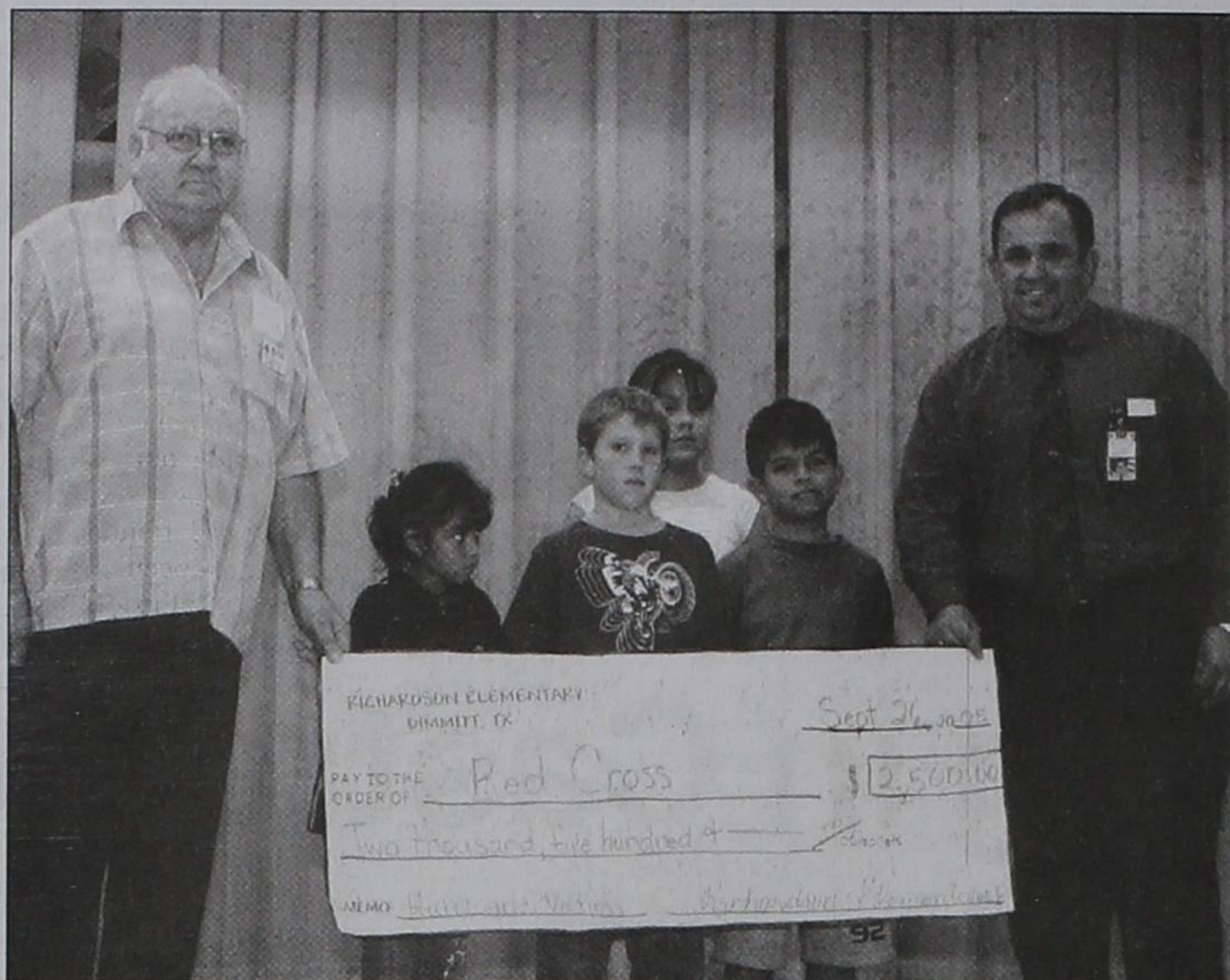

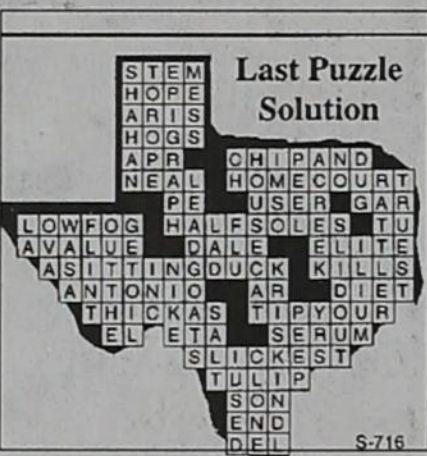
*Christ. These shall be punished with everlasting destruction from the presence of the Lord and from the glory of His power.*

### SUDDEN CHANGES IN VISION

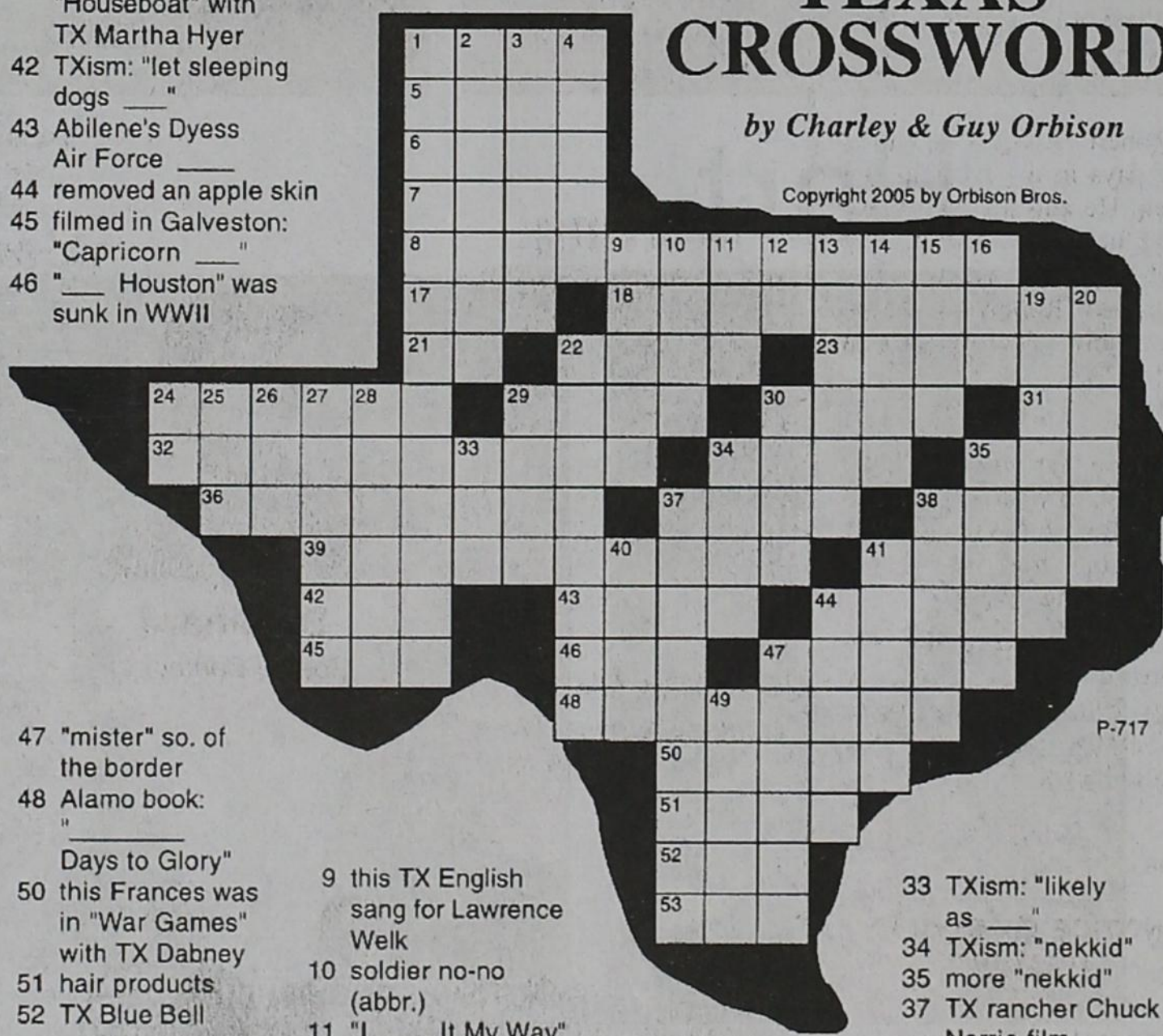

Bueno, esto es todo. OK, that's all. I wish I had more to share. I hope all the students had a great homecoming week.



# Plains slips by Dimmitt

It was a defensive matchup on Friday night as the Plains Cowboys scored twice in the second quarter and managed to hold on to a slim margin of victory, 9-6, over the Bobcats.

"It was one of those would'd, could'd, should'd games," said head football coach Rob Wills.

"We should have won that game."

Both teams were scoreless until the second quarter, when Plains got on the scoreboard with a 19-yard pass from Blake O'Quinn to Rudy Martinez. O'Quinn kicked the extra point and the Cowboys led, 7-0. Later in the same period, Plains added a safety after the ball was centered over the head of the kicker and out of the endzone, giving Plains what would be an insurmountable 9-0 lead.

Otherwise on the night, the Bobcats defense held the Cowboys pretty well, Wills said.

Dimmitt had 11 first downs to six for Plains and outrushed the Cowboys 138 yards to 78. Dimmitt had a total of 161 yards of offense, compared to 120 for Plains.

But the only score the Bobcats could muster came in the final period, as quarterback Marshall Wills passed 18 yards to Jordan Bell for the score.

On the night, Houston Sutton led the Bobcats with 80 yards on 20 carries; followed by Scott Martinez with 11 carries for 38 yards.

"Our defense gave the offense the opportunity to score and we didn't capital-

ize on it," Wills said.

On defense, standouts included Fabian Diaz with 16 tackles; J.D. Fowler, 11 tackles; and Marcus Perez, eight tackles.

"We're still making critical mental mistakes that will keep us from driving the ball," he said. "I wish I knew the answer to why we're making the mistakes. If they don't get it after 10 times, you do it 11 times, I guess."

"I told them I could make the schemes simple, but I can't make them important."

As soon as the players get the attitude that they play hard on every play, not go hard for two and rest on the next two, Wills said the team will improve.

"Nines times out of 10, a mental mistake by one person on offense will make the efforts of the other 10 look bad," he said. "Offense

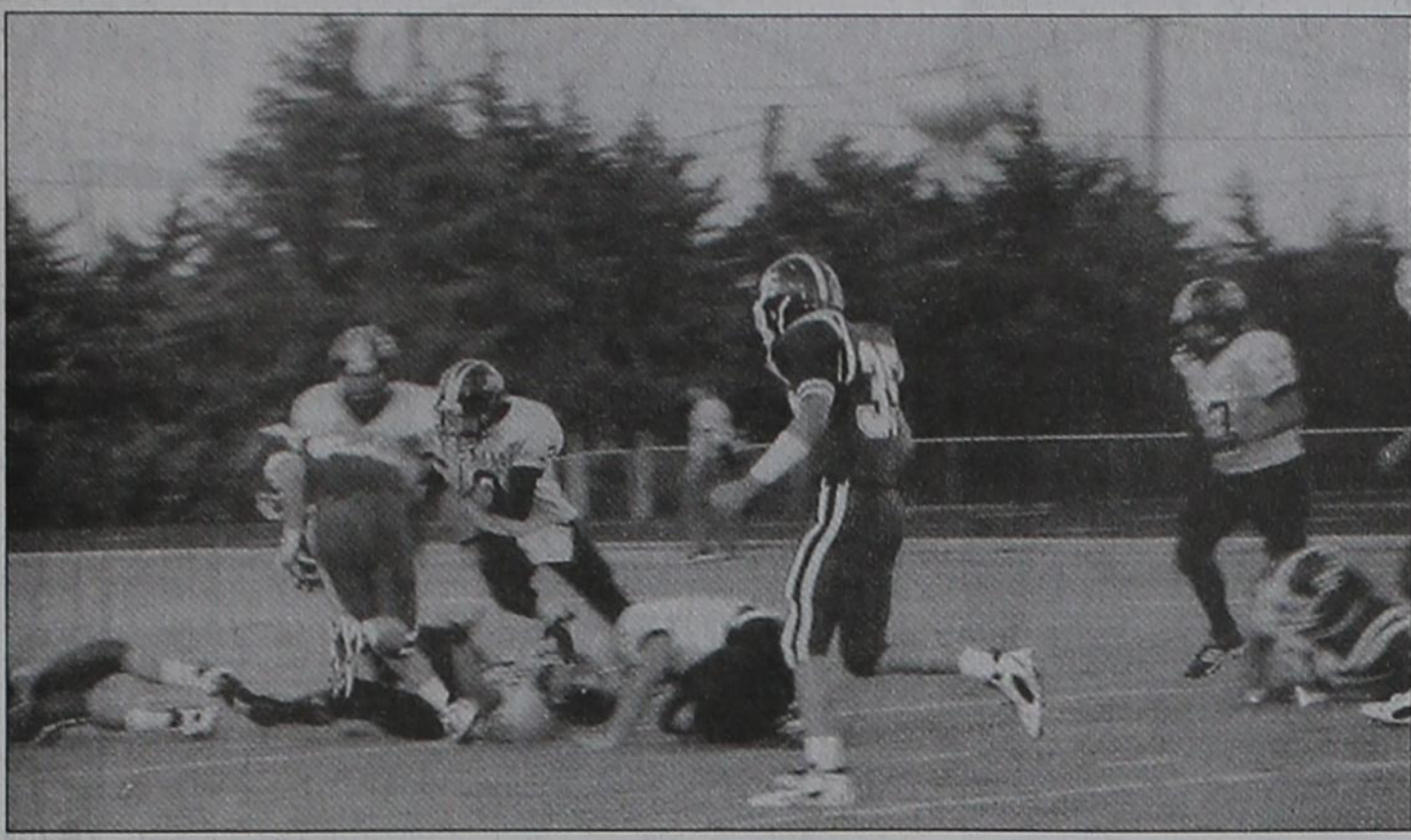
is about 11 individual wars and if you win 10 and lose one, that's the important one."

And although Dimmitt outrushed Plains, Wills said the problem came with the offensive line not picking up blitzes from Plains. "We didn't have time to set back and throw the ball," he said.

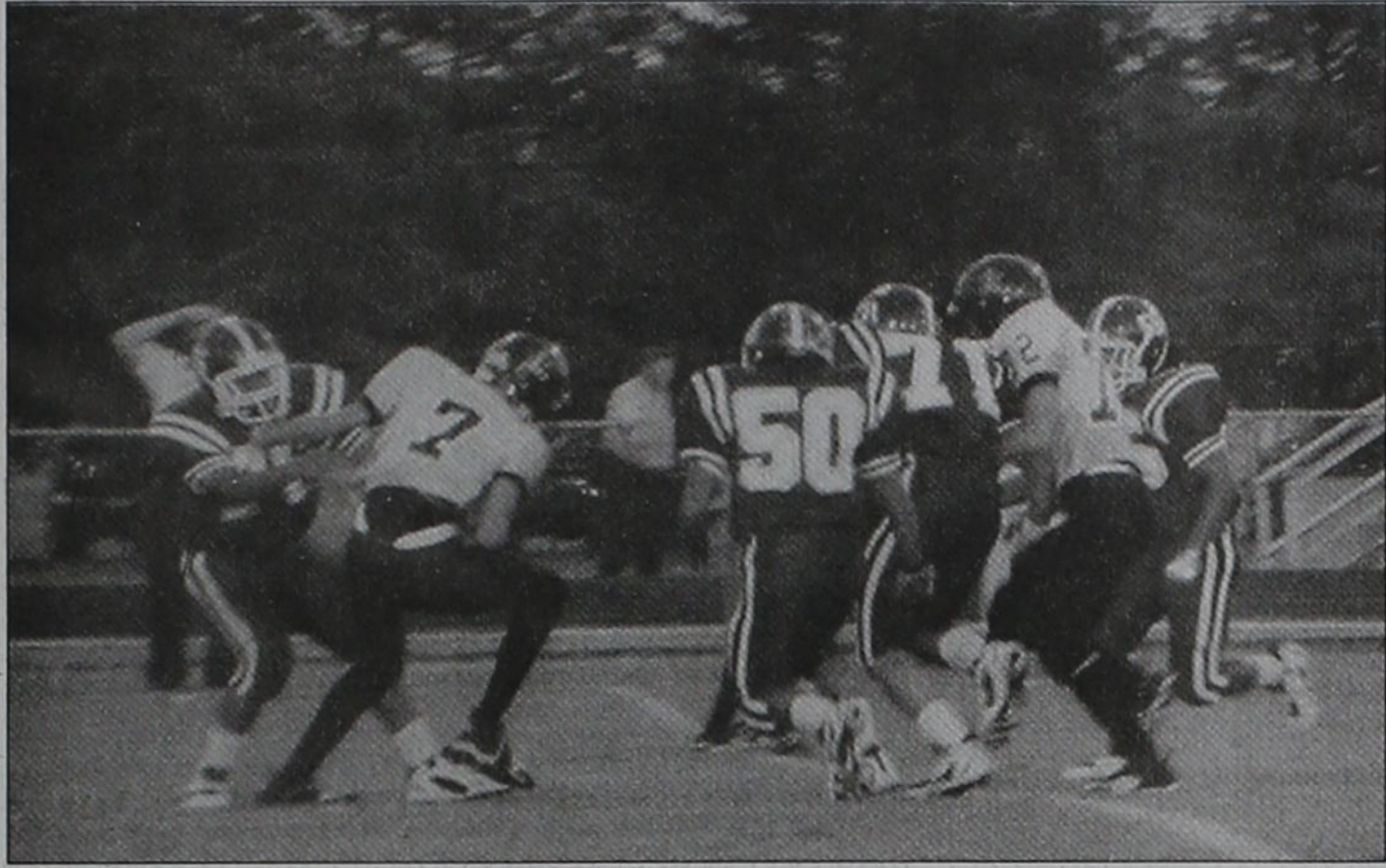
On the positive side, there were no more injuries reported this week.

Now, the Bobcats will take the week off and get ready for district and their first district opponent, Friona.

"I think going into district, if we eliminate our mistakes offensively, we'll be competitive," Wills said. "I think part of it is that we're so afraid we'll make a mistake, we do make one. It all ultimately rests on my shoulders."







length of the field with less than a minute on the clock but failed to score.

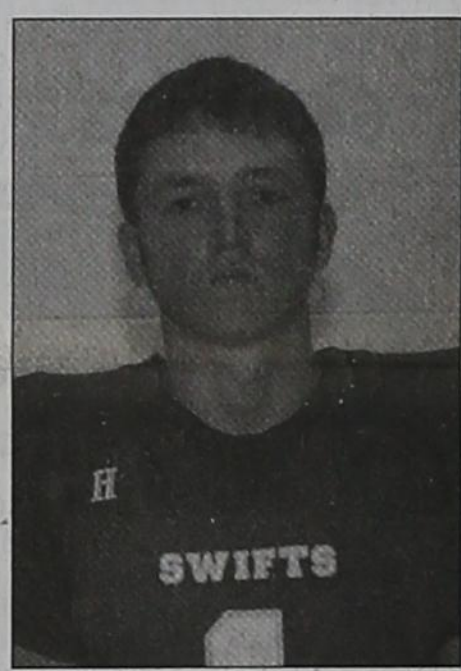

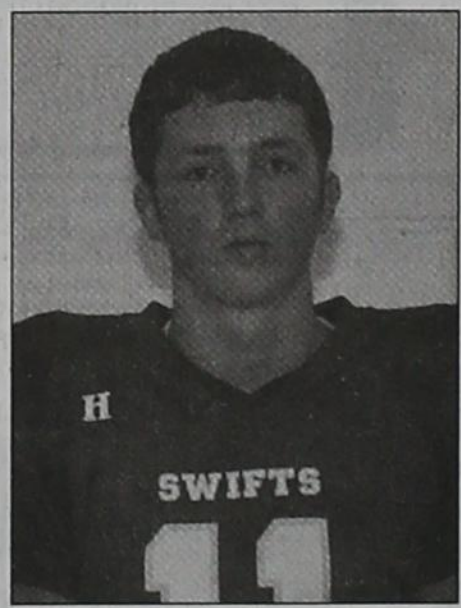

# White Deer blanks Hart, 8-0

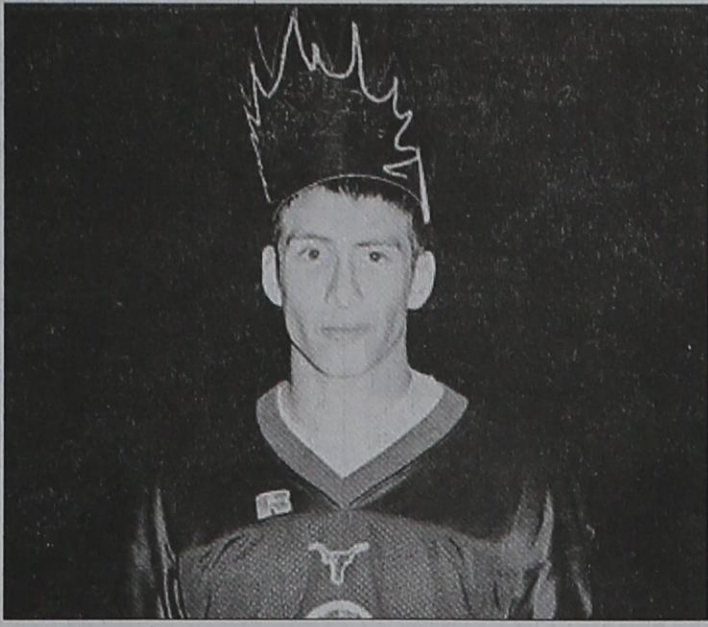
HART - It was Homecoming for the Longhorns, and although they played well, they were not able to get the win.

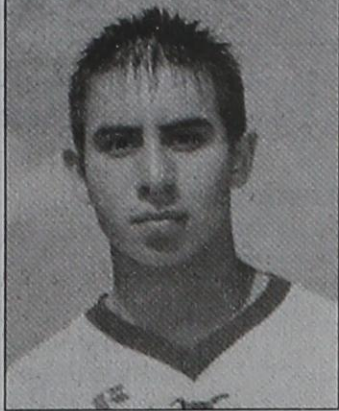
White Deer (2-2) had 11 first downs to eight for Hart (0-4) and a total of 250 yards on offense to 175 for Hart.



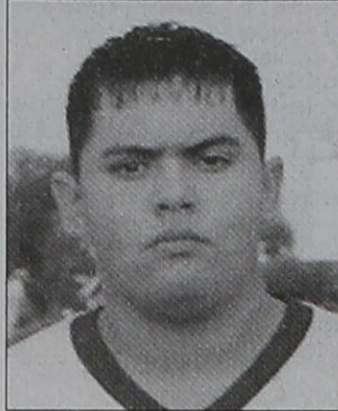

bonfire. They spent all of their spare time working on this. Tuesday night they finished around 10 p.m. At 1 a.m., Wednesday morning, the Dimmitt Fire Department received an anonymous phone call that there was a fire at the rodeo grounds. When they arrived on the scene, they found the bonfire burned to the ground. The only thing left burning was a little grass and a few embers from the wood. Word got around very fast Wednesday morning among the students and everybody was crushed. Everybody wondered who would do this. It has been over 20 years since Dimmitt High School had such a bonfire and the anticipation about it had created spirit around the entire town. When some of the dads and local businesses heard about the bonfire being burned to the ground, they knew they had to do something.

They started making phone calls, gathered wood, drove fork lifts and trailers to the rodeo grounds. By the time school let out that afternoon, there was a new bonfire built. Over 300 people attended the event which started at 8 p.m. that night. D.R.E.A.M.S. sold sausage wraps and drinks, the band played the fight song and chants and the students cheered. The fire department allowed Dennis and Kalan do the honors of lighting the bonfire. The big DHS was also lit and burned brightly. Both burned for about 45 minutes to the cheering of the crowd. Somebody tried to break the spirit of the Dimmitt Bobcats that Tuesday night, but that was not what happened. The Bobcat spirit held strong and everybody is already talking about next year's bonfire and how it will be even bigger and better.

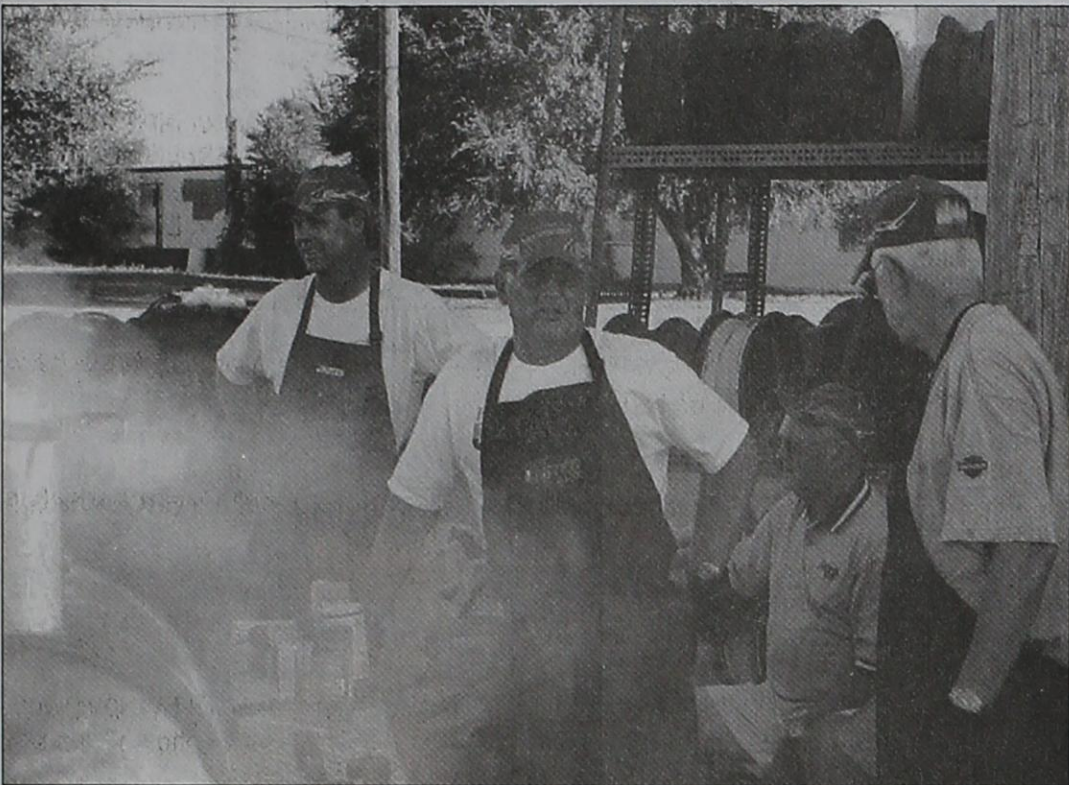
