 FACES BUDGET CRUNCH Mecting in special session on Wed-nessay, May 3 and Monday, June 5, the commissioners of Floyd County came budget process and the consequences of the actions of thcir predecessors. Commissioners were told that esti-
mated budget deficits for the October 1988 to September 30, 1989 fiscal ycar Will amount to almost $\$ 60,000$ (\$59,406.42) ifexpenditurcs continue Commissioners were asked to review the proposed budget for 1989-90 and recommend cuts to alle eviate not only the
1988-89 deficit, but also to ward off an estimated $\$ 90,000$ in deficit by the conclusion of the upcoming fiscal ycar. The proposed budgct has made no provisions for a salary increasc for any $\mathrm{cm}-$
ployces. After Ieng thly discussion and with
immediate solutions apparent, the court will consider a tax increase to provide the necessary funding. An increase of 10
cents per $\$ 100$ of valuation is bcing considered, and will be discussed at the
regular monthly scssion of the court regular monthly session of the court
June 12 which is open to the public. June 12 which is open to the public.
"The problem extends back to 198 said county judge Bill Hardin, "wh the commissioners court in office at that time cut taxes from 31 cents per $\$ 100$ in valuation to 25 cents per $\$ 100$ in valuation. Federal revenuc sharing funds were cut of at that time also, resulting in
the loss of about $\$ 150,000$ in adddition to the tax revenuc lost to the tax cut. With inflation, increased costs of opcration and unexpectedly high costs in the legal
and judicial arcas, Floyd County has spent more than it has taken in and now faces a deficit."

increased taxes by twocents in 1987 and two cents in 1988.
