

## Textbook committee selected at board meeting

At the regular October meeting of the Lockney Independent School District board, James Poole, high school principal, presented a list of names of personnel selected to serve on the textbook committee. They will examine and select State adopted textbooks for the Lockney school district.

Those selected to serve on the textbook committee are Superintendent, W. H., Hallmark, Ladora Auffer, Zane Polson, Treena Aston, Jim Clark, Tonda Jolly, Robin Bowden, Ethelyn Vernon, Zeldia Ellison, Kathy Kellison, Margie Rexrode, Glenda Jones, Sheila Poole, Rhonda Lyles and Felicitia Castro.

Discussion was held on the recent

Texas Supreme Court decision declaring the state's system of funding schools unconstitutional. W.H. Hallmark, superintendent, explained that it is not clear at this time how the Lockney schools will be affected but he commented that he was sure that Lockney would benefit from the decision.

The legislature must find a way to equitably fund schools. The state wealth per child is \$220,000 and our local wealth per child is \$106,000. That number is arrived at by dividing taxable value by the number of school children enrolled and since Lockney falls below the state average Lockney is considered a poor district.

Several school board members are planning to attend the District 10 School Board Meeting which will be held in Lubbock Tuesday, October 24.

A report on the school facilities was given. The heating and air conditioning has been completed. Work continues on the roof at junior high. Work on the roof has been finished at the elementary school and high school. The roof on the home economics and science building has yet to be done.

Principals, James Poole, Terry Ellison and Joyce Evans gave reports on the enrollment. The number of students is up 21 over the amount enrolled at this same time last year.

The activities calendar was brought up to date.

Principals, James Poole, and Terry Ellison along with School Counsellor Charlotte Mitchell attended a meeting in Austin on the Gifted and Talented program. The state mandates were discussed as well as plans on how the state requirements can be met.

The school board voted to approve the audit firm of Bollinger, Segars, Gilbert

and Moss. This is the firm that presently serves the school district.

Discussion was held on the need for a new clock in the gymnasium. The First National Bank of Lockney has agreed to pay one half the cost and the Boys Booster Club one fourth of the cost. The school board voted to pay the remaining one fourth. The clock will be in place for the first regular basketball game of the season.

Bids were opened on the lot advertised for sale by the L.I.S.D. Board members

voted to accept the bid of \$300 from Pedro H. Hernandez.

Phil Cotham gave a report on the parent volunteer meeting he will be holding Tuesday night. The administrative staff has decided that a parent volunteer program would greatly improve relations and communications between the school and parents.

Parent volunteers would be asked to help in areas such as clerical, listening to students read, and acting as field trip sponsors. Parents with special skills

might be asked to share those skills with the students.

In other business before the board the minutes were read and approved and bills were approved for payment. A report was heard on investment and taxes.

Present for the meeting were board members, Eddie Teeter, Lisa Mosley, Paul Glasson, Jim Bob Martin and Dickie Lambert; superintendent Hallmark, and principals Poole, Ellison and Evans.

## Daylight savings time 'falls back' this Sunday

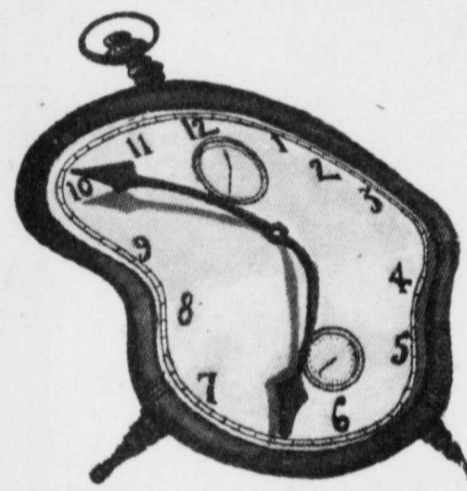
Sunday, October 29 will no doubt be the longest day of the year. Twenty five

## Sweet and Sour pumpkin salad

1 clove garlic crushed  
25 mint leaves  
1 tbsp. sugar dissolved in 1/2 cup red wine vinegar  
Vegetable oil-enough to cover bottom of skillet 1/2 inch deep  
Peel pumpkin, scrape out seed and fiber. Slice 1/4 inch thick. Heat oil in skillet over medium to high heat. Add a single layer of slices, brown both sides. Sprinkle with salt while frying. Remove to paper towel for draining; continue the practice until all strips are browned.

Arrange pumpkin in layers. Place garlic in frying pan with olive oil and sauté until golden. Discard garlic, add sugar and vinegar, simmer 1 or 2 minutes, add mint leaves, remove from heat. Pour over pumpkin, allow to marinate 3 or 4 hours or over night. Serve at room temperature, garnish with mint leaves. Serves 10.

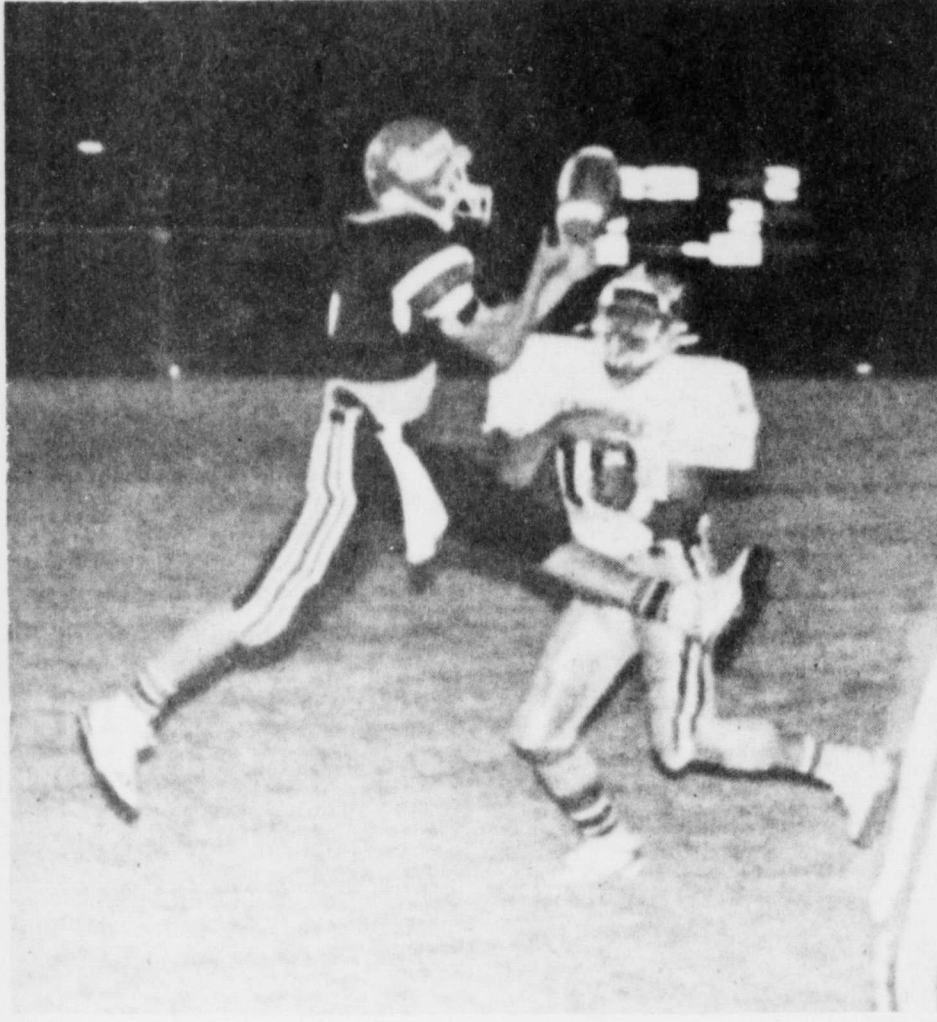
