### 1989 building permits up 45%

Residential building permits in Lockney, increased by 45% in 1989, totaling \$400,689.74. Total dollar value of permits in 1988 was \$219,369.00.

Thirty-six permits were issued for 1989. These included two new homes, totaling \$250,000.00; 13 for moving in trailer homes, houses and storage sheds, at a total of \$72,419.74; and 21 for additions and remodeling, totaling \$78,270.00.

In 1988, there were 14 additions and remodeling permits issued, 12 move-in permits, and one new home. The total amount of permits issued in 1988 was 27.

The dollar total for residential permits in 1989 was the highest for the past seven years. The totals for the past seven years are: \$144,493 for 1982; \$152,365 for 1983; \$962,382 for 1984; \$122.585 for 1985; \$188,445 for 1986; \$252,245 for 1987; \$219,369.00 for 1988; and \$400,689.74 for 1989.

Fourteen students have already enrolled in the lab and the program is only three weeks old. More students are expected to join the program soon.

The computer lab is being used as a supplement to assist in math, writing, language arts, reading, algebra, computer education and science. This lab does not take the place of regular classroom work, but will be used to tutor those who may be having trouble in

those classes. "We hope to have the courses open for adults also," said Mrs. Zumwalt. "It would also be good for adults trying to prepare for GED. Any adult who is interested can call the high school and leave your name and number so we can get back in touch with you."

There are four ATARI computers available in the lab. "There are no disks used," said Zumwalt. "It is all done through telephone relay."

Lockney ISD designed and implemented a computer lab for the elementary school which began functioning in

the fall of the 1987-88 school year. The lab contains 24 micro-computers to be used for such applications as computer assisted instruction in lanquage arts and math, word processing in composition classes, basic computer key-boarding and tutorial. The computers are also available for teachers use in grade keeping, creating assignments from software and management of in-

All students in grades K-5 have regularly scheduled classes in the computer lab twice weekly for approximately 45 minutes. Computer assisted instruction is used in special education, remedial reading, gifted and talented and regular

The goals of the elementary instructional computer program are to provide students with the essential skills necessary to become proficient computer users and to develope basic computer awareness through keyboarding and word processing. Additionally, the computer is used as a tool for teaching logical thinking and to enhance students problem solving skills.



## LISD financial condition addressed in report series

EDITOR'S NOTE: This article is a continuation of the series on the Lockney Independent School Districts Annual Performance Report for the 1988-89 Academic year.

Lockney ISD can take pride in its financial condition. The school board had always been conscious of its responsibility to the student body as well as to the taxpayer. With the help of the new finance bill passed by the legislature, the financial condition has improved even more than anticipated.

State aid will increase or decrease based on enrollment. A three-year example indicates the amount of state aid received, number of students and the amount of state aid received per student.

In the 1987-88 school year the average daily attendance was 703. The budget expense amounted to 2,439,689, and the amount per student is 3,470.39.

In the 1988-89 school year the average daily attendance was 713. The budget expense amounted to 2,698,664 and the amount per student is 3,784.94.

The district has been fortunate to maintain a fund-balance— the board has seen the need to provide a safe with opportunities similar to those pro balance for emergency situations. A vided by the most affluent districts.

two-month operating fund balance has been the rule of thumb to try to maintain. Because of increased state funding, our fund balance has grown. The extra funds are being used to upgrade staff development and programs offered. Listed below are the fund balances for the last three years.

1988-89 1987-88 \$1,092,361 \$1,022.428

All services for taxes and collections are completed by the appraisal district. The budget for tax collections is \$127,061. Lockney's share of that budget is \$20,978. The tax base for Lockney ISD is approximately \$76,212,786 with a tax rate of 72 cents.

The wealth of the district will increase or decrease on agriculture production, businesses opening or closing, and new construction. District wealth per student population based on the tax base indicated above is \$103,300 per student. Based on this figure, our district wealth is below the state wealth per student. Because we fall below the state wealth per student, we qualify for extra state funds called Equalization Aid. These extra funds are used to provide students


Mr. Phillips married Alva Jo McDonald on September 4, 1946, in Amarillo. They moved to Plainview in 1954. He retired from active farming in

## Award Winning Beef Soup

A flavorful, nutritionally balanced beef soup that highlights Texan and Mexican influences was crowned champion of the 1990 Texas Beef Cook-Off February 17, at Houston.

Winning the \$3,000 first prize and an expense-paid trip to Seattle, Wash., September 20-22, to compete for National Beef Cook-Off honors was Robin Bonifay, an amateur cook who works for a Dallas petroleum company. Bonifay's winning entry, which she calls "Chunky Mexican Beef Soup," is an original adaptation of caldo, a popular beef soup in Mexico, Bonifay said.

The basis of the recipe is a homemade beef stock and chunks of chuck pot roast. Bonifay combines the stock and beef chunks with spices and half a dozen vegetables to create a one-dish meal that can be prepared in 20 minutes and takes 75 minutes to cook.

Bonifay said her adaptation of the caldo recipe took from about two or three years ago. Secrets to the recipe's success, she said, are the lean beef of the chuck pot roast, which she trims of any additional fat before cooking, and the home-made beef stock. Store bought beef stock can also be used, she said.

"The soup needs a very rich, flavorful stock to support the rest of the beef in the dish," Bonifay said.

Brown meat with onions, garlic powder and cumin, in oil. Add stock, water, garlic, salt, pepper and half the chopped cilantro. Bring to a boil, cover pot, reduce heat and simmer 30 minutes.

Add carrots, corn and potatoes; continue simmering until tender, about 15-20 minutes. Add zucchini and return to a boil; simmer 5-10 minutes. Zucchini should remain crisp-tender. Add remaining chopped cilantro just before removing from heat. Ladle soup into large, shallow bowls, garnish with cilantro springs and serve with flour

\* If using canned beef stock, increase 2 lbs. pot roast, trimmed of fat and cut stock to 6 cups and decrease water to 2 cups; less salt will be needed.
