

## Marr and Copeland receive honors at banquet

Gary Marr had the honor of being named as Lockney's "Citizen of the Year" at the annual Chamber of Commerce Banquet held Friday, March 9. As a surprise presentation J. D. Copeland was named "Centennial Citizen of the Year".

Marr was introduced as Citizen of the Year by last years Man of the Year, Eddie Teeter; Woman of the Year, Sandra Cummings; and Family of the Year,

the Warren and Charlotte Mitchell family. Dorman read the letter of nomination.

Last year's honorees were presented with plaques in honor of their achievements and each expressed how much it meant to them to be singled out for the honors.

Marr told the audience that it was a very humbling experience to be named the Citizen of the Year and to receive the

traveling trophy. He stated, "I had a lot of help to get here, I didn't do it all by myself." He continued, "I was born and raised in Lockney and I want my kids to grow up in the same small town atmosphere that I grew up in."

Marr and his wife, Linda have two sons, Coby and Brady.

They are members of the First Baptist Church. He teaches a Sunday school class and is involved in the Royal Ambassador program. He is an organizer of the little league baseball program.

Sandra Cummings read the following to introduce Marr:

This year's recipient of the Citizen of the Year Award is a Lockney native. After graduation from Lockney High School, he or she attended college at Texas Tech. In June of 1973, this person married his or her high school sweetheart. The couple has two children, both of whom attended Lockney schools.

For the last twelve years the honoree has been involved in a successful career in agriculture, including both production and sales.

He or she has been a leader in many community activities such as the Floyd County Fair, the Chamber of Commerce, city government, and several youth organizations. This person has been a faithful and dedicated church

member and worker.

In the letter of nomination it was said that this person has always been willing to do anything for anyone, and do it with a smile.

We hope that up to this point our description of the citizen of the year has been general enough to keep you guessing. We don't have time to list all of the many specific things that this person has done for the community, but we did want to take time to list a couple of accomplishments that you might not know about—there is only one person in this room tonight who was named "Mr. Legs" in high school and at one time supported his family by selling pickles and baby food.

## LISD trustees discuss legislation and funding

The board of trustees for the Lockney Independent School District, met for a regular monthly meeting Thursday, March 8, at 7:30 p.m.

Superintendent Dub Hallmark, explained current legislation and pending legislation before the Texas legislature concerning equitable funding for Texas schools.

"The Governor has stated that he will not raise taxes and will look at any funding over \$200 million critically," said Hallmark.

"I don't think any bills will be passed in this special session, but I have to believe that because we are a poor school district we should benefit no matter what the outcome."

Mrs. Evans, Lockney elementary principal, informed the trustees about Tyler Bybee, a first grader, that has placed in the top 10 in a National Good Housekeeping magazine writing contest.

Bybee, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Louie Bybee, wrote a story about a memorable football game in which father had made a touchdown.

Bybee placed in the top 10 out of 35,000 children who competed. He was then awarded an IBM computer and printer for himself, his teacher and the school. If he goes on to win first, he and his family will be flown to Washington D.C.

Principal James Poole, told the trustees about Robin Marks who won 2nd place in a writing contest sponsored by the Texas Young Lawyers. She received an expense paid trip to Austin where she was presented with a plaque during ceremonies held in the Texas House of Representatives on Jan. 13. Students were asked to write their papers on the theme "The Ideal Supreme Court Justice."

The school board members voted unanimously to approve the purchase of a new van to replace the van that was wrecked in February.

A math UIL competition trip was also

approved by the trustees. The competition will be held in San Antonio the weekend of March 17-18. Mrs. Auffer will be taking eight students to the competition.

G.B. Johnston was approved as the election judge, for the May 5 election, to be held at the high school.

The members were informed of the current candidates that have already filed for positions on the school board.

Bil Anderson, Gary Mangold, Joe Franks, and Mike Mathis have filed for school board positions. Julie Hancock, who had filed earlier, withdrew her name as a candidate, citing a policy by her employer SPS, that will not allow her to hold public office.

The last day to sign up for school board is March 21. Because of spring break, March 19-23, anyone wishing to sign up should call Jackie Lou Holt, at home. If unable to contact Holt, call David Frizzell.

The trustees amended the current budget expenditures to include: the hiring of a third grade teacher at mid term, to meet the state mandate of 1:22 ratio; hiring Zelda Zumwalt as an aide for the new computer job training program at the high school; an additional \$500.00 to high school for academic travel and \$500.00 for curriculum products to be applied to the Caprock Reading project; and the purchase of the new van.

The trustees approved the textbooks, recommended by the textbook committee, for the 1990-91 school year.

All professional personnel were re-hired for the 1990-91 year and salaries were adjusted as required by the state pay scale.



## City hall bonds payoff, building is free and clear

Mayor Dan Smith announced to members of the Lockney City Council that the final bond payment had been made on City Hall. The last payment of \$10,000 made the building free and clear. The announcement was made on March 8 at the regular meeting of the council.

Jim Jeffers, Plainview City Manager and Dave Blackburn, Plainview City Attorney, met with the council to discuss the proposed regional landfill that the city of Plainview is planning to construct in Hale County. Lockney has been invited to join in the effort.

Mayor Smith told the council that new rules from EPA have been issued and that the Lockney landfill will have 18 months from the date the rules are issued to close the landfill. At the present time the date for the rulings has been set for June.

The council read through the contract that Jeffers presented and heard an explanation on how Plainview intends to set up the regional landfill.

A permit has been applied for, land east of Plainview has been located and is in contract for purchase and new equipment is being purchased for use at the landfill.

At the present time Hale Center is the only town in the area that has signed a contract. The final date for signing has been moved up to the first of April.

Councilman Aston made the motion to table the landfill issue until the April meeting. At that time the council will

vote on whether to accept the proposal made by Plainview or the one from Floydada.

Discussion was held on the budget for the next fiscal year. Items to be included in the budget include landfill expense, equipment needed by the fire department, a salary increase for city employees, seal coating of streets, lease on the radar gun for the police department, a donation to the fire department for the ambulance fund.

The budget will be presented at the April meeting.

Willis Reynolds was appointed election judge and Berniece Kent, Clementine Carthel and Jesse Garza will be his assistants.

## Private applicators school set

Effective March 8, 1990 the Texas Department of Agriculture and the Environmental Protection Agency pesticide rules require that all private applicators certification and license be recertified by January 1, 1996.

Private applicators will also be required to obtain 15 Continuing Education Units every 5 years to maintain certificates and licenses.

A private applicators school will be offered on Thursday, March 22 at the Lockney Community Center. The class will begin at 8:00 a.m. and conclude

following the completion of a test to be administered by TDA.

Brent Crossland from the Floyd County Extension will teach the class. It will be sponsored by Lockney Cooperatives and Kellison Fertilizer and Spraying.

A noon meal will be served to those registered for the class.

According to Charles McQuahae, manager of the Lockney Cooperatives, "This is a great opportunity for applicators to be recertified and earn a portion of the required 15 Continuing Education Units."

The council discussed streets needing seal coating. They agreed that the mild winter had kept the streets from getting in worse shape than they are. Main Street will be the first on the list to be repaired.

O. B. Johnson of Ober J. Engineering, Wellington was introduced to the council and specifications were worked out and the bids for the work will be advertised. The bids received will be opened at the council meeting in April.

In regular business the minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved. Current bills were approved for payment and the financial statement was reviewed.

Present at the March meeting of the council were Mayor Dan Smith, Councilmen Kenneth Wofford, Ronnie Aston, Gary Marr, J.D. Copeland, and Sam Fortenberry; City Secretary, Irma Lee Duckworth; City Manager, Dickie McCarty; O. B. Johnson, Jamie Johnson, Jim Jeffers, Dave Blackburn and the Beacon reporter.

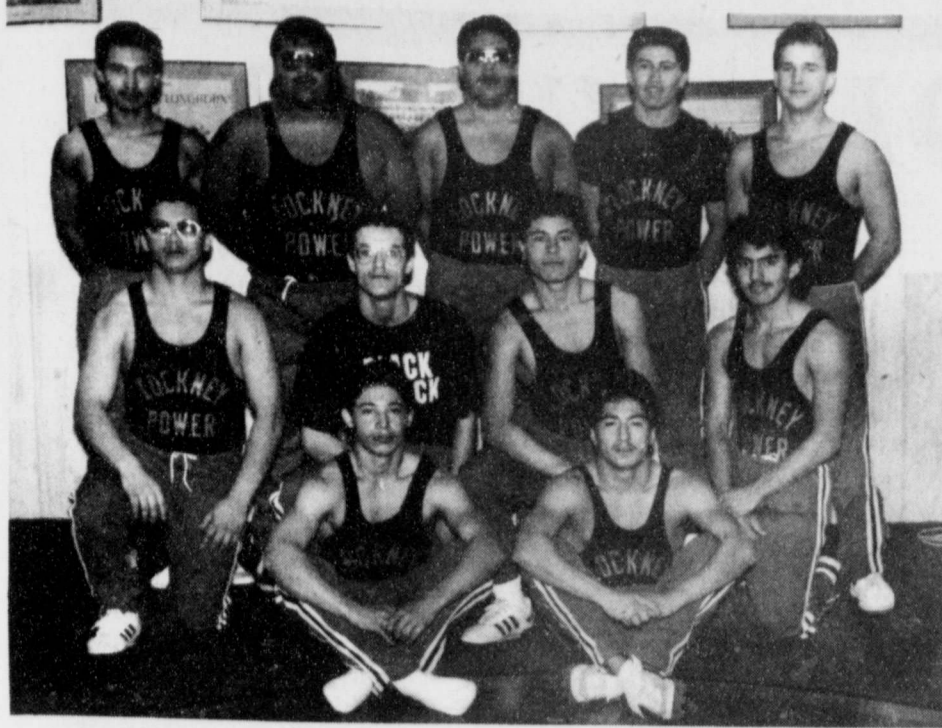

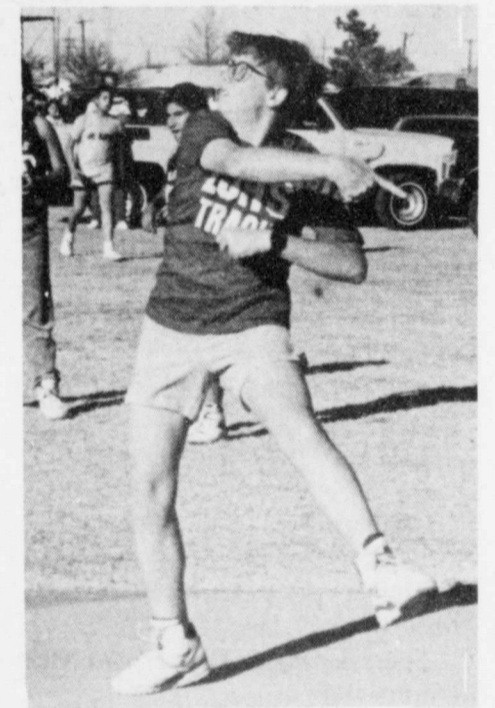
