Mrs. Mooney then gave a brief history of the Citizenship Girls. She stated that the Citizenship Girls selection began in 1953 by the Business and Professional Womens Club. That organization disbanded in 1987 and the El Progreso Study Club too over "with great pride" the tradition of honoring four outstanding members of the graduating class.

She was preceded by two children, a daughter, Artie Inez Nanny, and a son, Guy Moreland.


