

## Lockney elections seat two new officials and return five to office

Elections for the city council, school board and hospital board were held on Saturday, May 5 with a small percentage of the voters casting their ballots.

### SCHOOL BOARD

Incumbent Gary Mangold and newcomer Mike Mathis were elected to the Lockney Independent School District board in the only contested race of the day.

Dr Gary Mangold led the school board race with 255 votes, Mike Mathis received 149 votes, Joe Franco had a total of 98 votes and Bil Anderson garnered 89.

Mathis, Bil Anderson and Joe Franco were seeking the seat vacated by Keith

Jackson.

Elections for the Lockney Independent School Board were held at city hall with G.B. Johnston as the election judge.

### CITY COUNCIL

Jim Doucette was elected to serve his first term on the Lockney City Council. He will take the position vacated by Ronnie Aston. Aston chose not to run again. Incumbents, J.D. Copeland and Gary Marr, were elected to another term on the council.

Marr received 138 votes, Copeland 137 and Doucette 115.

The election was held at the city hall and Willis Reynolds served as election

judge.

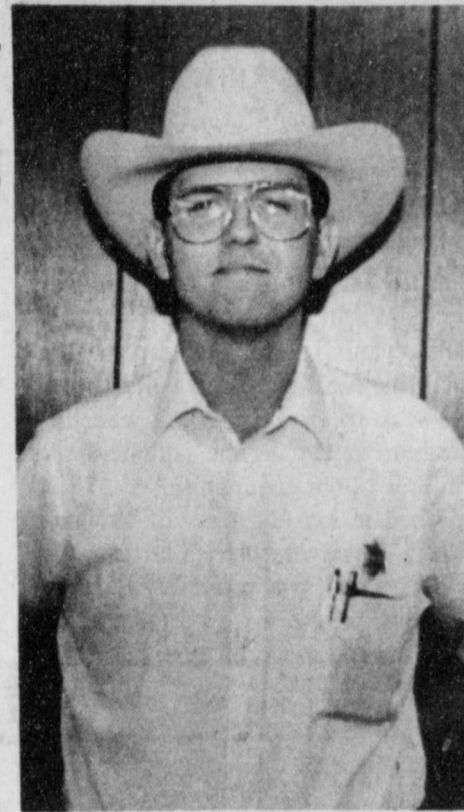
### HOSPITAL BOARD

Two incumbents, Les Ferguson and Bill Sherman were elected to the board of directors of the Lockney General Hospital.

Sherman received 281 votes and Ferguson 243.

Sherman will be serving his first elected term. He was appointed to fill the unexpired term of Chester Carthel.

Board members are elected for two year terms and can serve three terms before going off the board. After being off for a term former members are eligible to serve again.



## Meador is new deputy

John Meador, recently approved by the Floyd County Commissioners, has taken up his post as county sheriff's deputy in the Lockney area. He will be filling the vacancy created by the resignation of Ellis Butler last month.

Meador, age 22, was born and reared in Motley County. He graduated from Motley County High School and earned

A single man, Meador will be making his home in Lockney. He moves here from Briscoe County where he has been serving as a deputy.

Said Meador, "I am glad to be here."

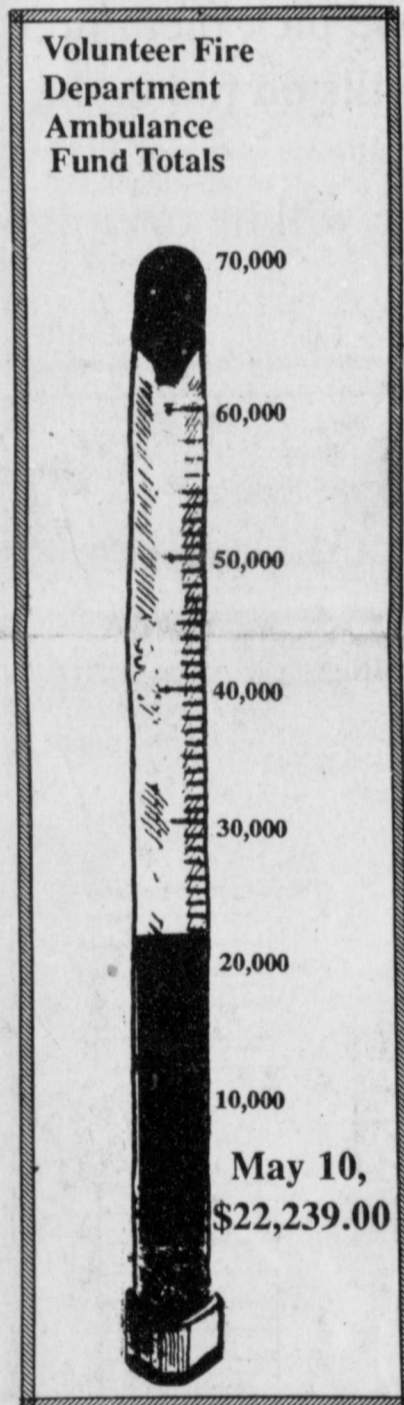
"Our goal for Country Caravan is

In the AA girls division of the regional meet Lockney tied for 32nd. Olton tied for ninth with 20 points; Hale Center tied for 21st with 9 points; Abernathy tied for 24th with 6 points and Hart tied for 27th with 4 points.

Michelle Delgado placed 6th in the 3200 meter run with a time of 12:57.06

Also participating were Mark Perales in the 100 Long Jump; the Mile Relay Team consisting of Juan Vargas, Joe Luna, Jake Jones, Louis Peralez and Johnny Peralez; and Wesley Teeter in the Discus Throw.

Girls participating in the meet were Amy Turner in the Mile Run and Michelle Delgado in the two mile Run.

## Kropp receives Tyler Award

Bob Kropp, Oklahoma State University associate professor of animal science, was recently presented OSU's 1990 Tyler Award in recognition of his many professional achievements in teaching and public service.

A member of the OSU animal science faculty since 1972, Kropp was honored at the April 7 OSU Animal Science Awards Banquet.

The Tyler Award recognizes professional and personal excellence in the field of animal science and is made possible by a gift from the late Don M. Tyler of Bartlesville of 186 Angus cattle. These cattle were used to establish an endowment to finance the award.

Bob Totusek, head of the OSU Animal Science Department, explains Kropp has been instrumental in implementing a case-study method of education similar to what is employed in the prestigious Harvard business school. Kropp even attended Harvard for a short time to examine the case study method first-hand.

"The goal of our upper-level courses is to expose students to the real world before they enter the real world," Totusek said. "This gives students experience dealing with complex problems before those problems ever arise. Without Bob's dedication and enthusiasm, we might never have been able to offer our students the advantages of this educational system."

Kropp also has been instrumental in establishing three new options in the department: livestock merchandising, sales management and livestock experience. Each of these options provides students with increased education and

practical "hands-on" experience in a specialized field of animal science, thereby better preparing students for "real-world" experiences after graduation.

In addition to his teaching and adviser duties, Kropp served for several years as supervisor of the OSU Beef Cattle Center and OSU's purebred beef cattle herds. As supervisor, Kropp developed and implemented a complete performance testing program for all bulls produced in OSU's purebred herds. He also established four new herds of cattle at OSU: Brangus, Limousin, Polled Hereford and Simmental.

His talents and abilities are widely recognized in the beef cattle industry. Kropp has become increasingly popular as a speaker, currently receiving six to eight speaking invitations from around the nation each year.

"Perhaps even more significant, however, is the vast number of telephone calls he continuously receives from clientele," says Totusek. "Anytime Bob is not counseling a student or teaching a class, chances are good that he is on the phone responding to the needs of a producer."

Kropp received his B.S., M.S. and Ph.D degrees from OSU in 1970, 1972 and 1975 respectively. The fact Kropp completed his Ph.D degree while serving as an animal science instructor and coach of the livestock judging team is an indication of his ability and dedication, according to Totusek. During his time as coach, animal science livestock teams placed in the top ten 95 percent of the time, the top five 36 percent of the time and place first 30 percent of the time.

Kropp is the son of Beth Kropp. He is a member of the Oklahoma and National Cattlemen's Association, Kropp also is active in state and national Hereford, Simmental, Brangus, Angus and Limousin breed association.

- 1/4 c. Cocoa
- 1 c. light cream
- 3 Tbsp. butter or margarine
- 3 egg yolks
- 2 Tbsp. brandy or 3/4 tsp. brandy extract
- 1/4 tsp. vanilla extract
- 10 maraschino cherries, cut into quarters
- Whipped cream (optional)
- 4 maraschino cherries (optional)

Heat oven to 325°. In medium saucepan stir together sugar and cocoa. Gradually stir in light cream. Add butter. Cook over medium heat, stirring constantly, until mixture is hot and smooth. In medium bowl lightly beat egg yolks; slowly whisk in cocoa mixture. Stir in brandy and vanilla extract. Place cut cherries in bottom of four 6-ounce custard cups. Place cups in shallow baking pan; pour cocoa mixture into custard cups. Place pan on rack in oven; pour about 1 inch hot water into pan. Bake 40 minutes. Remove cups from pan. Cool to room temperature. Cover; refrigerate 2 to 3 hours. (May be refrigerated, well covered, up to 2 days.) Garnish with whipped cream and maraschino cherry, if desired. 4 servings.

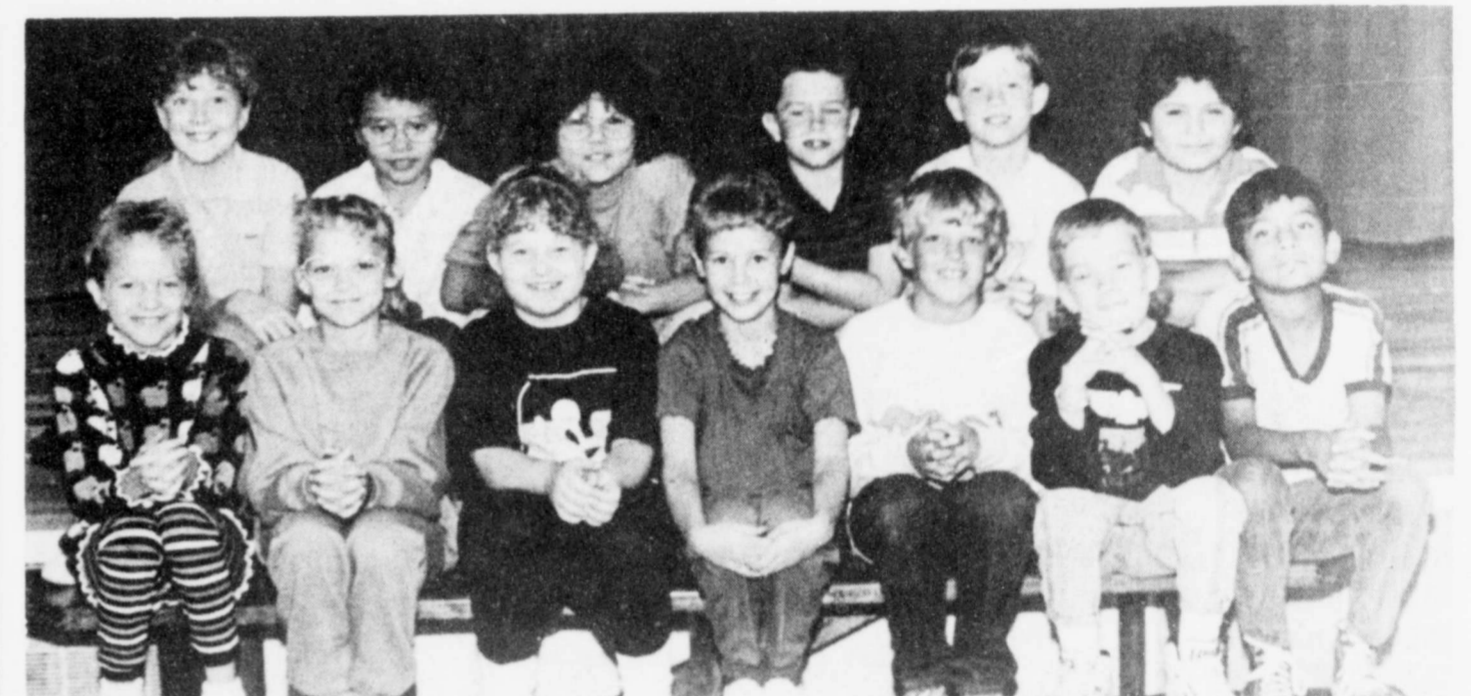
