The council wants to make it clear to the citizens of Lockney that the mobile home ordinance, if approved, will not affect any mobile homes that are already located in Lockney. It will only

A letter was read from Shelia Faulkenberry, of the Floyd County Appraisal Office, stating that the appraisal office could pay the cities portion of the attorneys fees in addition to the work that they now do for the city of Lockney. Terrell honored at state 4-H Roundup

J.T. "Buster" Terrell Jr. was among thirty volunteer 4-H leaders honored June 6 at the 1990 State 4-H Roundup at Texas A&M University.

Terrell received the Texas 4-H Salute to Excellence Award provided by the Texas 4-H Foundation, the service organization of the Texas Agricultural Extension Service 4-H Youth Development program.

He has been a leader of the Lockney 4-H Club for 22 years. As a youngster Terrell had a great interest in livestock projects and continued to provide leadership to 4-H'ers after he began college. Each year he provides training to over 200 young people interested in livestock.

Terrell was instrumental in establishing a \$500 Gold Star Award Scholarship in Floyd County and in organizing fund raisers that bring in over \$4,000 each year for 4-H programs.

He has served as president of the Plainview Young Farmers and Floyd County Fair Board, director of the Floyd County Junior Livestock Show, chairman of Extension Agricultural Committee and is a member of the Executive Board of the Extension Program.

Wheat crop rebounds after poor beginning

pounds but 80 to 85 percent is running from 57 to 62 pounds."

In the Providence community Warren Mathis said that the dry land wheat is running 30 to 35 bushels per acre. He stated that very little irrigated wheat has been cut and that in comparison to the dry land averages he is hoping for some 55 to 60 bushel wheat on the irrigated acres.

The price of wheat has fallen fifteen cents since the beginning of the harvest because of the estimate of a bumper harvest from all across the mid-west and hard winter wheat belt.

With the hot dry weather the wheat has ripened ahead of schedule and combines can be seen working far into the night.

Very few custom combine crews are in the county at the present time. They were working east of here and when they finished there they picked up and moved on north skipping this area. The hot dry weather has ripened the wheat on into Kansas.

Usually the farmers in the county are just getting started with the wheat around Father's Day and this year most good. Some has come in as light as 53 of the wheat will be cut by that time.

Terrell and Graham are eighth grade students at Lockney Junior High.


Gonzales earns second state title


Lori Gonzales was named State Champion for the second year in a row in the Basic Strut Division of the National Baton Twirlers Association State Twirling Contest.



Segrest said his buddy has a way of putting things in perspective. When the two were coaching in Monahans, they were sent to scout a game between Vernon and Littlefield. They found accommodations in the bed of a cotton trailer parked behind the Littlefield bench.

After Kelley and Segrest were reunited at Permian, they were dispatched to Houston to scout Permian's opponent for the upcoming state title game. Segrest said the surroundings were a bit better. "Kelley reached over and punched me and said, 'We've come a long way from that cotton trailer to the Astrodome, huh?""



By Mary Jane Shanes Recently much attention has focused other non-related individuals. on the difficulties of finding representative payees for some social security and SSI beneficiaries. It is particularly difficult to find payees who can act for homeless beneficiaries and for those with disabilities involving drug addiction or alcoholism.

A representative payee is someone appointed by Social Security to receive and manage benefit payments for the well-being of a beneficiary who is unable to manage his or her own benefit payments.

Most of the 1.2 million adults who need a payee are represented by a family member or by a public institution where they live. Others represented by close friends, State and county agencies, or

In recent years, members of volunteer organizations, such as the American Association of Retired Persons (AARP), have filled the growing need for recruiting interested, responsible payees.

Talks are underway between Social Security and other volunteer groups to expand the number of volunteer payees now available.

By Mary Jane Shanes Recently much attention has focused on the difficulties of finding representative payees for some social security and SSI beneficiaries. It is particularly difficult to find payees who can act for homeless beneficiaries and for those with disabilities involving drug addiction or alcoholism.

A representative payee is someone appointed by Social Security to receive and manage benefit payments for the well-being of a beneficiary who is unable to manage his or her own benefit payments.

Most of the 1.2 million adults who need a payee are represented by a family member or by a public institution where they live. Others represented by close

friends, State and county agencies, or other non-related individuals.

In recent years, members of volunteer organizations, such as the American Association of Retired Persons (AARP), have filled the growing need for recruiting interested, responsible payees.

Talks are underway between Social Security and other volunteer groups to expand the number of volunteer payees now available.
