## Some Floyd County residents may qualify for disaster aid

At the request of Texas Governor Bill Clements, President George Bush has declared that a major disaster exists in the State of Texas because of severe storms, flooding and tornadoes in some counties.

If you suffered storm damage on or after April 15, 1990, you may be eligible for state and federal disaster assistance. A toll free number has been set up to assist those filing claims. The number is 1-800-782-6681 and it will be in operation seven days a week. Hearing impaired persons may apply by using a telecommunications device for the deaf and calling the number 1-800-762-7983.

Possible areas in which assistance will be available include temporary housing grants, loans to repair damage to homes, personal property and businesses, grants for serious needs not met by other programs, emergency help

from voluntary agencies, assistance from a variety of local, state and federal agencies and loans for agricultural losses.

Before calling, have the following information ready: Your address at the time of the disaster and the address you are staying at now; your social security number, a list of the damages and losses you suffered; good directions to the damaged property; your insurance policy number or the agent's and company name, if insured.

Additional information may be available at emergency management offices. Disaster recovery assistance is available to any individual without regard to race, creed, color, sex, religion, national origin or handicap. Anyone who feels he or she has been discriminated against should contact the Federal Coordinating Officer or the State Coordinating Officer at once.

## Council considers mobile home ordinance

Mayor Dan Smith reported to the Lockney City Council that he had met with Paul Lyle, attorney for the city of Lockney, and that they had made a study of several mobile home ordinances in cities the size of Lockney and also several larger cities.

Lyle and Smith had taken what they considered to be the best of all the ordinances and put them together for the council to study. The council went over the proposed ordinance a paragraph at a time making comments and changes.

The council wants to make it clear to the citizens of Lockney that the mobile home ordinance, if approved, will not affect any mobile homes that are already located in Lockney. It will only

affect those persons requesting to move in a mobile home after the ordinance goes into effect.

The council also discussed setting up regulations for mobile home parks. They discussed lot sizes, roads, water, sewer, electricity, dumpsters, fire hydrants and other requirements as well as setting a license fee for the operation of such a park. The council was in agreement that the park must fit in with the neighborhood and that a plan for the establishment of a mobile home park would have to be presented for approval.

After the discussion they voted to send the revised ordinance back to Lyles to be rewritten. The rewritten

ordinance will be brought up at the next council meeting and if it meets with the approval of the council a public hearing will be held before a final decision is made.

Smith also told the council that Lyles had explained to him that if a zoning committee was not appointed that the city council automatically became the zoning committee. Smith stated that he thought that they should be the ones to do the job. The motion was made and seconded that the council also be the zoning committee. The vote was unanimous.

The council has been notified by the health department that in the near future tires will have to be shredded or cut in pieces before they can be dumped at the landfill. Smith said that he would talk to the tire dealers in town and see what could be worked out.

Discussion was held on recycling and the council decided to contact several recycling centers to see what suggestions they can offer.

Ron Comber, of Triple C Trash Removal, has told the council that there are still a large number of aluminum cans being sent to the landfill. The council would like to remind the residents of Lockney that the volunteer fire department is collecting these cans in a cotton trailer located on the south end of Main Street and that the money made from the sale of the cans will go towards purchasing a new ambulance for Lockney.

The council voted to replace the drapes in the council meeting room with mini-blinds. A bid from Lee's White

Auto for \$252.00 was accepted.

A letter was read from Shelia Faulkenberry, of the Floyd County Appraisal Office, stating that the appraisal office could pay the cities portion of the attorneys fees in addition to the work that they now do for the city of Lockney. Irma Lee Duckworth, city secretary, told the councilmen that the appraisal office sent a statement for the attorneys fees and that she wrote the check and sent it to the attorney firm of Perdue, Brandon and Fielder in Lubbock. After several questions and the assurance that a statement showing the amount paid the attorneys would be received from the appraisal office the council voted to let the appraisal district write the check.

Smith reported to the council that the city would have to buy a new fire truck in 1994. This would be the next major expenditure that the city would have to make. The present truck will be twenty years old in 1994 and the state will not certify a truck past twenty years old.

Discussion was held on the street sweeper and the maintenance that it takes to keep it running. Copeland told the group that if the streets were not swept regularly that it would cause the breakdown of the paving to occur quicker.

Included in the regular business of the meeting was the paying of the bills, and a review of the financial statement.

Present at the meeting were Mayor Dan Smith, Councilmen Kenneth Wolford, Gary Marr, J.D. Copeland, Sam Fortenberry, Jim Doucette, City Secretary Irma Lee Duckworth and the Beacon reporter.

## Local students urge congressman to support flag preservation

Mark Terrell and Justin Graham recently completed a project begun last summer concerning the desecration of the American flag.

They chose to circulate a petition supporting flag preservation as their project for the Citizenship Method Demonstration. This demonstration was presented at District Roundup in Lubbock on May 19. The petition was then forwarded to Congressman Bill Sarpalius.

At the start of the project Terrell called the Sarpalius office and was told by Sarpalius that when he received the petition that he would in turn present it to President George Bush.

The two boys wrote letters to the 256 4-H Clubs in Texas asking that the members sign their petition on 8X11 sheets of paper and return them. The Lockney 4-H members were enlisted to help fold, insert seal and stamp the let-

ters.

"I couldn't believe how many letters we got," commented Terrell.

Most of the responses were from small clubs and the average number of signatures per page was thirty. The Blue-ridge club outside of Dallas sent back a petition with nine names on it and the largest number of signatures came from the Campbell 4-H Club. Their petition had 495 signatures.

When all the petitions had been received the boys compiled all the pages into a book and sent it to Congressman Sarpalius.

Terrell and Graham are eighth grade students at Lockney Junior High.

The contest was held this past weekend in Fort Worth.

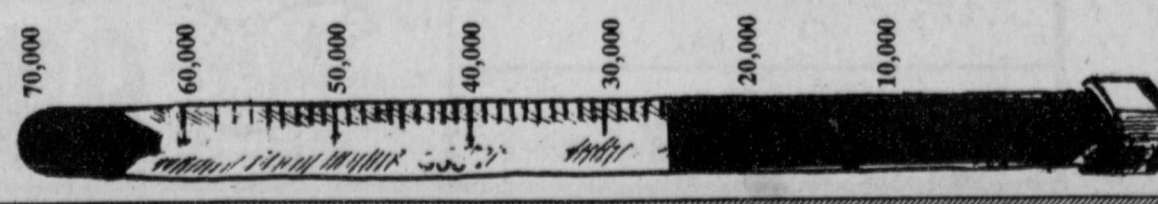
Miss Gonzales placed first in Basic Strut, second in Solo and fifth in Pageant in the 16 year old division.

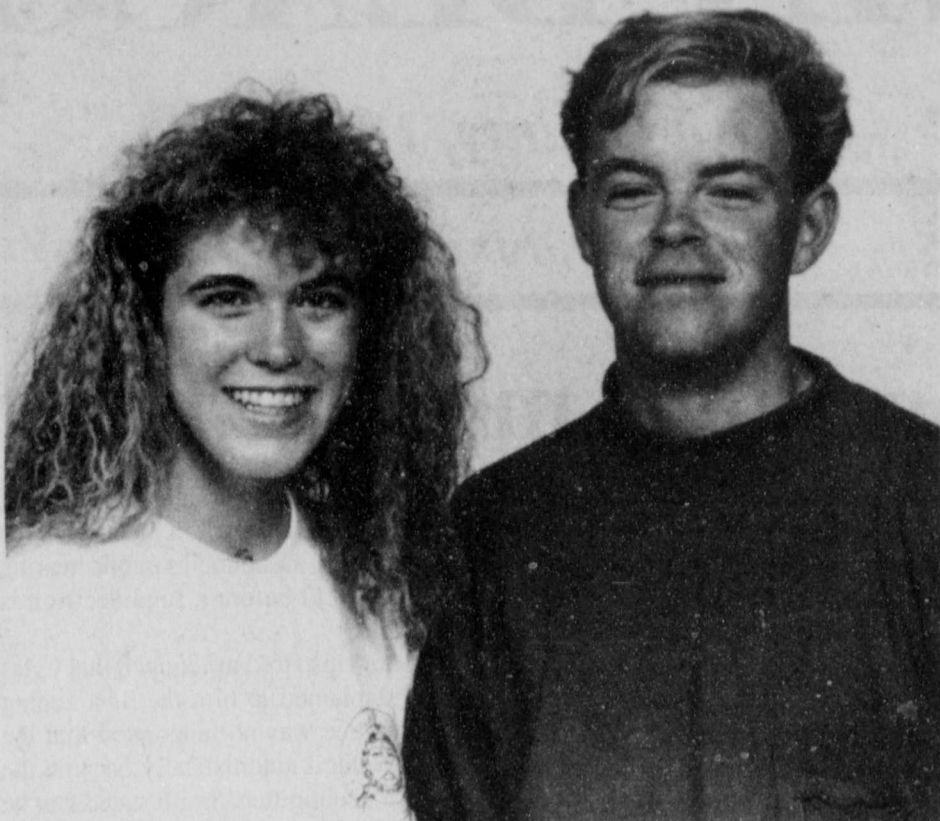

**4-H meet honors Lockney pair**

Lila Booker and Lance Patridge were named second place winners with their method demonstration on Electric Energy at the Texas 4-H Roundup held June 4-6 at Texas A&M University. Both students are members of the Lockney 4-H Club.

Along with Booker and Patridge nearly 450 4-H Club members from around the state were named winners at

the event. More than 2,400 young people participated in 41 contests at the biggest Texas 4-H event held each year.

In addition to the contests, 107 scholarships totaling \$591,000 were awarded to outstanding teens by the Texas 4-H Foundation, the service organization of the Texas Agricultural Extension Service 4-H Youth Development Program. Texas has the largest 4-H scholarship program in the country.

Scholarship recipients were judged on their 4-H experiences, leadership skills, projects, community service, personal need and academic performance.

A favorite part of Roundup is the 4-H Food Show. Contestants prepare dishes based on favorite recipes in one of four categories — nutritious snacks and desserts, fruits and vegetables, breads and cereals, and main dish. First place prizes were \$750 scholarships.

In 40 other contests ranging from agronomy and entomology to rifle shooting and talent skits, young people were judged according to their knowledge and skills. Many of the contests featured method demonstrations and illustrated talks.

"Roundup is a time to recognize outstanding young people as well as adult leaders, alumni and sponsors," said Gayle Hall Laine, 4-H youth specialist and Roundup coordinator. "It's an excellent learning opportunity for hundreds of young people."

**Retiree continues to have fun**

In his three decades as a coach, teacher and counselor, Ewell Dee Kelley has always been a favorite among his teen-age students. Maybe it's because he reminds them of themselves.

Even though he's on the brink of turning 60, Kelley has an impish grin and gleam in his eyes that tip off listeners to the fact that he's getting ready to say something funny. Some say he's just a big kid who has had plenty of time to amass a healthy collection of funny tales.

After today, Kelley also will be a civilian. He's retiring, but he won't be forgotten by lots of former students who consider themselves ex-officio relatives.

Odessa College Athletic Director James Segrest, a longtime partner in mischief and former coaching associate, has a drawl to his friend's seemingly eternal youthfulness. "It's makes you feel young when you're around kids."

But Segrest said the respect isn't restricted to the younger generation. "He's a good man. Everybody loves him."

Indeed, Kelley's wife, Dot, said her husband made such an impression during his six years at Monahans High School that he gets invitations to class reunions, an honor seldom accorded former teachers. In turn, Kelley regales the ex-students with his stories.

Most of the narratives are sports-related. And with good reason. Kelley was the first Lockney High School football player to be selected to the all-state team. He might have learned something about relating to students at that point since his coach also was his older brother, Curtis.

After graduating from West Texas State in 1954, Kelley embarked on the coaching career that would take him to Rankin, Monahans and Odessa. At Monahans, he was head junior varsity football coach and Segrest was his assistant.

Kelley later came to Odessa and took a job at Bonham Junior High School so he could finish work on his master's degree. He joined Gil Bartosh's football staff at Permian in 1971. He got a chance to return the favor to Segrest by becom-

ing the Panther's assistant track coach.

After Mojo won the 1972 state football championship, Kelley hung up his whistle in mid-term 1973 to go into vocational counseling. The rest of his career has been spent coaching students in the game of life.

Odessa High School Principal Raymond Starnes calls Kelley "the all-time character" at OHS. "He could talk the bumps off a pickle," Starnes said. "But from a professional standpoint, he ... relates well to people, not just to the students but everybody. He will be sorely missed. He is very dependable and he does it having fun. Ewell has to harass you or he's not getting his message across."

Segrest said his buddy has a way of putting things in perspective. When the two were coaching in Monahans, they were sent to scout a game between Vernon and Littlefield. They found accommodations in the bed of a cotton trailer parked behind the Littlefield bench.

After Kelley and Segrest were reunited at Permian, they were dispatched to Houston to scout Permian's opponent for the upcoming state title game. Segrest said the surroundings were a bit better. "Kelley reached over and punched me and said, 'We've come a long way from that cotton trailer to the Astrodome, huh?'"

One of the endearing things about Kelley is his delivery. To say that he has a drawl is to say that Odessa can be a bit dusty in the spring. A favorite story is

Recently much attention has focused on the difficulties of finding representative payees for some social security and SSI beneficiaries. It is particularly difficult to find payees who can act for homeless beneficiaries and for those with disabilities involving drug addiction or alcoholism.

A representative payee is someone appointed by Social Security to receive and manage benefit payments for the well-being of a beneficiary who is unable to manage his or her own benefit payments.

Most of the 1.2 million adults who need a payee are represented by a family member or by a public institution where they live. Others represented by close

friends, State and county agencies, or other non-related individuals.

In recent years, members of volunteer organizations, such as the American Association of Retired Persons (AARP), have filled the growing need for recruiting interested, responsible payees.

Talks are underway between Social Security and other volunteer groups to expand the number of volunteer payees now available.

Q - My ex-husband and I were married for 33 years before we were divorced in 1989. He recently passed away. Am I eligible for VA benefits as his survivor?  
A - No. "Surviving spouse" means the lawful spouse of a veteran at the time of his or her death. He or she must have lived with the veteran continuously until the date of death except when there was a separation caused by the veteran without fault of the spouse.  
Q - What is a Presidential Memorial Certificate?  
A - A Presidential Memorial Certificate expresses the country's grateful recognition of an individual's service in the armed forces and bears the signature of the President. These certificates are available to next of kin of deceased eligible veterans or persons who were on active military duty at time of death. Next of kin need not apply for a certificate.

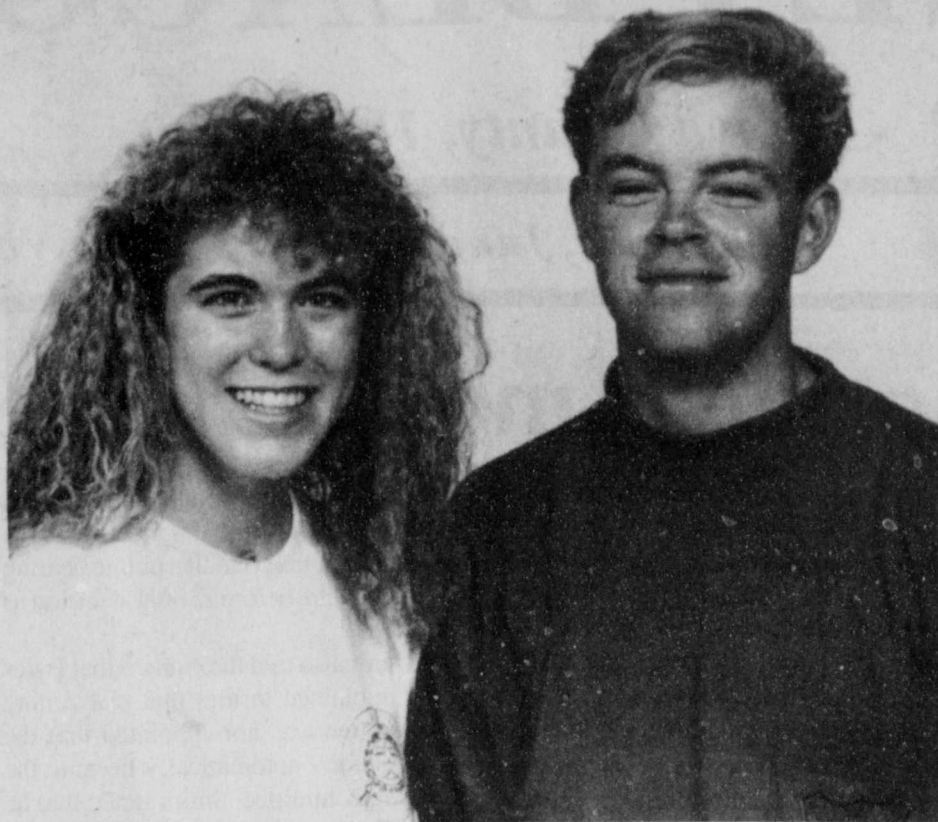

**4-H meet honors Lockney pair**

Lila Booker and Lance Patridge were named second place winners with their method demonstration on Electric Energy at the Texas 4-H Roundup held June 4-6 at Texas A&M University. Both students are members of the Lockney 4-H Club.

Along with Booker and Patridge nearly 450 4-H Club members from around the state were named winners at

the event. More than 2,400 young people participated in 41 contests at the biggest Texas 4-H event held each year.

In addition to the contests, 107 scholarships totaling \$591,000 were awarded to outstanding teens by the Texas 4-H Foundation, the service organization of the Texas Agricultural Extension Service 4-H Youth Development Program. Texas has the largest 4-H scholarship program in the country.

Scholarship recipients were judged on their 4-H experiences, leadership skills, projects, community service, personal need and academic performance.

A favorite part of Roundup is the 4-H Food Show. Contestants prepare dishes based on favorite recipes in one of four categories — nutritious snacks and desserts, fruits and vegetables, breads and cereals, and main dish. First place prizes were \$750 scholarships.

In 40 other contests ranging from agronomy and entomology to rifle shooting and talent skits, young people were judged according to their knowledge and skills. Many of the contests featured method demonstrations and illustrated talks.

"Roundup is a time to recognize outstanding young people as well as adult leaders, alumni and sponsors," said Gayle Hall Laine, 4-H youth specialist and Roundup coordinator. "It's an excellent learning opportunity for hundreds of young people."

**Retiree continues to have fun**

In his three decades as a coach, teacher and counselor, Ewell Dee Kelley has always been a favorite among his teen-age students. Maybe it's because he reminds them of themselves.

Even though he's on the brink of turning 60, Kelley has an impish grin and gleam in his eyes that tip off listeners to the fact that he's getting ready to say something funny. Some say he's just a big kid who has had plenty of time to amass a healthy collection of funny tales.

After today, Kelley also will be a civilian. He's retiring, but he won't be forgotten by lots of former students who consider themselves ex-officio relatives.

Odessa College Athletic Director James Segrest, a longtime partner in mischief and former coaching associate, has a clue to his friend's seemingly eternal youthfulness. "It's makes you feel young when you're around kids."

But Segrest said the retiree isn't restricted to the younger generation. "He's a good man. Everybody loves him."

Indeed, Kelley's wife, Dot, said her husband made such an impression during his six years at Monahans High School that he gets invitations to class reunions, an honor seldom accorded former teachers. In turn, Kelley regales the ex-students with his stories.

Most of the narratives are sports-related. And with good reason. Kelley was the first Lockney High School football player to be selected to the all-state team. He might have learned something about relating to students at that point since his coach also was his older brother, Curtis.

After graduating from West Texas State in 1954, Kelley embarked on the coaching career that would take him to Rankin, Monahans and Odessa. At Monahans, he was head junior varsity football coach and Segrest was his assistant.

Kelley later came to Odessa and took a job at Bonham Junior High School so he could finish work on his master's degree. He joined Gil Bartosh's football staff at Permian in 1971. He got a chance to return the favor to Segrest by becoming

the Panther's assistant track coach.

After Mojo won the 1972 state football championship, Kelley hung up his whistle in mid-term 1973 to go into vocational counseling. The rest of his career has been spent coaching students in the game of life.

Odessa High School Principal Raymond Starnes calls Kelley "the all-time character" at OHS. "He could talk the bumps off a pickle," Starnes said. "But from a professional standpoint, he ... relates well to people, not just to the students but everybody. He will be sorely missed. He is very dependable and he does it having fun. Ewell has to harass you or he's not getting his message across."

Segrest said his buddy has a way of putting things in perspective. When the two were coaching in Monahans, they were sent to scout a game between Vernon and Littlefield. They found accommodations in the bed of a cotton trailer parked behind the Littlefield bench.

After Kelley and Segrest were reunited at Permian, they were dispatched to Houston to scout Permian's opponent for the upcoming state title game. Segrest said the surroundings were a bit better. "Kelley reached over and punched me and said, 'We've come a long way from that cotton trailer to the Astro dome, huh?'"

One of the endearing things about Kelley is his delivery. To say that he has a drawl is to say that Odessa can be a bit dusty in the spring. A favorite story is

## Social Security News

Recently much attention has focused on the difficulties of finding representative payees for some social security and SSI beneficiaries. It is particularly difficult to find payees who can act for homeless beneficiaries and for those with disabilities involving drug addiction or alcoholism.

A representative payee is someone appointed by Social Security to receive and manage benefit payments for the well-being of a beneficiary who is unable to manage his or her own benefit payments.

Most of the 1.2 million adults who need a payee are represented by a family member or by a public institution where they live. Others represented by close

friends, state and county agencies, or other non-related individuals.

In recent years, members of volunteer organizations, such as the American Association of Retired Persons (AARP), have filled the growing need for recruiting interested, responsible payees.

Talks are underway between Social Security and other volunteer groups to expand the number of volunteer payees now available.

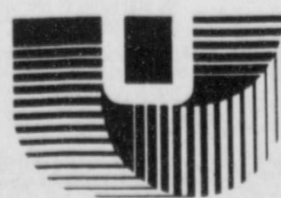

## VA Questions & Answers

**Q** - My ex-husband and I were married for 33 years before we were divorced in 1989. He recently passed away. Am I eligible for VA benefits as his survivor?

**A** - No. "Surviving spouse" means the lawful spouse of a veteran at the time of his or her death. He or she must have lived with the veteran continuously until the date of death except when there was a separation caused by the veteran without fault of the spouse.

**Q** - What is a Presidential Memorial Certificate?

**A** - A Presidential Memorial Certificate expresses the country's grateful recognition of an individual's service in the armed forces and bears the signature of the President. These certificates are available to next of kin of deceased eligible veterans or persons who were on active military duty at time of death. Next of kin need not apply for a certificate.
