DPS urges caution for travelers this Labor Day holiday

The Texas Department of Public Safety has estimated that as many as 40
persons could be killed in traffic accidents across the state during the 78 -hour Labor Day holiday period. "Last year during this end-of-the-
summer holiday, 48 personsdied summerhoiday, 48 persons died in traf
fic accidents, with another four persons dying later of injuries received during this time," said DPS Director Col. JocE. Milner. "Our estimate for this year is
below that ninal count of 52 , and we hope the actual number of deaths this year will be much lower than this year
mate."
The holiday counting period begins a 6 p.m. Friday, August 31 and continues until midnight on Monday, September certain other major holidays, and D certain other major holidays, the DPS
will have all available Troopers on will have all available Troopers on the
highways to ensure that motorists have as safe a holiday as possible.
"Since drinking and driving, along with speeding, are the leading causes of traffic fatalities, we hope we can hol the Labor Day deaths down by our in creased presence on the highways, Milner said. "Wecertainly don t want

during their working careers should sure to check their Social Security rec ords to verify that all their earning are credited correctly
Married women who are self-em ployed need to check their records care
fully fully too. According to the Internal
Revenue Service, some married who filed a joint tax return and were self-employed under their maiden names may not have their earnings recorded correctly.
Name changes should be reported to a person's employer and to the Social
Security Administration so that anew Security Administration so that a new
Social Security card can be issued. The new card will have the same number as the old card.
Although these steps should insure that a woman's earnings get recorded correctly, itis still a good idea to send for
a review one's earnings a review one's earnings statement every
three years. Emrors can usually be three years. Errors can usualy
rected if they are identified early, To get an earnings statement, Social Security and ask for Form SSA 7004. Complete the form and mail it in. The statement will be sent in a few weeks. And the service is free. Social Security's phone number is 1-800

Pack a safe school lunch
More than 23 million American chil
dren will start taking their lunches when school opens soon, and whether the food is safe to eat may depend on how it's prepared. A nutritionist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service says that food
borne illness is a bigger problem than borne illness is a bigger problem than
most people think. Between 24 and 81 most people think. Between 24 and 81
million cases of this disease are reported each year.
"The best defense against food-borne illness is safe food handling practices," Dr. Mary Kinney Sweeten said. "This
means taking precautions every time food is prepared."
Sweeten advises those who pack lunches for school, work, trips or other events to follow these tips: * Keep everything that touches food
clean. Stop and washutensis bow clean. Stop and wash utensils, bowls and counter tops - everything that touches
food - in between working on each food
dish.
${ }^{*}$ Use a fork, not your hands to mix meat, macaroni, egg, tuna or green
salad. Your hands continually pick up salad. Your hands continually pick up
bacteria and other germs that get into bacteria and other germs that get into
fingermails and in the creased skin of the fingermails and in the creased skin of the hands. Only vigorous washing with hot, soapy water prep

chips and cookies and cold drinks the following morning.
It is always best to refrigerate your lunch, but since most children have no way to refrigerate their lunch at school Sweeten suggests following these tips to keep food cold:

with water and frozen, or one of the new commercial gels. Also, some lunch boxes now come with freeze pack in serts.
${ }^{*}$ Freeze sandwiches. This works best with coarse, textured breads that won' get soggy when thawing. The sandwich thaws in time for lunch, and it keeps everything else cook in the meantime. Sandwich extras - lettuce, tomato and mayonnaise -
