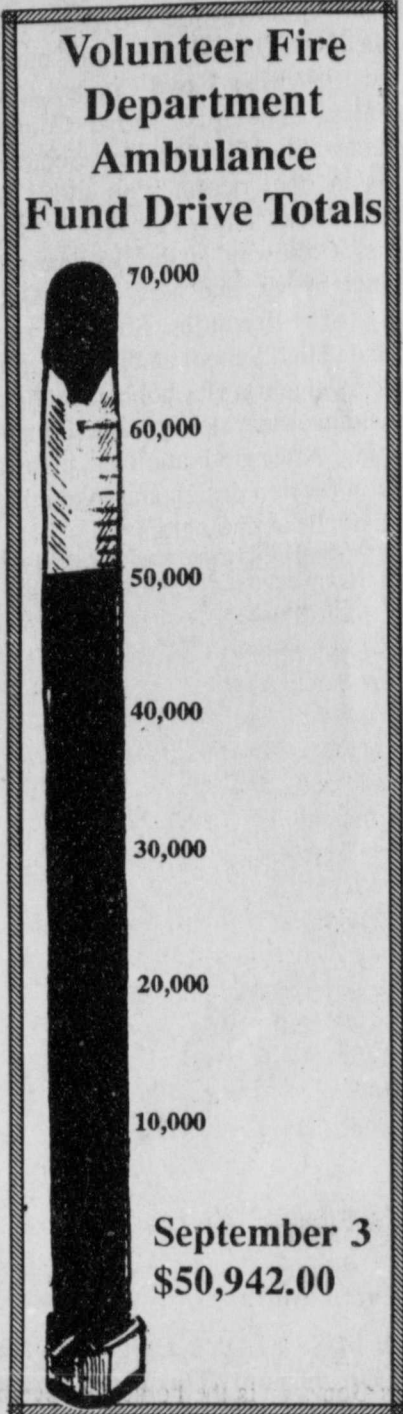

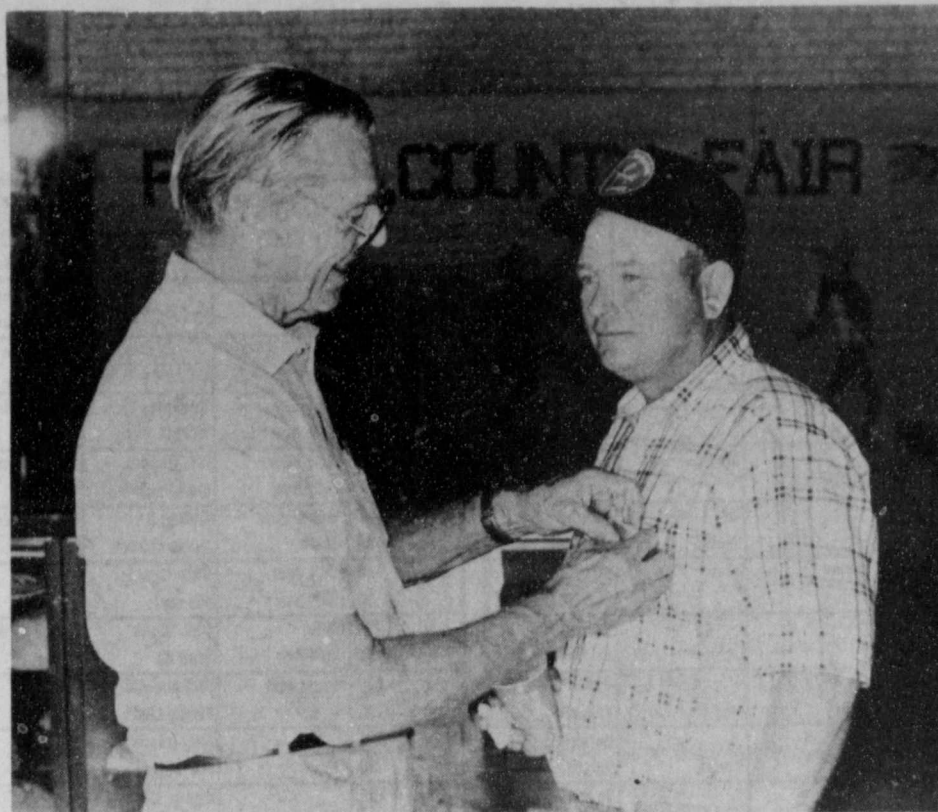

Social Security News

People who receive Social Security or Supplemental Security Income (SSI) checks often become alarmed if they do not get their checks in the mail on time. More than 39 million Social Security and 4.6 million SSI payments are usually made timely every month, but occasionally some checks are delayed.

Social security checks are usually delivered on the 3rd of the month. If the 3rd falls on a Saturday, Sunday, or legal holiday, the checks are delivered on the last banking day before then. For example, September 3, 1990, is a holiday so Social Security checks will be delivered on Friday, August 31. November 3, 1990, falls on a Saturday so checks will be delivered on Friday, November 2, 1990.

SSI checks should arrive on the 1st of the month unless, of course, the 1st falls

on a weekend or holiday. Then they'll be delivered the last banking day before the weekend or holiday. September 1 and December 1, 1990, fall on Saturday so SSI checks will be delivered on Friday, August 31 and Friday, November 30.

People should allow 3 full days from the expected delivery date for their Social Security or SSI checks to arrive. Generally, if a Social Security check isn't received by the 6th of the month or an SSI check isn't received until the 4th of a month, give us a call. We'll correct the problem as quickly as we can.

A sure way to avoid late checks is by signing up for direct deposit. There's no worry about lost or stolen checks and you won't have to wait at the mailbox for your check or wait in line at the bank to cash it.

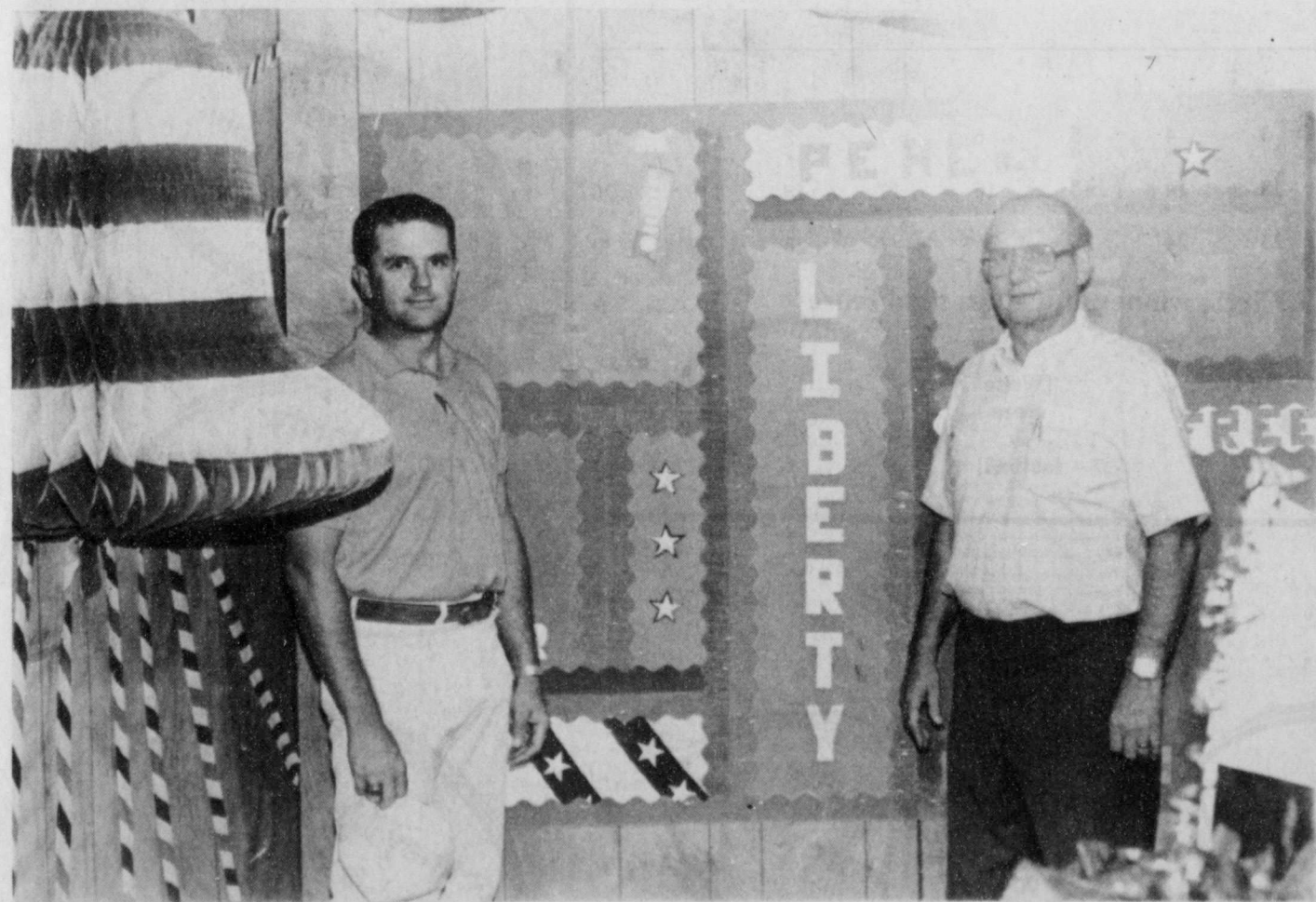

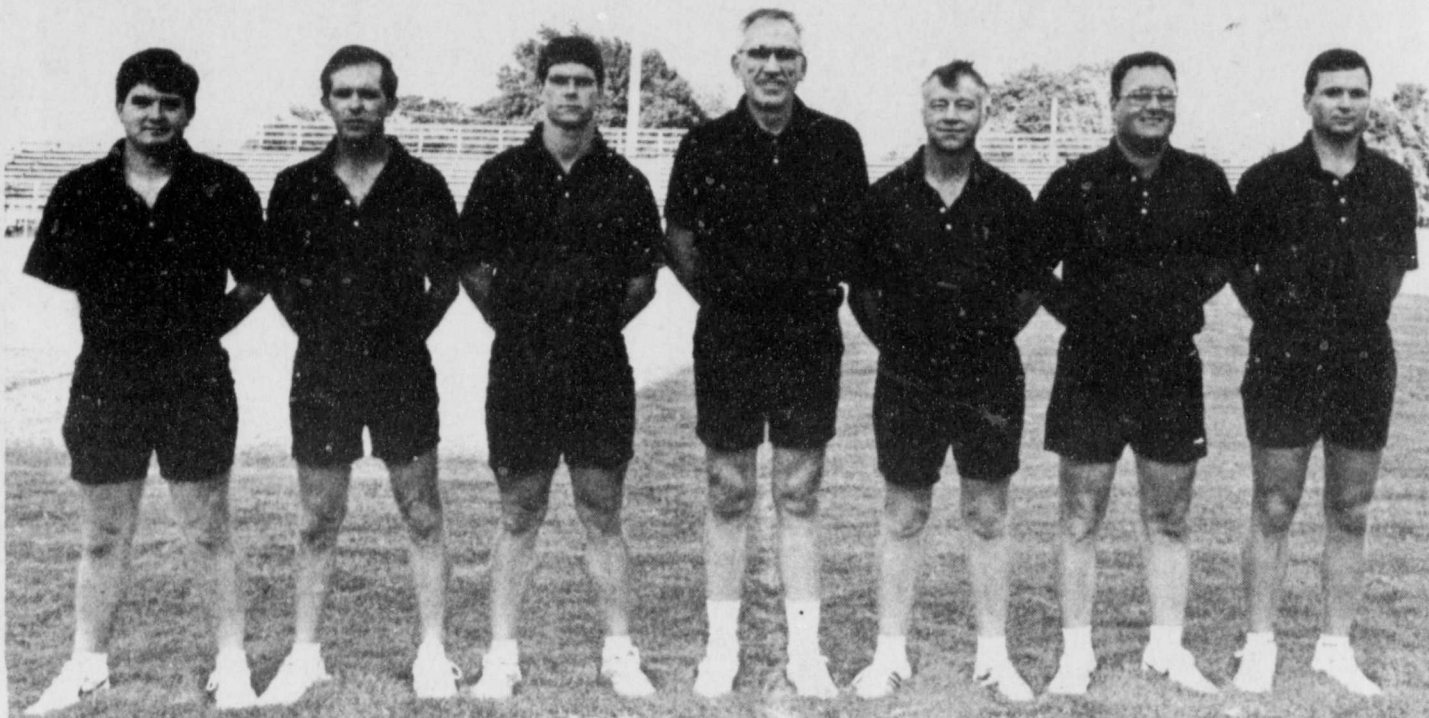
