## Absentee balloting now underway in Floyd County

Absentee voting is underway in Floyd County. Voters wishing to vote before the November 6 election can do so now through Friday, November 2, at the Floyd County Clerks Office, in the Floyd County Courthouse.

The extended absentee voting period

provides Floyd County voters with additional days to vote, instead of just one election day.

In the November 6 general election, Texans will choose a new governor, lieutenant governor, other top state officers and local officials.

## Local sales tax rebates are down from last year

The City of Lockney received a check totaling \$4,747.48 from the Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts. This check was down 35.84 percent from the money received last year at this same time. The check in 1989 was in the amount of \$7,399.80.

To date Lockney has received \$40,775.48. This amount is down 30.32 percent from the \$58,520.91 that the city received in 1989 for the same time period.

The check received by Floydada was in the amount of \$8,879.15 This amount is up 12.14 percent from the \$7,917.69 that was received in 1989. To date Floydada has received \$92,038.06. This amount is down 0.90 percent from the \$92,877.33 that they received in 1989.

This months checks include sales taxes collected on August sales and reported in September by businesses filing monthly tax returns.

Merchants collect the taxes and send them to the Comptroller's office with their tax returns. The state keeps its 6 percent share and each month sends cities and counties their portion of the sales tax.

All local sales taxes must be approved by local voters and may be used for any legal city expense. The City of Lockney puts the money they receive in their General Fund and use it for operations such as the fire department, law enforcement and maintaining streets and alleys.

Crosbyton received a check totaling \$5,571.39 which is up 12.69 percent from the \$4,944.14 that they received in 1989. To date they have received \$56,312.99 which is up 28.74 percent over the \$43,742.33 that they received in 1989.

Ralls received a check for \$4,545.83 which is up 21.56 percent from the \$3,739.59 that they received in 1989 for the same time period. To date they have received \$47,061.01 which is up 4.49 percent from the \$45,040.12 that they received in 1989.

Silverton received a check in the amount of \$1,500.75 which is up 28.92 percent over the \$1,164.13 that they received in 1989. To date they have received \$15,605.16 which is up 6.91 percent over the \$14,596.92 that they received in 1989.

Hale Center received a check in the amount of \$2,950.23 which is down 13.68 percent from the \$3,417.61 that they received in 1989. To date they have received \$30,816.58 which is down 39.59 percent from the \$49,376.20 that they received in 1989.

Plainview received a check this month for \$162,194.60. This is down 17.45 percent from the \$169,475.46 that they received over the same time period in 1989. To date Plainview has received \$1,683,277.23 which is down 1.53 percent from the \$1,709,458.11 that they received in 1989.

Lubbock has received a check totaling \$1,214,759.18 which is up 10.06 percent over the \$1,103,735.05 that they received in 1989. To date Lubbock has received \$12,784,714.24 which is up 2.83 percent over the \$12,432,510.51 that they received in 1989 for the same time period.

## Former Lockney Beacon owner dies

Services for Edgar R. Hays, 79, of Nocona, were held Wednesday, October 17, 1990 in the First Baptist Church of Nocona with the Rev. Orville Rogers officiating.

Burial was in the Montague Cemetery under the direction of Scott-Morris Funeral Home.

Mr. Hays died at home Sunday, October 14, 1990.

He was born May 16, 1911 in Montague, Texas. His parents were William Thomas and Josie Woodall Hays. He married Lillie Leone Garlington November 2, 1935 at Bowie.

Mr. Hays was the owner and editor of the Lockney Beacon from 1942 until 1962. He purchased the Nocona News in 1966 and ran it until 1977.

He was a member of the Baptist church for 65 years and attended Wayland Baptist College in Plainview. He served as a deacon in the First Baptist Church in Lockney and in Nocona. He was ordained in 1942. He served both churches as Sunday School teacher and director and Training Union Director.

He was a member of the Lockney

Chamber of Commerce and Nocona Chamber of Commerce. In 1974 he received the Distinguished Service Award from the Nocona Junior Chamber of Commerce.

Hayes was an active member of the Nocona Golf Club.

Mr. Hays was a member of the Rotary Club for 48 years. He was a Paul Harris Fellow and past president of the Lockney and Nocona clubs.

Survivors include his wife; a son, William Thomas (Bill) III of Grapevine; two daughters, Barbara June Merrell of Southlake and Janice Carol Varnell of Duncanville; two sisters, Lois Hansen of Austin and Alma Cochran of Montague; six grandchildren and 3 great-grandchildren.

## Christmas mailing dates for overseas and military mail

"MAIL EARLY." That's what the U.S. Postal Service is advising all Americans to do again this holiday season, especially with mail intended for their loved ones overseas. "With the military build-up in Saudi Arabia, we're expecting a big strain to be placed on our mail transportation system worldwide," says Allen Kane, Assistant Postmaster General for Delivery, Distribution and Transportation.

"With the massive mailing effort going on with Operation Desert Shield, transportation and processing capabilities will be extremely tight this holiday season," adds Kane. "The Postal Service will be moving a tremendous volume of holiday mail overseas. To ensure timely delivery, customers should send their cards, letters and packages bound for military and international locations as early as possible."

Cards and letters travel overseas by Air Mail/Priority only. To mail packages to any military overseas destination, customers can choose Airlift Mail (PAL), or Space Available Mail (SAM). Information on the cost of these services can be obtained from your local post office.

For the fastest delivery, Express Mail Military Service is an option available to more than 200 APO and FPO facilities. Customers can also choose to mail with Express Mail International Service, available to more than 100 countries.

In terms of mailing within the United States, there is no specific deadline, but the Postal Service recommends that you send your holiday mail by early December. Typically, the largest mail volumes come during the week before Christmas.

"Mailing early ensures timely delivery and is important in the event winter storms delay air and ground transportation," says Kane. "Plus, it gives your friends and relatives more time to appreciate your gifts and holiday greetings."

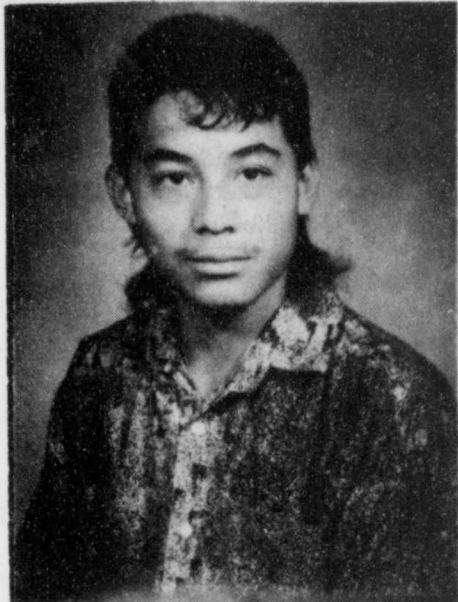


## Happenings at LHS

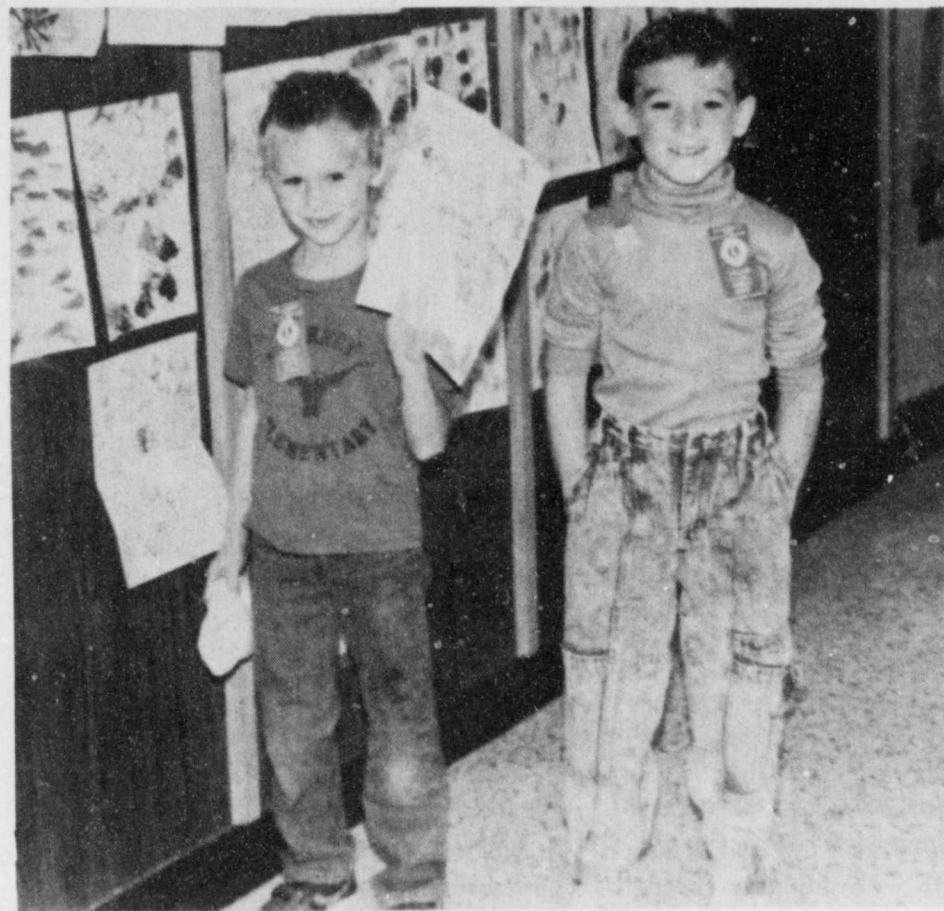

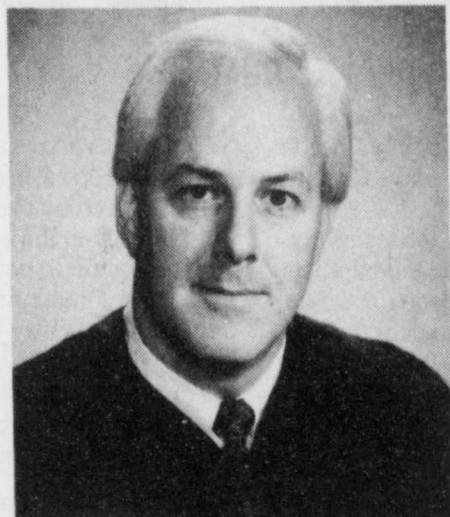

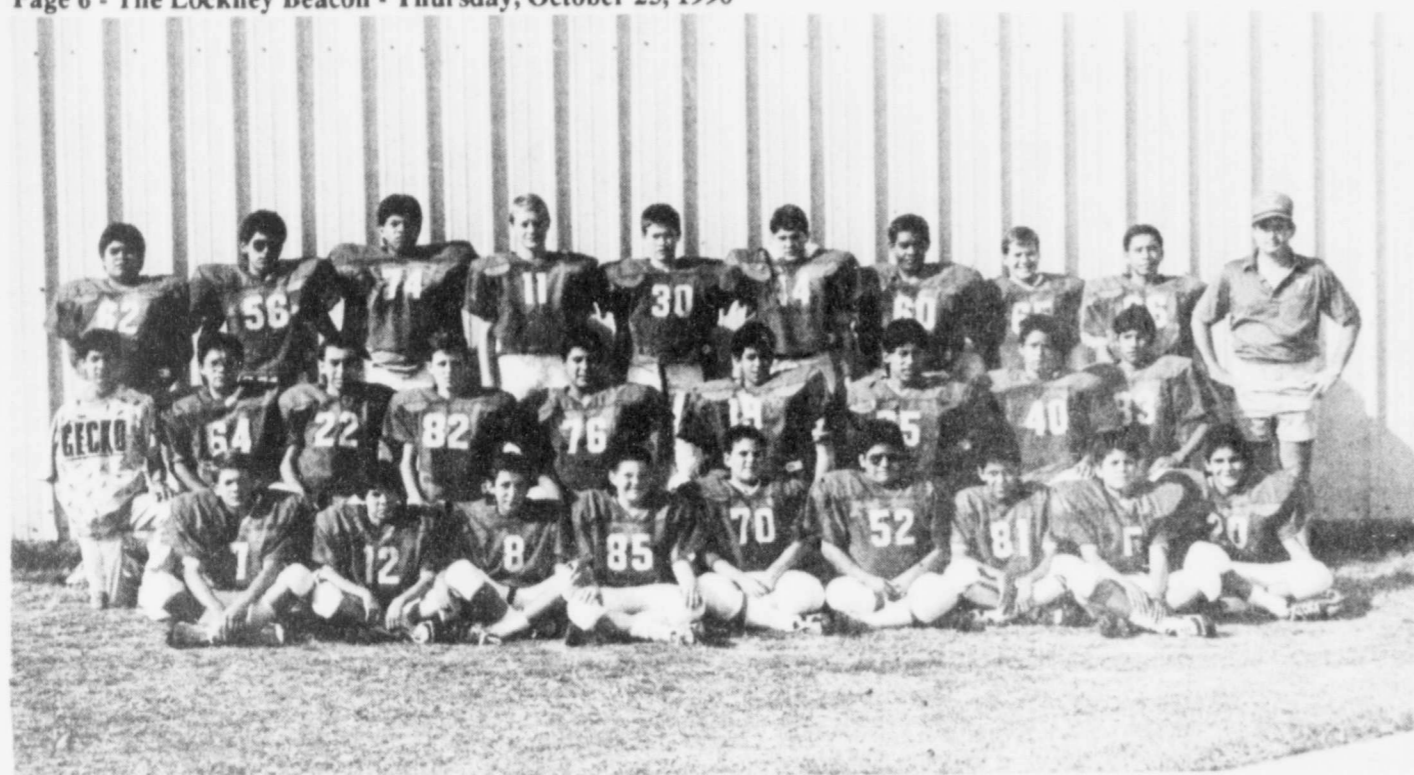
