THE LICENSE SYSTEM.
Without controversey, the liquor question is one that has for many years commanded the attention and thought of our wisest
men. In this country we have evolved three methods of dealing men. In this country we have evolved three methods of dealing
with the evila license, dispensary and prohibition. With the first of these this article proposes to deal briefly

This government was founded on the principle of the great est good to the greatest number. Its revolt against Englan was on the ground that there should be no taxation without rep
resentation; but as a free nation,. the American people were ready and willing to bear the burden, of taxation to sustain system of indirect taxation was evolved, and later came the licensing and legalization of the liquor traffic as a war measure weight of its influence for the bettering of the people. It ha restricted Chinese imigration; has passed wise laws for the pro at home and abroad; it punishes theft, murder, arson and a mul titude of otber crimes; it builds jails, asylums and almshouse for the benefit of its criminal and untortunate population; it eve the Paciffic; and them, wonder of wonders, the national govern ment as well as the governments of a majority of the
states, LICENSES the one thing that brings about more of the evil conditions against which the arm of the government is rais ed than any other
States says that permission. The Supreme Court of the United not the prixilege of a citizen of a state or of the United States,
not and the only way in which the traftic can be carried on with any
shade of legitimiacy is by some form of license. In other words, a permission for a price to commit'a known wrong. If the gov
ernment of Texas was for a price to license a band of muderers andirobbers; that government, would be resposible for the crime committed upon its people; and bv the saue logic, the govern-
ment of Texas is today the murderer of its own people through the saloon, licensed and protected by the government of Texas. Bro. do you realize what it is for this state, this nation to be a part cepts part of the profits as revenue. The saloon may rob, you of a soni or a daughter, but you dare not lift a finger against it be cause it is protected by our flag.
Some people tell us that we can't stop the business and we may just as well, get some revenue from it. Suppose we can't price make legally right what is morally wrong, and violate the scripture that tells us that we must not put the bottle to our neighbor's lips. Yet that is what we are doing today.
The National Protibition platform declared in 1888 that any trary to good government, and that any party that supports it en ters into alliance therewith; and again in 1900, that the revenue policy which makes our government a partner with the distiller and brewers and barkeepers is a disgrace to our civilization, an outrage upon humanity and a crime against God. Horace GreeIy said years ago in the New York Tribune that any talk about timony on the license system. Now isten to the other Pet Iller, distiller, Nebraska, says "High License has not burt our business, but on the contrary has been of great benefit to it,"

Abundant other testimony might be adduced from leading men
from all shades of opinion showing the fallure as well as the wrong of the license system, but space forbids.
When the first license law was introduced in Congress it was fought by leading men of the Party that today in National affiairs nourishes and protects it, because they saw it would make the
government a partner in the saloon business. Now, both parties uphold and sanction the system. The legislature of the state of Texas da not ask the people io yote on whether they should pass a license law or not, but they faste
got to get rid of it as best we can.
Now, brother voter, is the license system right or wrong Will you vote for local prohibition and then tote to continue power the party that is responsible for every licensed saloon in
Texas?
