THE PLAINS COEXTRY.
A. S. Henry says Conditions Are Favorable, but the People Complain of the Lack of Yearling Steer Buyers Up There.
A. S. Henry is here this week, aving returned from a business Speaking of conditions as he found them in that section, Mr. Henry said:

I find the grass conditions as good as I have seen at any tume during the past four years, er than I have seen them during the same period of time The feed crops, a portion of which are mature, bave made an a verage yield. "The younger portion of the eed crops is in good growing
ondition, and with the receut rains that have fallen in that section, will make a good yield. In the main, I found both the rass and crops much greener
than in this section, especially in Lubbock, Lynn, Terry aud "The "anly.
he people of that section wa merket for heir fat cattle. not been a sod that tbere had section buying yearlings this season. In fact, they are in the midst of plenty, and yet
on the boundary of a famine, because they cannot realize money on auytting they bave
for sale, which condition seems to be brought about by the present prevailing low prices
for aly classes of cattle. My anderstanding is that a buyer an go into that section and buy rood yearling steersat from $\$ 13$ 0 \$1350 arround.
"From my observation the yearlings of that section are the cartle generally are all high grades.
"The Plaius countien are all $\bar{a}$ re entancing ip vaiue and go ing into cultivation to a very
large extent. That coun try is fast developing into and the people are reasonably prosperous and happy.
"There is a good per cent o two year old steers in that sec
tion yet unsold. My under standiag is that Lake, Tomb \& Co. mone of, the largest out-fits in that part of the state, have
sold none of their twos this sold none of their twos this spring, but will carry them all
over. I was told also, that this over. I was told also, that this rangements to movetheir en rangements to move their en
tire holdings to the Northwest, a part of which will be shipped out this fall.
"Close observation leads me to predict that the Plains-country, it being in the main very
tich soil, will within the next five years be owned in bodies of from one to 20 sections, and the class of cattle will be improved and fed more, and better cared or in a general way. When these conditions obtain, there will be double the number of cattle carried on those range as there are at this time

They are fed poisoned grain as long as they can be induced to partake of the offering, and then the remvant is treated with bisulphide of carbon, which is placed in their butrow and the entrance felled in. The fumes of the car-
bon penetrate to the very low est depths of the burrow, and are very deadly in their effects upon the dogs. A sharp watcb
is kept of the entire pasture, and when even a few dogs are discovered proper steps are immediately taken for their exter-
mination.
