With this issue Vol. VII. No. 52, The Canyon City News, as the lawful successor of The Stayer, completes its eighth year as a recorder of events on the plains. Its proof of occupancy reading back to the spring of '96, covers a period of time in which is embraced the history of several newspapers that "once lived" within its sphere of action. . What is now the Canyon City News was then "The Stayer" and included among those papers which once figured as its rivals are to be found "The Battle-ship" and "The Head-Light"-but all-of them are gone now, leaving the News, as lawful issue of "The Stayer," in sole possession of the field. If great names speak of high resolves, and they generally do, what can be said of "The Battle-ship" and "The Head-Light" that "did live" and of "The Stayer" that was and is now? Surely, they are heroic names, all of them; 'names almast without exception linked in memory with great deeds and speaking of tumultous times; periods in which the palms of victory were worn, and periods when reverses were borne with fortitude and in which the crosses of lite were endured. Such is pioneer life generally and perhaps, no class of people feel its privations more keenly or do more toward straightening out its difficulties and polishing its roughness, than do those who
