Mayor L. G. Manning announced this week that the city of Dimmitt still has funds to participate in pavement programs on opened for business Monday, Febstreets where property owners are interested in paving.

Property owners on streets, contemplating a paving program, should petition the city for pavement at the earliest possible date, Mayor Manning stated. The contract with the construction company that did the paving work in Dimmitt last year is still in force and can be invoked for any additional paving desired in the city. The city pays ten percent of the overall paving cost with the property owners on both sides of the street adjacent to the pavement participating equally in the balance of the expense. There are illo. possibly a number of blocks of pavement still needed in Dimmitt and it is pointed out that this is the opportune time to pave.
