Cool weather slows up the defoliation process, explains the special ist. This is listed as weather when night temperatures are constantly below 50 degrees F. and day temperatures are below 70 degrees F. Maturity is not speeded up by the use of defoliants, points out Elliott. For all practical purposes, maturity of the cotton fiber stops when defoliants or desiccants are applied, depending upon the coverage obtined. Bolls have ben noted to open sconer in treated fields, but fiber from the treated cotton was not more mature, Elliott said. Some growers have found that if frost has not occurred by about Cotober 20 and if plant and weather conditions are normal, the use of a defoliant or desiccant about two weeks ahead of the average first frost—usually the first week in November—ean be considered. 


