In some respects these newspapers are right and in many others they are woefully wrong. That it an injury to the country generwould much of the country pe in without towns haw how towns exist without business men or merchants? We all know that the nearer to town a farm is the more it will sell for and that the farther away it is from town the less the price. And sö of town property it selt. The better the town the more the property is worth and hence all property owners, aside from merchants, are as vitally in terested in the town, in fact more so frequently, than are some of the business men. The business man if a renter and in this country many of them are, can move when the harvest isyover, the property
holder must stay and bear the loss, holder must stay and bear the loss,
if any there be. Hence, applying this rule, which is certainly a correct ne, the nearer a man lives to a town the greater his interests are in its growth and prosperity and there, all things being equal or nearly so, he should spend his monéy. Where merchants prosper ll other lines do well. More peo ple are employed, more houses are built and all these things build up he town, better the churches, the schools, the preachers, the lawyers and all other professional as well as mechanical lines-progressive all along the line. And this is not ali for lands, farms, all about the town increase in value in proportion as the town thrives and property within the town itself becomes ilt-edge investment in place of a lrag the market Farm pro ducts find ready sale in the proucts find ready sale in the loca markets and you have an ideal community.
But there is another side to this question-the buyers. The News
fore, but most of our exchanges, from what they say in the matter seem to think he has no side One of them refering to this practice of "buying away from home" plaintively says;
This not only robs the local mer chants of the trade to which they are entitled, but nine times out of ten the "catalogue" buyer gets an inferior article, and in addition pays freight.
So? Well, perhaps it is. But, whose fault is it? In answer to this question The News is of the pinion that "nine times out of ten" Many of these sath the merchant Many of these same merchants are goods, wares and merchandise that a good many people have more than a half formed idea that the robbing prices, mentioned by our exchanges, comes the other way.
The catalogue houses proclaim their wares "upon the housetops." They advertise in newspapers magazınes, send catalogues follow lowing these with "specials". etc etc. and keep presistly at it spend ing millions and millions of dollars talking up their goods and price while the home merchant, in many instances, stays "mum" in so fa as this class of publicity is concern ed. And in this age of advertising when such conditions prevail, people naturally draw the, conclusion
that the home merchant remains sil ent because, forsooth, he cannot compete with them or that his goods are of interior quality. The argument offered by some local news the home merchant by reason of "patriotism, and civ

logue house. They must'advertise in the papers that circulate in the trade territory; they must tell-of their goods and of their prices and endeavor is an bonest/straight for ward way to convince the buye well with them as he can do in Chiicago, New York or Dallas. And advertising once or twice is not suf ficient, tne after week and month after mont as do these "catalogue"
