## Ralroad-Hereford.

Communications were received fromJ. R. Ransom this week stating that the company which he represents is now ready to begin work on the "Panhandle Short Line Road" and that actual operations will com mence as soon as our citizens comply with their part of the contrac in the way of cash bonus and right of-way. The terms on which we are to secure the road, round houses, general offices for Texas and other accessaries are extremely easy and the committee ought to be able to arrange this part of the program in two or three days. Only 815,000 cash and the right of through the town are asked, and a community with as much enterprise and push as this one will never halt for a moment in raising this small amount.-Hereford Brand.

In New Zealand the state advances sums of money to settlers at low interest on the security of their holdings, in order to assist them to develop the capabilities of their lands. The railways, postoffices and telegraph lines are operated in the direct interest of the people. The state owns and opperates two collieries and there is no strikes because under the Conciliation and Arbitration Act all labor disputes are amicably settled. The postoffice savings bank has been in existence thirty six years, and has deposits of over thirty millions of dollars. There is a governmen life insurance department with an accident insurance branch, and important state works, such as rail ways, bridges, roads, etc, are constructed by the government. Its government is ranked amongst the most advanced in the world -Farm and Ranch.
GENERALELECTION BALLOTS
The ballots for the general elec tion which takes place on Thursday Nov. 6, were printed this week in The News office and as the form is an entirely new feature for this State it might be well to make mention of it here.
It consists of a single sheet upon which there are seven columns. On the first six columns will be found the Democratic. Republican, Pröhibition, Socialist, Socialist Labor and Reorganized Republicans respectively. On the seventh column is given only the names of the offices.
To vote the democratic ticket you simply draw your pencil across all other tickets and the same rule applies to the other five. To vote a mixed ticket it is necessary to write all the names of the men you wish to vore for under the proper office on the seventh column. Some people are of the opinion that to vote a mixed ticket you zo through the entire six tickets, marking of or "scratching" the name you do not wish to vote for. This is not in compliance with the law and therefore wrong.
Dont forget now, if you desire to vote a mixed ticket you must, to have it counted, make it out entireJy on the seventh column-the farthest one to the right-and be also sure to run your pencil over the other six columns.
The three constitutional amendments to be voted upon, for and against, are at the bottom. Those the voter is against he should mark out.
