Infications are as follows: Base four feet wide, five inches deep and composed of seven parts of gravel and sand to one part of cement; the finishing or top to be two parts sand to one of cement and sloped both ways up and down the street. This will make the cost \$1.05 per running foot.

The contract for hauling the rock for the public square grade was given to H. F. Upshaw at 25 cents per thousand pounds.

To cover the square four inches by S. V. Wirt. deep with stone, estimating it solid, which will give some more than four inches, level in the rough, will, require something like 1,400 cubic yards of stone Taking this stone at, say 3,500 pounds per yard, we have a total of 4,900,000 pounds, which at the contract price of 25 cents per thousand pounds will sum up \$1,225 for this hauling. The News does not claim that this estimate is absolutely correct, but it will not miss it very far.


Upon the cost of cement side walks around the square the estimate of cost against each lot is between fifty and sixty dollars. These sidewalks must be completed by May 1st, so says the Council, and written notice to this effect has been served upon each lot holder or their legal representative.' And unless these sidewalks are put in by the owners as per specifications adopted, and by the time stated, the Council will do it and at said 'owner's cost, said lots being sold, if necessary, to cover the expense.

This is what The News calls getting down to business and it should meet the hearty approval of Canyon City people.


